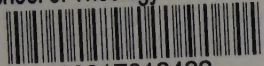

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¶ Authorization

Common Worship: Services and Prayers for the Church of England comprises

- ¶ services and prayers from *The Book of Common Prayer*;
- ¶ alternative services and other material authorized for use until further resolution of the General Synod;
- ¶ services which comply with the provisions of *A Service of the Word*;
- ¶ material commended by the House of Bishops; and
- ¶ material, the use of which falls within the discretion allowed to the minister under the provisions of Canon B 5.

Canon B 3 provides that decisions as to which of the authorized services are to be used (other than occasional offices) shall be taken jointly by the incumbent and the parochial church council. In the case of occasional offices (other than Confirmation and Ordination), the decision is to be made by the minister conducting the service, subject to the right of any of the persons concerned to object beforehand to the form of service proposed.

¶ Preface

The publication of *Common Worship* is an occasion of great significance in the life of the Church of England, because the worship of God is central to the life of his Church.

The forms of worship authorized in the Church of England express our faith and help to create our identity. The Declaration of Assent is placed at the beginning of this volume to remind us of this. When ministers make the Declaration, they affirm their loyalty to the Church of England's inheritance of faith and accept their share in the responsibility to proclaim the faith 'afresh in each generation'.

Common Worship draws together the rich inheritance of the past and the very best of our contemporary forms of worship. In this volume we bring together the services of *The Book of Common Prayer* as they are used today and newer liturgies in both traditional and contemporary style. *The Book of Common Prayer* remains the permanently authorized provision for public worship in the Church of England, whereas the newer liturgies are authorized until further resolution of the General Synod. This combination of old and new provides for the diverse worshipping needs of our communities, within an ordered structure which affirms our essential unity and common life.

The services provided here are rich and varied. This reflects the multiplicity of contexts in which worship is offered today. They encourage an imaginative engagement in worship, opening the way for people in the varied circumstances of their lives to experience the love of God in Jesus Christ in the life and power of the Holy Spirit. In the worship of God the full meaning and beauty of our humanity is consummated and our lives are opened to the promise God makes for all creation – to transform and renew it in love and goodness.

The publication of these services is a challenge to us. It is a challenge to worship God better and to take the greatest care in preparing and celebrating worship. It is a challenge to draw the whole community of the people we serve into the worship of God. Central to our worship is the proclamation of the one, perfect self-offering of the Son to the Father. The Gospel of Jesus Christ is at the heart of *Common Worship*.

Those who make the Declaration of Assent are charged with bringing the grace and truth of Christ to this generation and making him known to those in their care. Worship not only strengthens Christians for witness and service, but is itself a forum in which Christ is made known. Worship is for the whole people of God, who are fellow pilgrims on a journey of faith, and those who attend services are all at different stages of that journey. Indeed, worship itself is a pilgrimage – a journey into the heart of the love of God. A number of the services themselves – particularly that of Holy Baptism – are celebrated in stages. In each case the journey through the liturgy has a clear structure with signposts for those less familiar with the way. It moves from the gathering of the community through the Liturgy of the Word to an opportunity of transformation, sacramental or non-sacramental, after which those present are sent out to put their faith into practice.

Common Worship is marked by diversity, not only in its content and in those who will use it, but also in the manner of its publication. It is not a single book. This volume contains all that is needed for worship on Sundays and on Principal Feasts and Holy Days; the *Common Worship* Initiation Services, Pastoral Services, Daily Office book and seasonal material are being published separately. Moreover, these volumes are not published solely in book form. *Common Worship* is not a series of books, but a collection of services and other liturgical material published on the World Wide Web and through other electronic media as well as in print.

Just as *Common Worship* is more than a book, so worship is more than what is said; it is also what is done and how it is done. *Common Worship* provides texts, contemporary as well as traditional, which are resonant and memorable, so that they will enter and remain in the Church of England's corporate memory – especially if they are sung. It is when the framework of worship is clear and familiar and the texts are known by heart that the poetry of praise and the passion of prayer can transcend the printed word. Then worship can take wing and become the living sacrifice of ourselves to the God whose majesty is beyond compare and whose truth is from everlasting.

¶ *The Declaration of Assent*

The Declaration of Assent is made by deacons, priests and bishops of the Church of England when they are ordained and on each occasion when they take up a new appointment (Canon C 15). Readers and Lay Workers make the declaration, without the words 'and administration of the sacraments', when they are admitted and when they are licensed (Canons E 5, E 6 and E 8).

Preface

The Church of England is part of the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church, worshipping the one true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It professes the faith uniquely revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds, which faith the Church is called upon to proclaim afresh in each generation. Led by the Holy Spirit, it has borne witness to Christian truth in its historic formularies, the Thirty-nine Articles of Religion, *The Book of Common Prayer* and the Ordering of Bishops, Priests and Deacons. In the declaration you are about to make, will you affirm your loyalty to this inheritance of faith as your inspiration and guidance under God in bringing the grace and truth of Christ to this generation and making Him known to those in your care?

Declaration of Assent

I, A B, do so affirm, and accordingly declare my belief in the faith which is revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds and to which the historic formularies of the Church of England bear witness; and in public prayer and administration of the sacraments, I will use only the forms of service which are authorized or allowed by Canon.

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A Service of the Word

Introduction

A Service of the Word is unusual for an authorized Church of England service. It consists almost entirely of notes and directions and allows for considerable local variation and choice within a common structure. It is important that those who prepare for and take part in A Service of the Word should have a clear understanding of the nature of worship and of how the component parts of this service work together. Leading people in worship is leading people into mystery, into the unknown and yet the familiar. This spiritual activity is much more than getting the words or the sections in the right order. The primary object in the careful planning and leading of the service is the spiritual direction which enables the whole congregation to come into the presence of God to give him glory. Choices must be made responsibly by leaders of this service or by groups planning worship with them, whether the service is an occasional one, or a regular one which may use a service card. The notes and the text of A Service of the Word should be read together as they interpret one another.

The Liturgy of the Word

At the heart of the service is the Liturgy of the Word. This must not be so lightly treated as to appear insignificant compared with other parts of the service. The readings from Holy Scripture are central to this part and, together with the season, may determine the theme of the rest of the worship. At certain times of the year, as Note 5 says, the readings come from an authorized lectionary, so that the whole Church is together proclaiming the major events in the Christian story. Telling that story and expounding it in the 'sermon' can be done in many different and adventurous ways. Some are suggested in Notes 5 and 7, but there are many others. The word 'sermon' is used in the service, and explained in the note, precisely because it would be too limiting to use words like 'address', 'talk', 'instruction', or 'meditation'.

The items in the Liturgy of the Word may come in any order and more than once. So the sermon may be in parts and there may be more than one psalm or song, and of course hymns may be inserted as well. But on most occasions it will be appropriate for this part of the service to have a Creed or Affirmation of Faith as its climax.

Preparation

With the Liturgy of the Word becoming clear it will be easier to see how the Preparation for it, and the response to it in the Prayers, fit in. People need to know when the service has started (Note 1). What happens at the beginning can create the atmosphere for worship and set the tone and mood for what follows. The gathering of the congregation and the call to worship are to be marked by a liturgical greeting between minister and people. Leaders should have worked out exactly where this comes among the singing, Scripture sentence, introduction (perhaps to the theme) and opening prayer. All these should draw the members of the congregation together and focus their attention on almighty God.

This part of the service will usually include the Prayers of Penitence, though these may come later if, for instance, the theme of the Liturgy of the Word appropriately leads to penitence. Authorized Prayers of Penitence include all those confessions and absolutions in *The Book of Common Prayer* and in services in *Common Worship*, together with several other seasonal and thematic forms, mostly for occasional use, which are set out on pages 122–137. The climax of this part of the service is either the Collect or, if that is included in the Prayers, one of the items of praise, a hymn or the Gloria. The Collect does not have to be that of the day; it may be a thematic one based on the readings (in which case it should come immediately before the readings), or be used to sum up the Prayers.

Prayers

Part of the response to the Word is the Creed, but the response should be developed in the Prayers which follow. There are many different options for this part of the service. These range from a series of Collect-type prayers to congregational involvement in prayer groups, visual and processional prayers, with responsive forms and a number of people sharing the leading of intercessions in between. But, whatever the form, it is essential that the Prayers also include thanksgiving. A section of thanksgiving, which may include the spoken word, music and hymns, may be the proper climax to this part of the service.

Conclusion

Many different words have been used for the Conclusion, each of which has something to contribute to our understanding of how the service ends: dismissal, farewell, goodbye, departure, valediction, commission, blessing, ending, going out. What is essential, as with the way the service starts, is that it should have a clear liturgical ending: options are listed in Note 9.

Once the service is planned, leaders will want to check through to ensure that there is the right balance between the elements of word, prayer and praise, and between congregational activity and congregational passivity. Does the music come in the right places? Is there sufficient silence (Note 4)? This is something leaders can be afraid of, or fail to introduce properly. And is there a clear overall direction to the service: is it achieving the purpose of bringing the congregation together to give glory to God?

¶ *A Service of the Word*

Preparation

The minister welcomes the people with the **Greeting**.

Authorized Prayers of Penitence may be used here or in the **Prayers**.

The Venite, Kyries, Gloria, a hymn, song, or a set of responses may be used.

The **Collect** is said either here or in the **Prayers**.

The Liturgy of the Word

This includes

- ¶ **readings (or a reading) from Holy Scripture**
- ¶ a **psalm**, or, if occasion demands, a scriptural song
- ¶ a **sermon**
- ¶ an **authorized Creed**, or, if occasion demands, an **authorized Affirmation of Faith**.

Prayers

These include

- ¶ **intercessions and thanksgivings**
- ¶ **the Lord's Prayer**

Conclusion

The service concludes with a **blessing, dismissal** or other **liturgical ending**.

¶ A Service of the Word with a Celebration of Holy Communion

This rite requires careful preparation by the president and other participants, and is not normally to be used as the regular Sunday or weekday service.

Sections marked with an asterisk must follow an authorized text.*

Preparation

The people and the priest:

- ¶ greet each other in the Lord's name
- ¶ confess their sins and are assured of God's forgiveness*
- ¶ keep silence and pray a Collect*

The Liturgy of the Word

The people and the priest:

- ¶ proclaim and respond to the word of God

Prayers

The people and the priest:

- ¶ pray for the Church and the world

The Liturgy of the Sacrament

The people and the priest:

- ¶ exchange the Peace
- ¶ prepare the table
- ¶ pray the Eucharistic Prayer*
- ¶ break the bread
- ¶ receive Holy Communion

The Dismissal

The people and the priest:

- ¶ depart with God's blessing.

¶ Notes

In this form of service, the material is described as ‘authorized’ or ‘suitable’, which expressions shall have the following meanings:

- ¶ ‘authorized’ means approved by the General Synod in accordance with the provisions of Canon B 2.
- ¶ ‘suitable’ means a form used at the discretion of the minister conducting the form of service on any occasion, but such that the material so used shall be neither contrary to, nor indicative of any departure from, the doctrine of the Church of England in any essential matter.

This service is authorized as an alternative to Morning Prayer and Evening Prayer. It provides a structure for Sunday services, for daily prayer and for services of an occasional nature.

1 Greeting

The service should have a clear beginning. The liturgical greeting may follow some introductory singing, or a hymn or a sentence of Scripture, and may be followed by a brief introduction or an opening prayer.

2 Prayers of Penitence

Only authorized Prayers of Penitence should be used. They may be omitted except at the Principal Service on Sundays and Principal Holy Days. Authorized forms of Confession and Absolution may be found in *The Book of Common Prayer*, in the services in *Common Worship* and on pages 122–137. The minister may introduce the Confession with suitable words.

3 Hymns, Canticles, Acclamations and the Peace

Points are indicated for some of these, but if occasion requires they may occur elsewhere.

4 Silence

Periods of silence may be kept at different points of the service. It may be particularly appropriate at the beginning of the service, after the readings and the sermon, and during the prayers.

5 Readings

There should preferably be at least two readings from the Bible, but it is recognized that if occasion demands there may be only one reading. It may be dramatized, sung or read responsively.

The readings are taken from an authorized lectionary during the period from the Third Sunday of Advent to the Baptism of Christ, and from Palm Sunday to Trinity Sunday. When A Service of the Word is combined with Holy Communion on Sundays and Principal Holy Days, the readings of the day are normally used.

6 Psalms

The service should normally include a psalm or psalms. These might be said or sung in the traditional way, but it is also possible to use a metrical version, a responsive form or a paraphrase such as can be found in many current hymn books. The psalm may occasionally be replaced by a song or canticle the words of which are taken directly from Scripture: a 'scriptural song'.

7 Sermon

The term 'sermon' includes less formal exposition, the use of drama, interviews, discussion, audio-visuals and the insertion of hymns or other sections of the service between parts of the sermon. The sermon may come after one of the readings, or before or after the prayers, and may be omitted except on Sundays and Principal Holy Days.

8 Sermon and Creed

The sermon, and a Creed or authorized Affirmation of Faith may be omitted except at the principal service on Sundays and Principal Holy Days.

9 Ending

The service should have a clear ending. This takes one or more of the following forms: the Peace, the Grace or a suitable ascription or blessing. If a responsive conclusion is used, it comes last.

10 A Service of the Word with a Celebration of Holy Communion

An order for this is provided (see page 25). The notes to the Order for the Celebration of Holy Communion (pages 158–159 and 330–335) apply equally to this service. In particular the Note on Ministries (pages 158–159) specifies that the president must be an episcopally ordained priest, but indicates that where necessary a deacon or lay person may preside over the Preparation and the Liturgy of the Word, including the Prayers. The order provided is not prescriptive.

Morning and Evening Prayer on Sunday

¶ Introduction

From earliest times, Christians gathered at regular hours during each day and night to respond to God's word with praise on behalf of all creation and with intercession for the salvation of the world. By the fourth century, if not earlier, morning and evening had emerged as the pre-eminent hours for the offering of this sacrifice of praise. They have remained so ever since, especially on Sundays when the Church commemorates both the first day of creation and the day of Christ's resurrection. These orders of service are examples of forms which comply with the provisions of *A Service of the Word* and are intended to help Christians of our own day take their part in this privilege and duty which belongs to all God's priestly people. They may be celebrated in a variety of different ways, for example, as:

- ¶ a simple form of prayer at the very beginning or end of the day;
- ¶ the Gathering and Liturgy of the Word for another service which is to follow immediately;
- ¶ the principal service of the day.

To meet diverse needs such as these, they are very flexible in arrangement. The central core, however, consists of the Liturgy of the Word interwoven with canticles to supply the response of praise, followed by intercessory prayer in one form or another. A variety of alternative endings is provided in the form of thanksgivings for different aspects of the Church's life. Whenever possible, the services should include some singing, especially of the Gospel canticle, which is the climax of the morning or evening praise for the work of God in Christ. If desired, metrical paraphrases may be substituted for any of the biblical canticles, and other hymns and songs may be added at appropriate points.

Provision for weekdays is published separately.

3 Principal Services and Principal Holy Days

An authorized confession and absolution, and the Apostles' Creed or another Creed or authorized Affirmation of Faith, and a sermon, must be included in Morning or Evening Prayer when it is the principal service on a Sunday or Principal Holy Day, but may be omitted at other times.

4 Opening Canticle at Morning Prayer

The following are suitable for use as the opening canticle at Morning Prayer:

Benedicite, A Song of Creation (pages 778–779), especially in Ordinary Time;

Jubilate, A Song of Joy (page 781), especially in festal seasons;

The Easter Anthems (page 782), especially during the Easter season;

6 Opening Hymn and Canticle at Evening Prayer

7 Te Deum

The canticle Te Deum, A Song of the Church (page 802), may be used at Morning or Evening Prayer immediately before the Conclusion.

8 Thanksgivings

In Morning or Evening Prayer, one of the Thanksgivings may follow the sermon or, where a sermon is included in the Thanksgiving, the Gospel canticle. The confession and absolution at the beginning of Morning and Evening Prayer should be omitted where penitence is included in the Thanksgiving for the Word. If the Thanksgiving for the Healing Ministry of the Church is to include anointing, the minister must be authorized for this ministry as required by Canon B 37.

9 Intercessions

These should normally be broadly based, expressing a concern for the whole of God's world and the ministry of the whole Church. Nevertheless, where occasion demands, they may be focused on more particular and local needs. Where another service follows immediately, they may be brief.

10 Morning and Evening Collects

If it is desired to use the Morning and Evening Collects (page 101), they should not be added after the Collect of the Day, but should be used before the Blessing or other Ending.

11 Commemoration of the Resurrection

The Order for Morning Prayer may be arranged as a commemoration of the resurrection (which is especially appropriate during the Easter season) by the use of the following:

[*Opening Canticle*: Benedicite, A Song of Creation]

[*Psalmody*: Psalm 118.14-29]

[*First Reading*: Genesis 1.1-5; Exodus 14.21-31; 1 Corinthians 15.1-8; or Colossians 3.1-4]

[*Old Testament Canticle*: The Song of Moses and Miriam]

[*Gospel Reading*: Matthew 28.1-10; Mark 16.1-8; Mark 16.9-20;

Luke 24.1-9; John 20.1-10; John 20.11-18; or John 21.1-14]

Schedule of Permitted Variations to the *Book of Common Prayer Orders for Morning and Evening Prayer* where these occur in *Common Worship*

- 1 All or part of the material before 'O Lord, open thou our lips' may be omitted, at least on weekdays.
- 2 The minister may use a seasonal sentence before using one of the penitential sentences with which the service begins.
- 3 The minister may use an abbreviated form of the Bidding, 'Dearly beloved brethren ...', or the form on pages 63 and 73 may be used.
- 4 When the officiating minister is not a priest, an authorized prayer for absolution in the 'us' form or else the Collect for Trinity 21 in *The Book of Common Prayer* is said by the minister in place of the prayer for absolution printed in *The Book of Common Prayer*.
- 5 The whole of the Gloria Patri, together with the words 'Praise ye the Lord' that follow, may be said or sung by the entire congregation, in which case the final response, 'The Lord's name be praised', may be omitted.
- 6 At Morning Prayer, verses 8 to 11 of the Venite may be omitted except in Lent. The Easter Anthems (page 805) may be used in place of the Venite throughout Eastertide.
- 7 Other prayers of intercession and thanksgiving may be used in addition to or in place of the five prayers printed at the end of the Order in *The Book of Common Prayer*.
- 8 Hymns may be sung at suitable points in the service, silence may be kept after the readings, a sermon may be preached and the service may end with a blessing.

Notes to Night Prayer (Compline)

1 Psalms

If it is desired to use an unchanging pattern of psalmody for Night Prayer, the psalms printed in the text are used. However, verses from other psalms may be used instead, particularly if Night Prayer is said daily – Saturday: as set; Sunday: Psalm 104; Monday: Psalm 86; Tuesday: Psalm 143; Wednesday: Psalm 31; Thursday: Psalm 16; Friday: Psalm 139.

2 Thanksgiving

Night Prayer may begin with the Prayer of Thanksgiving from Evening Prayer (page 40).

3 Gospel Reading

On suitable occasions, particularly Saturday night and before other festivals, the Gospel for the following day may be read before the Office.

4 Preparation

When the confession is being used, it may be replaced by another act of penitence. However, all that precedes 'O God, make speed to save us' may be omitted; this is particularly appropriate if Holy Communion has been celebrated in the evening.

5 Alleluia

The Alleluias included in the Easter form of the Responsory are for use from Easter Day until the Day of Pentecost, not at other times. The Alleluia following the opening versicles and responses is always used, except in Lent.

6 Blessing

The response in square brackets [] is normally used only if Holy Communion is to be celebrated the following morning.

7 Seasons

The hymn, the Scripture reading, the refrain to the Gospel Canticle, the Collect and the blessing may change seasonally and on Festivals.

Authorized Forms of Confession and Absolution

The forms of confession in the Order of Holy Communion and Morning and Evening Prayer in The Book of Common Prayer may be used on any occasion. These or one of the forms in the services in Common Worship should normally be used.

It may sometimes be helpful to vary the form on particular occasions, in which case one of the confessions and absolutions which follow should be used. If possible, an absolution should be chosen which reflects the style, in language and length, of the confession. 'Us' and 'our' are said by those who are not ordained priest: words in italics indicate the points where changes may be necessary.

Suitable words of introduction or conclusion (such as 'Let us declare our faith in God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit') to the Creed or Affirmation of Faith may be used.

The Nicene Creed

The text of the Nicene Creed is printed in the Orders for the Celebration of Holy Communion on pages 173; 213, 234, and 253.

The Nicene Creed may be used responsively as follows

We believe in one God,
the Father, the Almighty,

All **maker of heaven and earth,
of all that is,
seen and unseen.**

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,
the only Son of God,
eternally begotten of the Father,

All **God from God, Light from Light,
true God from true God,**

begotten, not made,
of one Being with the Father.

All **Through him all things were made.**

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven,
was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary,
and was made man.

All **For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;
he suffered death and was buried.**

in accordance with the Scriptures;

and is seated at the right hand of the Father.**

Notes

- 1** This form should be used only when there has been due notice and proper preparation. It is recommended that it is used no more than once or twice in any one year. Suitable opportunities include Easter, Pentecost, the Baptism of Christ in Epiphany, and the inauguration of a new ministry.
- 2** This form is a corporate affirmation for use within a service. When it is used it replaces the Creed or other Affirmation of Faith.
- 3** Where it is customary for the assembly to be sprinkled with water from the font or to sign themselves with water from the font, this may take place immediately after the Profession of Faith or during a hymn, canticle or song at the conclusion of this form.

A Corporate Renewal of Baptismal Vows

The president may use words of introduction to this part of the service.

A large candle may be lit. The president may address the congregation as follows

In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him. Therefore I ask:

Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God?

All I reject them.

Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil?

All I renounce them.

Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour?

All I repent of them.

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?

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General Notes

Preparation

Careful devotional preparation before the service is recommended for every communicant. A Form of Preparation for public or private use is provided (page 161).

Ministries

Holy Communion is celebrated by the whole people of God gathered for worship. The ministry of the members of the congregation is expressed through their active participation together in the words and actions of the service, but also by some of them reading the Scripture passages, leading the prayers of intercession, and, if authorized, assisting with the distribution of communion.

In some traditions the ministry of the deacon at Holy Communion has included some of the following elements: the bringing in of the Book of the Gospels, the invitation to confession, the reading of the Gospel, the preaching of the sermon when licensed to do so, a part in the prayers of intercession, the preparation of the table and the gifts, a part in the distribution, the ablutions and the dismissal.

The deacon's liturgical ministry provides an appropriate model for the ministry of an assisting priest, a Reader, or another episcopally authorized minister in a leadership ministry that complements that of the president.

The unity of the liturgy is served by the ministry of the president, who in presiding over the whole service holds word and sacrament together and draws the congregation into a worshipping community.

The president at Holy Communion (who, in accordance with the provisions of Canon B 12 'Of the Ministry of the Holy Communion', must have been episcopally ordained priest) expresses this ministry by saying the opening Greeting, the Absolution, the Collect, the Peace and the Blessing. The president must say the Eucharistic Prayer, break the consecrated bread and receive the sacrament on every occasion. When appropriate, the president may, after greeting the people, delegate the leadership of all or parts of the Gathering and the Liturgy of the Word to a deacon, Reader or other authorized lay person.

In the absence of a priest for the first part of the service, a deacon, Reader or other authorized lay person may lead the entire Gathering and Liturgy of the Word.

When the bishop is present, he normally presides over the whole service.

As provided in Canon B 18 the sermon shall be preached by ■ duly authorized minister, deaconess, Reader or lay worker or, at the invitation of the minister having the cure of souls and with the permission of the bishop, another person.

¶ Communicant members of other Churches

Baptized persons who are communicant members of other Churches which subscribe to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity and are in good standing in their own Church shall be admitted to Communion in accordance with Canon B 15A.

A Form of Preparation

This form may be used in any of three ways.

It may be used by individuals as part of their preparation for Holy Communion.

It may be used corporately on suitable occasions within Holy Communion where it replaces the sections entitled 'Prayer of Preparation' and 'Prayers of Penitence'.

It may be used as a separate service of preparation. When used in this way, there should be added at the beginning a greeting and at the end the Peace and the Lord's Prayer. Hymns, psalms and other suitable liturgical material may also be included.

Come, Holy Ghost (Veni creator Spiritus)

All Come, Holy Ghost, our souls inspire,
And lighten with celestial fire;
Thou the anointing Spirit art,

Exhortation

On Sundays and Principal Holy Days an authorized translation of the Nicene Creed is used, or on occasion the Apostles' Creed or an authorized Affirmation of Faith may be used (see pages 138-148).

Drink ye all of this;

*Here the priest is to lay a hand on every vessel
in which there is wine to be consecrated.*

for this is my blood of the new testament,

which is shed for you and for many for the remission of sins:

do this, as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of me.

And above all things ye must give most humble and hearty thanks to God, the Father, the Son and the Holy Ghost, for the redemption of the world by the death and passion of our Saviour Christ, both God and man; who did humble himself, even to the death upon the Cross, for us miserable sinners, who lay in darkness and the shadow of death; that he might make us the children of God, and exalt us to everlasting life. And to the end that we should always remember the exceeding great love of our Master and only Saviour Jesus Christ, thus dying for us, and the innumerable benefits which by his precious blood-shedding he hath obtained to us; he hath instituted and ordained holy mysteries, as pledges of his love, and for a continual remembrance of his death, to our great and endless comfort. Notes

Notes 1 to 23 apply to Order One. They should be followed in Order Two insofar as they are applicable. Notes 24 to 29 apply to Order Two only.

The use of a lighter typeface for some texts reflects a decision of the General Synod to give more weight to one choice within a range of options.

1 Posture

Local custom may be followed and developed in relation to posture. The people should stand for the reading of the Gospel, for the Creed, for the Peace and for the Dismissal. Any changes in posture during the Eucharistic Prayer should not detract from the essential unity of that prayer. It is appropriate that, on occasions, the congregation should kneel for prayers of penitence.

2 Traditional Texts

In addition to the places where they are printed in the service, traditional versions of texts may be used.

3 Hymns, Psalms, Canticles, the Collection and Presentation of the Offerings of the People, and the Preparation of the Table

Points are indicated for these, but they may occur elsewhere.

4 Sentences

Sentences of Scripture appropriate to the season and the place in the service may be used as part of the president's greeting, in the Invitation to Confession, at the Peace, before the gifts of the people are collected and after the distribution of communion (from Easter Day to Pentecost 'Alleluia' is appropriately added to such sentences).

5 Acclamations

Acclamations, which may include congregational response (such as 'The Lord is here: his Spirit is with us' and 'Christ is risen: he is risen indeed') may be used at appropriate points in the service (with 'Alleluia' except in Lent). Seasonal acclamations for use before the Gospel are provided on pages 280 and 300–329.

6 Entry

At the entry of the ministers, a Bible or Book of the Gospels may be carried into the assembly.

7 Greetings

In addition to the points where greetings are provided, at other suitable points (e.g. before the Gospel and before the blessing or dismissal), the greeting 'The Lord be with you' with its response 'and also with you' or 'and with thy spirit' may be used.

8 Silence

Silence is particularly appropriate within the Prayers of Penitence and of Intercession, before the Collect, in response to the reading of the Scriptures, after the Eucharistic Prayer and after the distribution.

9 Notices

Banns of marriage and other notices may be published before the Gathering (if possible by a minister other than the president), before the Prayers of Intercession or before the Dismissal.

10 The Prayers of Penitence

This section may be transposed to a later point in the service as a response to the Liturgy of the Word. In the special seasonal rites for certain days it is particularly appropriate at the later point.

On certain occasions, for a special service, this section may precede the opening hymn and greeting. A Form of Preparation is provided on page 161.

The Invitation to Confession may take the form of the Summary of the Law, the Commandments, the Beatitudes, the Comfortable Words or the Exhortation.

When the Kyrie eleison is used as a confession, short penitential sentences are inserted between the petitions, suitable for seasons or themes. This form of confession should not be the norm on Sundays.

Authorized alternative forms of confession and absolution may be used in place of those in the main text.

11 The Gloria in Excelsis

This canticle may be omitted during Advent and Lent, and on weekdays which are not Principal Holy Days or Festivals.

See also Note 3.

12 The Readings

The readings at Holy Communion are governed by authorized lectionary provision and are not a matter for local decision except where that provision permits.

Whenever possible, all three readings are used at Holy Communion on Sundays. When only two are read, the minister should ensure that, in any year, a balance is maintained between readings from the Old and New Testaments in the choice of the first reading. The psalm provided relates to the first reading in the lectionary. Where possible it should be used after that reading.

When announcing the Gospel, if it is desired to give book, chapter and verse or page number, the reader may do this informally before saying 'Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to *N*.'

13 The Sermon

The sermon is an integral part of the Liturgy of the Word. A sermon should normally be preached at all celebrations on Sundays and Principal Holy Days.

The sermon may on occasion include less formal exposition of Scripture, the use of drama, interviews, discussion and audio-visual aids.

14 The Creed

The Creed may be preceded by the president saying 'Let us declare our faith in God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit'.

15 The Prayers of Intercession

Intercession frequently arises out of thanksgiving; nevertheless these prayers are primarily prayers of intercession. They are normally broadly based, expressing a concern for the whole of God's world and the ministry of the whole Church.

Several forms of intercession are provided; other suitable forms may be used. They need not always conform to the sequence indicated.

Prayer for the nation is properly focused in prayer for the sovereign by name, and prayer for the Church in prayer for the bishop of the diocese by name.

The Supplementary Texts provide a number of Collects and other endings to conclude intercession. In some circumstances it may be appropriate for the president to say both the opening invitation and these concluding words.

16 The Peace

The Peace follows naturally from the Prayers of Intercession and begins the Liturgy of the Sacrament. But this section may be transposed to be the opening greeting or may be used later in the service, as part of either the breaking of bread or the Dismissal. Introductions can be found in the Supplementary Texts.

17 The Taking

In Holy Communion the Church, following the example of the Lord, takes, gives thanks, breaks and gives. The bread and wine must be taken into the president's hands and replaced upon the table either after the table has been prepared or during the Eucharistic Prayer.

18 The Eucharistic Prefaces and Optional Acclamations

Short Prefaces may be inserted in Eucharistic Prayers A, B and C in Order One and in both prayers in Order One in Traditional Language. Texts of these are to be found on pages 300–329.

When the short Prefaces given on pages 300–329 are used with Order Two and Order Two in Contemporary Language the phrase 'through Jesus Christ our Lord' must be inserted.

Extended Prefaces may be used with Eucharistic Prayers A, B and E for Order One (pages 294 and 300–329). When an extended Preface is used it replaces the entire text between the opening dialogue and the text of the Sanctus. It will be noted that in Prayer E the short text provided on page 196 must be used if no extended Preface is used.

There are optional acclamations suggested for use in Prayers A and F. Those provided for Prayer F echo the style of those in the Liturgy of St Basil and might, especially when sung, be led by a deacon or minister other than the president, then repeated by the whole congregation. Other acclamations may be used.

19 The Lord's Prayer

On any occasion when the text of an alternative service authorized under the provisions of Canon B 2 provides for the Lord's Prayer to be said or sung, it may be used in the form included in *The Book of Common Prayer* or in either of the two other forms included in services in *Common Worship*. The text included in Prayers for Various Occasions (page 106) may be used on suitable occasions.

20 Breaking of the Bread

Sufficient bread for the whole congregation to share may be broken by the president, if necessary assisted by other ministers, at this point in the service. The *Agnus Dei* may accompany this action.

The words provided at the breaking of the bread must be used on Sundays and Principal Holy Days. On other days the bread may be broken in silence or during the *Agnus Dei*.

21 Non-communicants

At the distribution, any of those distributing the sacrament, ordained or lay, may pray for any non-communicants who come forward in these or other suitable words: 'May God be with you' or 'May God bless you'.

22 Prayers after Communion

One or two prayers may be used after communion. If two are used, the first is normally a presidential text, the second a congregational text. If only one is used, either ■ presidential or congregational text is chosen. The presidential text is normally the authorized Post Communion of the day. The congregational text is normally one of those printed in the main text or one of those in the supplementary texts.

23 A Service without Communion

When there is no communion, the minister leads the service as far as the Prayers of Intercession or the Peace, and then adds the Lord's Prayer, the General Thanksgiving, and/or other prayers, ending with the Grace.

The following notes apply to Order Two only

Frequently used additions to the text of *The Book of Common Prayer* are included in Order Two but are indented from the left hand margin.

24 Posture

It is appropriate for the people to kneel for the opening prayer and Commandments, the Prayers of Intercession, the confession, absolution and Comfortable Words, the Prayer of Consecration and prayers after the distribution.

25 Supplementary Material

Supplementary Texts may be used with Order Two when they are compatible with that Order. The third form of intercession in the Supplementary Texts (page 283) may be used in place of the form printed.

26 The Sermon

At the discretion of the priest, the sermon may precede the Creed.

27 Alternative Order

Where customary, the Prayer of Humble Access may precede 'Lift up your hearts'; 'Amen' may be omitted at the end of the Prayer of Consecration, and the Prayer of Oblation follow immediately; the Lord's Prayer may follow the Prayer of Oblation; the versicle 'The peace of the Lord be always with you' with the response 'And with thy spirit' may follow the Lord's Prayer and precede the Agnus Dei. In Order Two, but not in Order Two in Contemporary Language, the breaking of the bread may be deferred until the Agnus Dei.

28 Proper Prefaces

The short Proper Prefaces in the Seasonal Provisions (pages 300–329) may be used with Order Two. In such case the priest inserts the words 'through Jesus Christ our Lord' after 'almighty, everlasting God'. The texts of the Proper Prefaces from *The Book of Common Prayer* for use with Order Two are given on pages 246–247.

29 The Gloria in Excelsis

If the Gloria in excelsis is not to be used on every occasion, it is appropriately omitted on Sundays in Advent and Lent and on all weekdays that are not Principal Holy Days or Festivals.

Thanksgiving for the Gift of a Child

Notes

- 1 This service is provided for a number of different occasions:
 - ¶ the private celebration of a birth or adoption, at home or in church with only family and close friends present;
 - ¶ the public celebration of the birth or adoption of a number of children, perhaps in church on a Sunday afternoon;
 - ¶ the public celebration of the birth or adoption of a number of children as part of a main Sunday act of worship.

It is designed to meet the needs of:

- ¶ parents who see this as a preliminary to baptism;
 - ¶ parents who do not wish their children to be baptized immediately;
 - ¶ others, who do not ask for baptism, but who recognize that something has happened for which they wish to give thanks to God.
- 2 In preparing for the service, the minister should consult the Notes and Supplementary Texts to the service of Thanksgiving for the Gift of a Child in *Common Worship: Pastoral Services*. The Supplementary Texts include liturgical greetings, a list of suitable readings and additional prayers.







Pastoral Introduction

This may be read by those present before the service begins.

The birth or adoption of a child is a cause for celebration. Many people are overcome by a sense of awe at the creation of new life and want to express their thanks to God. This service provides an opportunity for parents and families to give thanks for the birth or adoption of a child and to pray for family life. It may be a private celebration at home or in hospital, or it may be a public celebration in church, sometimes with a number of children.

This service is not the same as Baptism (sometimes called Christening), which is the sacrament of initiation into membership of the Church, the Body of Christ. If you are interested in exploring the Christian faith, or finding out more about preparation for Baptism, ask the minister taking this service.

Thanksgiving for the Gift of a Child

Introduction

The minister welcomes the people using a liturgical greeting or other suitable words (see Note 2).

A hymn or song may be sung.

The service may be introduced in these or similar words

We are here today to give thanks for *these children*, with *their* family and friends, and to support *their* parents in their responsibilities with prayer and love. God became one of us in Jesus, and understands all that surrounds the arrival and upbringing of children. It is God's purpose that children should know love within the stability of their home, grow in faith, and come at last to the eternal city where his love reigns supreme.

The following may be used

The works of the Lord are great:

All **his mercy endures for ever.**

Mary gave birth to a child and called him Jesus:

All **he will save his people from their sins.**

He will be called the Prince of Peace:

All **his kingdom will last for ever.**

The minister says

Loving God,
you hold all things in life
and call us into your kingdom of peace;
help us to walk the path of your truth
and fill our lives with gratitude and faith,
through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All **Amen.**

Reading(s) and Sermon

A suitable passage from the Bible is read (see Note 2).

A sermon may be preached.

A hymn may be sung.

Thanksgiving and Blessing

Where parents wish to recognize the role of supporting friends it may be appropriate for them to stand with the parents at the thanksgiving. One of them may present the children to the minister, and informal words may be said.

The minister says

Do you receive these children as a gift from God?

We do.

Do you wish to give thanks to God and seek his blessing?

We do.

The minister says

God our creator,

we thank you for the wonder of new life
and for the mystery of human love.

We thank you for all whose support and skill
surround and sustain the beginning of life.

We thank you that we are known to you by name
and loved by you from all eternity.

We thank you for Jesus Christ,
who has opened to us the way of love.

We praise you, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

All Blessed be God for ever.

The minister may say for each child

What name have you given this child?

A parent or supporting friend replies

His/her name is N.

The minister may take the child.

The minister says

As Jesus took children in his arms and blessed them,
so now we ask God's blessing on N.

Heavenly Father, we praise you for *his/her* birth;
surround *him/her* with your blessing
that *he/she* may know your love,
be protected from evil,
and know your goodness all *his/her* days.

When all the children have been prayed for

All **May they learn to love all that is true,
grow in wisdom and strength
and, in due time, come through faith and baptism
to the fullness of your grace;
through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.**

The minister prays for the parents

May God the Father of all bless *these parents*
and give *them* grace to love and care for *their children*.
May God give *them* wisdom, patience and faith,
help *them* to provide for the *children's* needs
and, by *their* example,
reveal the love and truth that are in Jesus Christ.

All **Amen.**

Giving of the Gospel

A copy of a Gospel is presented, with these words

Receive this book.
It is the good news of God's love.
Take it as your guide.

The minister may address the supporting friends and say

Will you do all that you can to help and support N and N
in the bringing up of N?
With the help of God, we will.

The minister may address the wider family and friends and say

Will you do all that you can to help and support *this family*?
With the help of God, we will.

Prayers

This prayer may be said by the parents or by the whole congregation

**God our creator,
we thank you for the gift of these children,
entrusted to our care.
May we be patient and understanding,
ready to guide and to forgive,
so that through our love
they may come to know your love;
through Jesus Christ our Lord.
Amen.**

*The minister may say additional prayers (see Note 2),
ending with the Lord's Prayer.*

Jesus taught us to call God our Father,
and so in faith and trust we say

All **Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come,
your will be done,
on earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins
as we forgive those who sin against us.
Lead us not into temptation
but deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power,
and the glory are yours
now and for ever.
Amen.**

(or)

Jesus taught us to call God our Father,
and so we have the courage to say

All **Our Father, who art in heaven,**
hallowed be thy name;

Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation;
but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom,

Ending

The minister says one of these or another suitable blessing

The love of the Lord Jesus
draw *you* to himself,
the power of the Lord Jesus
strengthen *you* in his service,
the joy of the Lord Jesus fill *your* hearts;
and the blessing of God almighty,
the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit,
be among *you* and remain with *you* always.

All **Amen.**

(or)

The Lord bless *you* and watch over *you*,
the Lord make his face shine upon *you*
and be gracious to *you*,
the Lord look kindly on *you* and give *you* peace;
and the blessing of God almighty,
the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit,

Notes

- 1** In preparing for the service, the minister should consult the full Notes and Supplementary Texts to the service of Holy Baptism in *Common Worship: Initiation Services* and the President's edition of *Common Worship*. The Supplementary Texts include the Thanksgiving Prayer for a Child and seasonal texts for the Introduction, Collect, Peace, Prayers of Intercession, Prayer after Communion and Blessing.
- 2** When the Renewal of Baptismal Vows takes place within a service of Holy Baptism and/or Confirmation, the responses of the people follow the responses of the candidates, for example:

Do you reject ...?

Candidates **I reject ...**

All **I reject ...**

Pastoral Introduction

This may be read by those present before the service begins.

Baptism marks the beginning of a journey with God which continues for the rest of our lives, the first step in response to God's love. For all involved, particularly the candidates but also parents, godparents and sponsors, it is a joyful moment when we rejoice in what God has done for us in Christ, making serious promises and declaring the faith. The wider community of the local church and friends welcome the new Christian, promising support and prayer for the future. Hearing and doing these things provides an opportunity to remember our own baptism and reflect on the progress made on that journey, which is now to be shared with this new member of the Church.

The service paints many vivid pictures of what happens on the Christian way. There is the sign of the cross, the badge of faith in the Christian journey, which reminds us of Christ's death for us. Our 'drowning' in the water of baptism, where we believe we die to sin and are raised to new life, unites us to Christ's dying and rising, a picture that can be brought home vividly by the way the baptism is administered. Water is also a sign of new life, as we are born again by water and the Spirit, as Jesus was at his baptism. And as a sign of that new life, there may be a lighted candle, a picture of the light of Christ conquering the darkness of evil. Everyone who is baptized walks in that light for the rest of their lives.

As you pray for the candidates, picture them with yourself and the whole Church throughout the ages, journeying into the fullness of God's love.

Jesus said, 'I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly.'

The psalm or canticle follows the first reading; other hymns and songs may be used between the readings.

Gospel Reading

An acclamation may herald the Gospel reading.

When the Gospel is announced the reader says

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to N.

All **Glory to you, O Lord.**

At the end

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

All **Praise to you, O Christ.**

Sermon

Presentation of the Candidates

The candidates may be presented to the congregation. Where appropriate, they may be presented by their godparents or sponsors.

The president asks those candidates for baptism who are able to answer for themselves

Do you wish to be baptized?

I do.

Testimony by the candidate(s) may follow.

The president addresses the whole congregation

Faith is the gift of God to his people.

In baptism the Lord is adding to our number
those whom he is calling.

People of God, will you welcome *these children/candidates*
and uphold *them* in *their* new life in Christ?

All With the help of God, we will.

At the baptism of children, the president then says to the parents and godparents

Parents and godparents, the Church receives *these children* with joy.
Today we are trusting God for *their* growth in faith.

Will you pray for *them*,

draw *them* by your example into the community of faith
and walk with *them* in the way of Christ?

With the help of God, we will.

In baptism *these children* begin their journey in faith.

You speak for *them* today.

Will you care for *them*,

and help *them* to take *their* place

within the life and worship of Christ's Church?

With the help of God, we will.

The Decision

A large candle may be lit. The president addresses the candidates directly, or through their parents, godparents and sponsors

In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him. Therefore I ask:

Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God?

I reject them.

Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil?

I renounce them.

Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour?

I repent of them.

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?

I turn to Christ.

Do you submit to Christ as Lord?

I submit to Christ.

Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth and the life?

I come to Christ.

Where there are strong pastoral reasons, the alternative form of the Decision (page 372) may be used.

Signing with the Cross

The president or another minister makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of each candidate, saying

Christ claims you for his own.
Receive the sign of his cross.

The president may invite parents, godparents and sponsors to sign the candidates with the cross. When all the candidates have been signed, the president says

Do not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified.

All **Fight valiantly as a disciple of Christ**
against sin, the world and the devil,
and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness,
restore in you the image of his glory,
and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ.

All **Amen.**

Prayer over the Water

*The ministers and candidates gather at the baptismal font.
A canticle, psalm, hymn or litany may be used (see page 370).*

*The president stands before the water of baptism and says
(optional seasonal and responsive forms are provided on
pages 364–369)*

All Praise God who made heaven and earth,
who keeps his promise for ever.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
All **It is right to give thanks and praise.**

We thank you, almighty God, for the gift of water
to sustain, refresh and cleanse all life.

Over water the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation.

Through water you led the children of Israel
from slavery in Egypt to freedom in the Promised Land.

In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John
and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ,
to lead us from the death of sin to newness of life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of baptism.

In it we are buried with Christ in his death.

By it we share in his resurrection.

Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit.

Therefore, in joyful obedience to your Son,
we baptize into his fellowship those who come to him in faith.

Now sanctify this water that, by the power of your Holy Spirit,
they may be cleansed from sin and born again.

Renewed in your image, may they walk by the light of faith

to whom with you and the Holy Spirit
be all honour and glory, now and for ever.

All **Amen.**

Profession of Faith

The president addresses the congregation

Brothers and sisters, I ask you to profess together with *these candidates* the faith of the Church.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

All **I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.**

Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ?

All **I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.**

Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit?

All **I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.**
Amen.

Where there are strong pastoral reasons the alternative Profession of Faith (page 373) may be used.

Baptism

If the candidate(s) can answer for themselves, the president may say to each one

N, is this your faith?

Each candidate answers in their own words, or

This is my faith.

The president or another minister dips each candidate in water, or pours water on them, saying

N, I baptize you
in the name of the Father,
and of the Son,
and of the Holy Spirit.

All **Amen.**

If the newly baptized are clothed with a white robe, a hymn or song may be used, and then a minister may say

You have been clothed with Christ.

As many as are baptized into Christ have put on Christ.

If those who have been baptized were not signed with the cross immediately after the Decision, the president signs each one now.

The president says:

May God, who has received you by baptism into his Church,
pour upon you the riches of his grace,
that within the company of Christ's pilgrim people
you may daily be renewed by his anointing Spirit,
and come to the inheritance of the saints in glory.

All **Amen.**

The president and those who have been baptized may return from the font.

Commission

Either *Where the newly baptized are unable to answer for themselves, a minister addresses the congregation, parents and godparents, using these or similar words*

We have brought *these children* to baptism knowing that Jesus died and rose again for *them* and trusting in the promise that God hears and answers prayer. We have prayed that in Jesus Christ *they* will know the forgiveness of *their* sins and the new life of the Spirit.

As *they* grow up, *they* will need the help and encouragement of the Christian community, so that *they* may learn to know God in public worship and private prayer, follow Jesus Christ in the life of faith, serve *their* neighbour after the example of Christ, and in due course come to confirmation.

As part of the Church of Christ, we all have a duty to support *them* by prayer, example and teaching. As *their* parents and godparents, you have the prime responsibility for guiding and helping *them* in *their* early years. This is a demanding task for which you will need the help and grace of God. Therefore let us now pray for grace in guiding *these children* in the way of faith.

One or more of the following prayers may be used

Faithful and loving God,
bless those who care for *these children*
and grant them your gifts of love, wisdom and faith.
Pour upon them your healing and reconciling love,
and protect their home from all evil.
Fill them with the light of your presence
and establish them in the joy of your kingdom,
through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All **Amen.**

God of grace and life,
in your love you have given us
a place among your people;
keep us faithful to our baptism,
and prepare us for that glorious day
when the whole creation will be made perfect
in your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ.

All **Amen.**

These words may be added

N and N,

today God has touched you with his love
and given you a place among his people.

God promises to be with you

in joy and in sorrow,

to be your guide in life,

and to bring you safely to heaven.

In baptism God invites you on a life-long journey.

Together with all God's people

you must explore the way of Jesus

and grow in friendship with God,

in love for his people,

and in serving others.

With us you will listen to the word of God

and receive the gifts of God.

or *To the newly baptized who are able to answer for themselves,
a minister may say*

Those who are baptized are called to worship and serve God.

Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship,
in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

With the help of God, I will.

Will you persevere in resisting evil,

and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

With the help of God, I will.

Will you proclaim by word and example

the good news of God in Christ?

With the help of God, I will.

Will you seek and serve Christ in all people,

loving your neighbour as yourself?

With the help of God, I will.

Will you acknowledge Christ's authority over human society,

by prayer for the world and its leaders,

by defending the weak, and by seeking peace and justice?

May Christ dwell in your heart(s) through faith,

that you may be rooted and grounded in love

and bring forth the fruit of the Spirit.

Amen.

Prayers of Intercession

Either here or after the Welcome and Peace, intercessions may be led by the president or others. These or other suitable words may be used. The intercession may conclude with a Collect.

As a royal priesthood, let us pray to the Father through Christ who ever lives to intercede for us.

Reveal your kingdom among the nations;
may peace abound and justice flourish.

Especially for ...

Your name be hallowed.

All **Your kingdom come.**

Send down upon us the gift of the Spirit
and renew your Church with power from on high.

Especially for ...

Your name be hallowed.

Notes

- 1 Collects and Post Communions for Lesser Festivals and Special Occasions, with Commons of the Saints, are published in the President's edition of *Common Worship*.
- 2 Normally on any occasion only one Collect is used.
- 3 The Collect for each Sunday is used on the following weekdays, except where other provision is made.
- 4 At Evening Prayer on Saturdays other than Easter Eve, Christmas Eve or Principal Feasts or Festivals, the Collect appointed for the ensuing Sunday shall be used. When Evening Prayer on the day before a Festival makes use of the lessons relating to that Festival, the Collect of that Festival shall be used.
- 5 Where a Collect ends 'Through Jesus Christ ... now and for ever', the minister may use the shorter ending, 'Through Jesus Christ our Lord', to which the people respond 'Amen', and omit the longer Trinitarian ending. The longer ending is to be preferred at Holy Communion.

Notes

- 1 Collects and Post Communions for Lesser Festivals and Special Occasions, with Commons of the Saints, are published in the President's edition of *Common Worship*.
- 2 Normally on any occasion only one Collect is used.
- 3 The Collect for each Sunday is used on the following weekdays, except where other provision is made.
- 4 At Evening Prayer on Saturdays other than Easter Eve, Christmas Eve or Principal Feasts or Festivals, the Collect appointed for the ensuing Sunday shall be used. When Evening Prayer on the day before a Festival makes use of the lessons relating to that Festival, the Collect of that Festival shall be used.
- 5 Where a Collect ends 'Through Jesus Christ ... now and for ever', the minister may use the shorter ending, 'Through Jesus Christ our Lord' to which the people respond 'Amen' and omit the longer Trinitarian ending. The longer ending is to be preferred at Holy Communion.

Rules for Regulating Authorized Forms of Service

¶ General

- 1 Any reference in authorized provision to the use of hymns shall be construed as including the use of texts described as songs, chants, canticles.
- 2 If occasion requires, hymns may be sung at points other than those indicated in particular forms of service. Silence may be kept at points other than those indicated in particular forms of service.
- 3 Where rubrics indicate that a text is to be 'said' this must be understood to include 'or sung' and vice versa.
- 4 Where parts of a service make use of well-known and traditional texts, other translations or versions, particularly when used in musical compositions, may be used.
- 5 Local custom may be established and followed in respect of posture but regard should be had to indications in Notes attached to authorized forms of service that a particular posture is appropriate for some parts of that form of service.
- 6 On any occasion when the text of an alternative service authorized under the provisions of Canon B 2 provides for the Lord's Prayer to be said or sung, it may be used in the form included in *The Book of Common Prayer* or in either of the two other forms included in services in *Common Worship*. The further text included in Prayers for Various Occasions (page 106) may be used on suitable occasions.
- 7 Normally on any occasion only one Collect is used.
- 8 At Baptisms, Confirmations, Ordinations and Marriages which take place on Principal Feasts, other Principal Holy Days and on Sundays of Advent, Lent and Easter, within the Celebration of the Holy Communion, the Readings of the day are used and the Collect of the Day is said, unless the bishop directs otherwise.
- 9 The Collects and Lectionary in *Common Worship* may, optionally, be used in conjunction with the days included in the Calendar of *The Book of Common Prayer*, notwithstanding any difference in the title or name of a Sunday, Holy Day or other observance included in both Calendars.

Sundays

All Sundays celebrate the paschal mystery of the death and resurrection of the Lord. Nevertheless, they also reflect the character of the seasons in which they are set.

At Evening Prayer on Saturdays other than Easter Eve, Christmas Eve or Principal Feasts or Festivals, the Collect appointed for the ensuing Sunday shall be used.

When a Festival occurs on the First or Second Sunday of Christmas, a Sunday of Epiphany, a Sunday before Lent, a Sunday after Trinity or on the Fourth, Third or Second Sundays before Advent, it is always to be observed but may be celebrated either on the Sunday or on the first available day thereafter. Festivals may not be celebrated on Sundays in Advent, Lent or Eastertide.

In a year when there are 23 Sundays after Trinity before the Fourth Sunday before Advent, the Collect and Post Communion for the Last Sunday after Trinity shall be used on the 23rd Sunday after Trinity and the Collect and Post Communion for the 3rd Sunday before Lent shall be used on the 22nd Sunday after Trinity.

Principal Feasts

The Principal Feasts which are to be observed are:

- Christmas Day
- The Epiphany
- The Presentation of Christ in the Temple
- The Annunciation of Our Lord to the Blessed Virgin Mary
- Easter Day
- Ascension Day
- Pentecost (Whit Sunday)
- Trinity Sunday
- All Saints' Day

On these days the Holy Communion is celebrated in every cathedral and parish church, and this celebration, required by Canon B 14, may only be dispensed with in accordance with the provision of Canon B 14A.

These days, and the liturgical provision for them, may not be displaced by any other celebration, except that the Annunciation,

falling on a Sunday, is transferred to the Monday following or, falling between Palm Sunday and the Second Sunday of Easter inclusive, is transferred to the Monday after the Second Sunday of Easter.

Except in the case of Christmas Day and Easter Day, the celebration of the Feast begins with Evening Prayer on the day before the Feast, and the Collect at that Evening Prayer is that of the Feast. In the case of Christmas Eve and Easter Eve, there is proper liturgical provision, including a Collect, for the Eve, and this is used at both Morning and Evening Prayer.

In any year when there is a Second Sunday of Christmas, the Epiphany (6 January) may, for pastoral reasons, be celebrated on that Sunday.

The Presentation of Christ in the Temple (Candlemas) is celebrated either on 2 February or on the Sunday falling between 28 January and 3 February.

All Saints' Day is celebrated on either 1 November or the Sunday falling between 30 October and 5 November; if the latter there may be a secondary celebration on 1 November.

Other Principal Holy Days

Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday and Good Friday are Principal Holy Days. These days, and the liturgical provision for them, may not be displaced by any other celebration.

On Ash Wednesday and Maundy Thursday the Holy Communion is celebrated in every cathedral and parish church, except where there is dispensation under Canon B 14A.

Easter tide

The paschal character of the Great Fifty Days of Easter, from Easter Day to Pentecost, should be celebrated throughout the season, and should not be displaced by other celebrations. Except for a Patronal or Dedication Festival, no Festival may displace the celebration of Sunday as a memorial of the resurrection, and no saint's day may be celebrated in Easter Week.

The paschal character of the season should be retained on those weekdays when saints' days are celebrated.

Rogation Days are the three days before Ascension Day, when prayer is offered for God's blessing on the fruits of the earth and on human labour.

The nine days after Ascension Day until Pentecost are days of prayer and preparation to celebrate the outpouring of the Spirit.

- Philip and James, Apostles (*1 May*)
- Matthias the Apostle (*14 May*)

- Barnabas the Apostle (*11 June*)
- The Birth of John the Baptist (*24 June*)
- Peter and Paul, Apostles (*29 June*)
- Thomas the Apostle (*3 July*)
- Mary Magdalene (*22 July*)

These days, and the liturgical provision for them, are not usually displaced. For each day there is full liturgical provision for the Holy Communion and for Morning and Evening Prayer.

Provision is also made for a first Evening Prayer on the day before the Festival where this is required. When Evening Prayer on the day before a Festival makes use of the lessons relating to that Festival, the Collect of that Festival shall be used.

Festivals falling on a Sunday are to be kept on that day or transferred to the Monday (or, at the discretion of the minister, to the next suitable weekday). But a Festival may not be celebrated on Sundays in Advent, Lent or Eastertide. Festivals coinciding with a Principal Feast or Principal Holy Day are transferred to the first available day.

The Baptism of Christ is transferred only when 6 January is a Sunday.

When St Joseph's Day falls between Palm Sunday and the Second Sunday of Easter inclusive, it is transferred to the Monday after the Second Sunday of Easter or, if the Annunciation has already been moved to that date, to the first available day thereafter.

When St George's Day or St Mark's Day falls between Palm Sunday and the Second Sunday of Easter inclusive, it is transferred to the Monday after the Second Sunday of Easter. If both fall in this period, St George's Day is transferred to the Monday and St Mark's Day to the Tuesday. When the Festivals of George and Mark both occur in the week following Easter and are transferred in accordance with these Rules in a place where the calendar of *The Book of Common Prayer* is followed, the Festival of Mark shall be observed on the second available day so that it will be observed on the same day as in places following alternative authorized Calendars, where George will have been transferred to the first available free day.

The Thursday after Trinity Sunday may be observed as the Day of Thanksgiving for the Holy Communion (sometimes known as Corpus Christi), and may be kept as a Festival. Where the Thursday following Trinity Sunday is observed as a Festival to commemorate the Institution of the Holy Communion and that day falls on a date which is also a Festival, the commemoration of the Institution of Holy Communion shall be observed on that Thursday and the other occurring Festival shall be transferred to the first available day.

The Festival of the Blessed Virgin Mary (15 August) may, for pastoral reasons, be celebrated instead on 8 September.

Christ the King is never transferred.

Local Celebrations

The celebration of the patron saint or the title of a church is kept either as a Festival or as a Principal Feast.

The Dedication Festival of a church is the anniversary of the date of its dedication or consecration. This is kept either as a Festival or as a Principal Feast.

When the date of dedication is unknown, the Dedication Festival may be observed on the first Sunday in October, or on the Last Sunday after Trinity, or on a suitable date chosen locally.

When kept as Principal Feasts, the Patronal and Dedication Festivals may be transferred to the nearest Sunday, unless that day is already a Principal Feast or one of the following days: the First Sunday of Advent, the Baptism of Christ, the First Sunday of Lent, the Fifth Sunday of Lent or Palm Sunday.

Harvest Thanksgiving may be celebrated on a Sunday and may replace the provision for that day, provided it does not supersede any Principal Feast or Festival.

In the Calendar of the Saints, diocesan and other local provision may be made to supplement the national Calendar.

Lesser Festivals

Lesser Festivals, which are listed in the Calendar, are observed at the level appropriate to a particular church. Each is provided with a Collect, Psalm and Readings, which may supersede the Collect of the week and the daily eucharistic lectionary. The daily Psalms and Readings at Morning and Evening Prayer are not usually superseded by those for Lesser Festivals, but at the minister's discretion Psalms and Readings provided on these days for the Holy Communion may be used at Morning and Evening Prayer.

The minister may be selective in the Lesser Festivals that are observed, and may also keep some or all of them as commemorations.

When a Lesser Festival falls on a Principal Feast or Holy Day or on a Festival, its celebration is normally omitted for that year, but, where there is sufficient reason, it may, at the discretion of the minister, be celebrated on the nearest available day.

Commemorations

Commemorations, which are listed in the Calendar, are made by a mention in prayers of intercession and thanksgiving. They are not provided with Collect, Psalm and Readings, and do not replace the usual weekday provision at either the Holy Communion or Morning and Evening Prayer.

The minister may be selective in the Commemorations that are made.

A Commemoration may be observed as a Lesser Festival, with liturgical provision from the common material for holy men and women, only where there is an established celebration in the wider church or where the day has a special local significance. In designating a Commemoration as a Lesser Festival, the minister must remember the need not to lose the spirit of the season, especially of Advent and Lent, by too many celebrations that detract from its character.

Days of Discipline and Self Denial

The weekdays of Lent and every Friday in the year are days of discipline and self denial, except all Principal Feasts and Festivals outside Lent and Fridays from Easter Day to Pentecost.

The eves of Principal Feasts are also appropriately kept as days of discipline and self denial in preparation for the Feast.

Ember Days

Ember Days should be kept, under the bishop's directions, in the week before an ordination as days of prayer for those to be made deacon or priest.

Ember Days may also be kept even when there is no ordination in the diocese as more general days of prayer for those who serve the Church in its various ministries, both ordained and lay, and for vocations.

Traditionally they have been observed on the Wednesdays, Fridays and Saturdays within the weeks before the Third Sunday of Advent, the Second Sunday of Lent and the Sundays nearest to 29 June and 29 September.

Ordinary Time

Ordinary Time is the period after the Feast of the Presentation of Christ until Shrove Tuesday, and from the day after the Feast of Pentecost until the day before the First Sunday of Advent. During Ordinary Time there is no seasonal emphasis, except that the period between All Saints' Day and the First Sunday of Advent is observed as a time to celebrate and reflect upon the reign of Christ in earth and heaven.

Liturgical Colours

Appropriate liturgical colours are suggested (adjacent to each Collect on pages 376–521): they are not mandatory and traditional or local use may be followed. The colour for a particular service should reflect the predominant theme. If the Collect, Readings, etc. on a Lesser Festival are those of the saint, then either red (for a martyr) or white is used; otherwise, the colour of the season is retained.

White is the colour for the festal periods from Christmas Day to the Presentation and from Easter Day to the Eve of Pentecost, for Trinity Sunday, for Festivals of Our Lord and the Blessed Virgin Mary, for All Saints' Day, and for the Festivals of those saints not venerated as martyrs, for the Feast of Dedication of a church, at Holy Communion on Maundy Thursday and in thanksgiving for Holy Communion and Holy Baptism. It is used for Marriages, and is suitable for Baptism, Confirmation and Ordination, though red may be preferred. It may be used in preference to purple or black for Funerals, and should be used at the Funeral of a child. Where a church has two sets of white, one may be kept for great Festivals indicated as 'gold or white'.

Red is used during Holy Week (except at Holy Communion on Maundy Thursday), on the Feast of Pentecost, may be used between All Saints' Day and the First Sunday of Advent (except where other provision is made) and is used for the Feasts of those saints venerated as martyrs. It is appropriate for any services which focus on the gift of the Holy Spirit, and is therefore suitable for Baptism, Confirmation and Ordination. Coloured hangings are traditionally removed for Good Friday and Easter Eve, but red is the colour for the liturgy on Good Friday.

Purple (which may vary from 'Roman purple' to violet, with blue as an alternative) is the colour for Advent and from Ash Wednesday until the day before Palm Sunday. It is recommended for Funerals and for the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed, although either black or white may be preferred. A Lent array of unbleached linen is sometimes used as an alternative to purple, but only from Ash Wednesday until the day before Palm Sunday. Rose-colour is sometimes used as an alternative on the Third Sunday of Advent and the Fourth Sunday of Lent.

Green is used from the day after the Presentation until Shrove Tuesday, and from the day after Pentecost until the eve of All Saints' Day, except when other provision is made. It may also be used, rather than red, between All Saints' Day and the First Sunday of Advent.

¶ Rules to order how the Psalter and the rest of Holy Scripture are appointed to be read

- 1 In the reading of psalms and other portions of Holy Scripture any version of Holy Scripture which is not prohibited by lawful authority may be used.
- 2 The references in the following tables, except those to the psalms, are to the *New Revised Standard Version* of the Bible. References to the psalms are to the *Common Worship* psalter (pages 593–773). When other versions are used, such adaptations are made as necessary.

The references in the following tables, including those to the psalms, state book, chapter and verse in that order. Where optional additional verses or psalms are set, the references are placed in square parentheses [. . .]. A simple choice between two alternative readings is indicated by an italicized *or*, placed between references.

Longer psalms, which are starred thus*, have optional shorter alternatives given in the tables on pages 589–590.

- 3 When a reading begins with a personal pronoun, the reader may substitute the appropriate noun.
- 4 In these tables, verses are stated inclusively. The letter *a* after the number of a verse signifies the first part of that verse; the letter *b* the second part.
- 5 In a compact cycle of readings such as these, some passages have necessarily been abbreviated. When opportunity allows, the passages may be read in full. Verses in brackets may be included or omitted, as desired.

- 6 When there are only two readings at the principal service and that service is Holy Communion, the second reading is always the Gospel reading.

If there are only two readings at the principal service on Ascension Day, Pentecost, the Conversion of Paul or the Festivals of Matthias, Barnabas, James and Stephen, the reading from the Acts of the Apostles must always be used.

In the choice of readings other than the Gospel reading, the minister should ensure that, in any year, a balance is maintained between readings from the Old and New Testaments and that, where a particular biblical book is appointed to be read over several weeks, the choice ensures that this continuity of one book is not lost.

When the Principal Service Lectionary is used at a service other than Holy Communion, the Gospel reading need not always be chosen.

- 7 During the period from the First Sunday of Advent to the Presentation of Christ in the Temple, during the period from Ash Wednesday to Trinity Sunday, and on All Saints' Day, the readings shall come from an authorized lectionary. During Ordinary Time (i.e. between the Presentation and Ash Wednesday and between Trinity Sunday and Advent Sunday), authorized lectionary provision remains the norm but, after due consultation with the Parochial Church Council, the minister may, from time to time, depart from the lectionary provision for pastoral reasons or preaching or teaching purposes.

- 8 Three sets of psalms and readings are provided for each Sunday. The Principal Service Lectionary (which is drawn from the Revised Common Lectionary) is intended for use at the principal service of the day (whether this service is Holy Communion or some other authorized form). In most church communities, this is likely to be the mid-morning service, but the minister is free to decide which service time normally constitutes the principal service of the day.

The Second Service Lectionary is intended for a second main service. In many churches, this lectionary will be the appropriate provision for a Sunday afternoon or evening service. A Gospel reading is always provided so that this lectionary can, if necessary, be used at Holy Communion.

The Third Service Lectionary, with shorter readings, is intended for use when a third set of psalms and readings is needed. It is most appropriate for use at an office.

On Principal Feasts and Festivals the psalms are appropriate either for morning use or for evening use. They are therefore shown separately from the readings for the Second and Third Services.

- 9 On the Sundays between the Presentation of Christ in the Temple and the Second Sunday before Lent, and again on the Sundays after Trinity, the readings and Collects follow independent courses. The Collects and Post Communions are attached to the Sunday title (the Fifth/Fourth/Third Sunday before Lent, the First/Second/Third Sunday after Trinity, etc.), but the sets of proper readings (Propers 4, 5, 6) belong to particular calendar dates (i.e. the Sunday between two dates).
- 10 On the Sundays after Trinity, the Principal Service Lectionary provides alternative Old Testament readings and psalms. Those under the heading 'Continuous' allow the Old Testament reading and its complementary psalm to stand independently of the other readings. Those under the heading 'Related' relate the Old Testament reading and the psalm to the Gospel reading. It is unhelpful to move from week to week from one column to another. One column should be followed for the whole sequence of Sundays after Trinity.

An asterisk* against a reference indicates that a shorter optional alternative is given in the tables on pages 589 and 590.

¶ When saying a psalm aloud, the word 'blessed' is to be pronounced as two syllables: 'bless - ed'. Where spelled 'blest', the word is pronounced as one syllable.

¶ A diamond ♦ marks the mid-point in each psalm verse where, traditionally, a pause is observed.

¶ Each psalm or group of psalms may end with

Glory to the Father and to the Son
and to the Holy Spirit;
as it was in the beginning is now
and shall be for ever. Amen.

Psalm 1

- 1 Blessed are they who have not walked
in the counsel of the wicked, ♦
nor lingered in the way of sinners,
nor sat in the assembly of the scornful.
- 2 Their delight is in the law of the Lord ♦
and they meditate on his law day and night.
- 3 Like a tree planted by streams of water
bearing fruit in due season, with leaves that do not wither, ♦
whatever they do, it shall prosper.
- 4 As for the wicked, it is not so with them; ♦
they are like chaff which the wind blows away.
- 5 Therefore the wicked shall not be able to stand in the judgement, ♦
nor the sinner in the congregation of the righteous.
- 6 For the Lord knows the way of the righteous, ♦
but the way of the wicked shall perish.

Psalm 2

- 1 Why are the nations in tumult, ♦
and why do the peoples devise a vain plot?
- 2 The kings of the earth rise up,
and the rulers take counsel together, ♦
against the Lord and against his anointed:
- 3 'Let us break their bonds asunder ♦
and cast away their cords from us.'
- 4 He who dwells in heaven shall laugh them to scorn; ♦
the Lord shall have them in derision.
- 5 Then shall he speak to them in his wrath ♦
and terrify them in his fury:
- 6 'Yet have I set my king ♦
upon my holy hill of Zion.'

- 7 I will proclaim the decree of the Lord; ♦
he said to me: 'You are my Son; this day have I begotten you.
- 8 'Ask of me and I will give you the nations for your inheritance ♦
and the ends of the earth for your possession.
- 9 'You shall break them with a rod of iron ♦
and dash them in pieces like a potter's vessel.'
- 10 Now therefore be wise, O kings; ♦
be prudent, you judges of the earth.
- 11 Serve the Lord with fear, and with trembling kiss his feet, ♦
lest he be angry and you perish from the way,
for his wrath is quickly kindled.
- 12 Happy are all they ♦
who take refuge in him.

Psalm 3

- 1 Lord, how many are my adversaries; ♦
many are they who rise up against me.
- 2 Many are they who say to my soul, ♦
'There is no help for you in your God.'
- 3 But you, Lord, are a shield about me; ♦
you are my glory, and the lifter up of my head.
- 4 When I cry aloud to the Lord, ♦
he will answer me from his holy hill;
- 5 I lie down and sleep and rise again, ♦
because the Lord sustains me.
- 6 I will not be afraid of hordes of the peoples ♦
that have set themselves against me all around.
- 7 Rise up, O Lord, and deliver me, O my God, ♦
for you strike all my enemies on the cheek
and break the teeth of the wicked.
- 8 Salvation belongs to the Lord: ♦
may your blessing be upon your people.

Psalm 4

- 1 Answer me when I call, O God of my righteousness; ♦
you set me at liberty when I was in trouble;
have mercy on me and hear my prayer.
- 2 How long will you nobles dishonour my glory; ♦
how long will you love vain things and seek after falsehood?
- 3 But know that the Lord has shown me his marvellous kindness; ♦
when I call upon the Lord, he will hear me.
- 4 Stand in awe, and sin not; ♦
commune with your own heart upon your bed, and be still.
- 5 Offer the sacrifices of righteousness ♦
and put your trust in the Lord.
- 6 There are many that say, 'Who will show us any good?' ♦
Lord, lift up the light of your countenance upon us.
- 7 You have put gladness in my heart, ♦
more than when their corn and wine and oil increase.
- 8 In peace I will lie down and sleep, ♦
for it is you Lord, only, who make me dwell in safety.

Psalm 5

- 1 Give ear to my words, O Lord; ♦
consider my lamentation.
- 2 Hearken to the voice of my crying, my King and my God, ♦
for to you I make my prayer.
- 3 In the morning, Lord, you will hear my voice; ♦
early in the morning I make my appeal to you, and look up.
- 4 For you are the God who takes no pleasure in wickedness; ♦
no evil can dwell with you.
- 5 The boastful cannot stand in your sight; ♦
you hate all those that work wickedness.
- 6 You destroy those who speak lies; ♦
the bloodthirsty and deceitful the Lord will abhor.

- 7 But as for me, through the greatness of your mercy,
I will come into your house; ♦
I will bow down towards your holy temple in awe of you.
- 8 Lead me, Lord, in your righteousness,
because of my enemies; ♦
make your way straight before my face.
- 9 For there is no truth in their mouth,
in their heart is destruction, ♦
their throat is an open sepulchre,
and they flatter with their tongue.
- 10 Punish them, O God; ♦
let them fall through their own devices.
- 11 Because of their many transgressions cast them out, ♦
for they have rebelled against you.
- 12 But let all who take refuge in you be glad; ♦
let them sing out their joy for ever.
- 13 You will shelter them, ♦
so that those who love your name may exult in you.
- 14 For you, O Lord, will bless the righteous; ♦
and with your favour you will defend them as with a shield.

Psalm 6

- 1 O Lord, rebuke me not in your wrath; ♦
neither chasten me in your fierce anger.
- 2 Have mercy on me, Lord, for I am weak; ♦
Lord, heal me, for my bones are racked.
- 3 My soul also shakes with terror; ♦
how long, O Lord, how long?
- 4 Turn again, O Lord, and deliver my soul; ♦
save me for your loving mercy's sake.
- 5 For in death no one remembers you; ♦
and who can give you thanks in the grave?
- 6 I am weary with my groaning; ♦
every night I drench my pillow
and flood my bed with my tears.

- 7 My eyes are wasted with grief ♦
and worn away because of all my enemies.
- 8 Depart from me, all you that do evil, ♦
for the Lord has heard the voice of my weeping.
- 9 The Lord has heard my supplication; ♦
the Lord will receive my prayer.
- 10 All my enemies shall be put to shame and confusion; ♦
they shall suddenly turn back in their shame.

Psalm 7

- 1 O Lord my God, in you I take refuge; ♦
save me from all who pursue me, and deliver me,
- 2 Lest they rend me like a lion and tear me in pieces ♦
while there is no one to help me.
- 3 O Lord my God, if I have done these things: ♦
if there is any wickedness in my hands,
- 4 If I have repaid my friend with evil, ♦
or plundered my enemy without a cause,
- 5 Then let my enemy pursue me and overtake me, ♦
trample my life to the ground,
and lay my honour in the dust.
- 6 Rise up, O Lord, in your wrath;
lift yourself up against the fury of my enemies. ♦
Awaken, my God, the judgement that you have commanded.
- 7 Let the assembly of the peoples gather round you; ♦
be seated high above them: O Lord, judge the nations.
- 8 Give judgement for me
according to my righteousness, O Lord, ♦
and according to the innocence that is in me.
- 9 Let the malice of the wicked come to an end,
but establish the righteous; ♦
for you test the mind and heart, O righteous God.

- 10 God is my shield that is over me; ♦
he saves the true of heart.
- 11 God is a righteous judge; ♦
he is provoked all day long.
- 12 If they will not repent, God will whet his sword; ♦
he has bent his bow and made it ready.
- 13 He has prepared the weapons of death; ♦
he makes his arrows shafts of fire.
- 14 Behold those who are in labour with wickedness, ♦
who conceive evil and give birth to lies.
- 15 They dig a pit and make it deep ♦
and fall into the hole that they have made for others.
- 16 Their mischief rebounds on their own head; ♦
their violence falls on their own scalp.
- 17 I will give thanks to the Lord for his righteousness, ♦
and I will make music to the name of the Lord Most High.

Psalm 8

First version

- 1 O Lord our governor, ♦
how glorious is your name in all the world!
- 2 Your majesty above the heavens is praised ♦
out of the mouths of babes at the breast.
- 3 You have founded a stronghold against your foes, ♦
that you might still the enemy and the avenger.
- 4 When I consider your heavens, the work of your fingers, ♦
the moon and the stars that you have ordained,
- 5 What is man, that you should be mindful of him; ♦
the son of man, that you should seek him out?
- 6 You have made him little lower than the angels ♦
and crown him with glory and honour.
- 7 You have given him dominion over the works of your hands ♦
and put all things under his feet,

- 8 All sheep and oxen, ♦
even the wild beasts of the field,
- 9 The birds of the air, the fish of the sea ♦
and whatsoever moves in the paths of the sea.

Psalm 8

- 1 *O Lord our governor, ♦
how glorious is your name in all the world!*
- 2 Your majesty above the heavens is praised ♦

- 3 You have founded a stronghold against your foes, ♦
that you might still the enemy and the avenger.
- 4 When I consider your heavens, the work of your fingers, ♦
the moon and the stars that you have ordained,
- 5 What are mortals, that you should be mindful of them; ♦
mere human beings, that you should seek them out?
- 6 You have made them little lower than the angels ♦
and crown them with glory and honour.
- 7 You have given them dominion over the works of your hands ♦

- 1 I will give thanks to you, Lord, with my whole heart; ♦
I will tell of all your marvellous works.
- 2 I will be glad and rejoice in you; ♦
I will make music to your name, O Most High.
- 3 When my enemies are driven back, ♦
they stumble and perish at your presence.
- 4 For you have maintained my right and my cause; ♦
you sat on your throne giving righteous judgement.
- 5 You have rebuked the nations and destroyed the wicked; ♦
you have blotted out their name for ever and ever.
- 6 The enemy was utterly laid waste. ♦
You uprooted their cities;
their very memory has perished.
- 7 But the Lord shall endure for ever; ♦
he has made fast his throne for judgement.
- 8 For he shall rule the world with righteousness ♦
and govern the peoples with equity.
- 9 Then will the Lord be a refuge for the oppressed, ♦
a refuge in the time of trouble.
- 10 And those who know your name will put their trust in you, ♦
for you, Lord, have never failed those who seek you.
- 11 Sing praises to the Lord who dwells in Zion; ♦
declare among the peoples the things he has done.
- 12 The avenger of blood has remembered them; ♦
he did not forget the cry of the oppressed.
- 13 Have mercy upon me, O Lord; ♦
consider the trouble I suffer from those who hate me,
you that lift me up from the gates of death;
- 14 That I may tell all your praises in the gates of the city of Zion ♦
and rejoice in your salvation.

- 15 The nations shall sink into the pit of their making ♦
and in the snare which they set will their own foot be taken.
- 16 The Lord makes himself known by his acts of justice; ♦
the wicked are snared in the works of their own hands.
- 17 They shall return to the land of darkness, ♦
all the nations that forget God.
- 18 For the needy shall not always be forgotten ♦
and the hope of the poor shall not perish for ever.
- 19 Arise, O Lord, and let not mortals have the upper hand; ♦
let the nations be judged before your face.
- 20 Put them in fear, O Lord, ♦
that the nations may know themselves to be but mortal.

Psalm 10

- 1 Why stand so far off, O Lord? ♦
Why hide yourself in time of trouble?
- 2 The wicked in their pride persecute the poor; ♦
let them be caught in the schemes they have devised.
- 3 The wicked boast of their heart's desire; ♦
the covetous curse and revile the Lord.
- 4 The wicked in their arrogance say, 'God will not avenge it'; ♦
in all their scheming God counts for nothing.
- 5 They are stubborn in all their ways,
for your judgements are far above out of their sight; ♦
they scoff at all their adversaries.
- 6 They say in their heart, 'I shall not be shaken; ♦
no harm shall ever happen to me.'
- 7 Their mouth is full of cursing, deceit and fraud; ♦
under their tongue lie mischief and wrong.
- 8 They lurk in the outskirts
and in dark alleys they murder the innocent; ♦
their eyes are ever watching for the helpless.

- 9 They lie in wait, like a lion in his den;
they lie in wait to seize the poor; ♦
they seize the poor when they get them into their net.
- 10 The innocent are broken and humbled before them; ♦
the helpless fall before their power.
- 11 They say in their heart, 'God has forgotten; ♦
he hides his face away; he will never see it.'
- 12 Arise, O Lord God, and lift up your hand; ♦
forget not the poor.
- 13 Why should the wicked be scornful of God? ♦
Why should they say in their hearts, 'You will not avenge it?'
- 14 Surely, you behold trouble and misery; ♦
you see it and take it into your own hand.
- 15 The helpless commit themselves to you, ♦
for you are the helper of the orphan.
- 16 Break the power of the wicked and malicious; ♦
search out their wickedness until you find none.
- 17 The Lord shall reign for ever and ever; ♦
the nations shall perish from his land.
- 18 Lord, you will hear the desire of the poor; ♦
you will incline your ear to the fullness of their heart,
- 19 To give justice to the orphan and oppressed, ♦
so that people are no longer driven in terror from the land.

Psalm 11

- 1 In the Lord have I taken refuge; ♦
how then can you say to me,
'Flee like a bird to the hills,
- 2 'For see how the wicked bend the bow
and fit their arrows to the string, ♦
to shoot from the shadows at the true of heart.
- 3 'When the foundations are destroyed, ♦
what can the righteous do?'

- 4 The Lord is in his holy temple; ♦
the Lord's throne is in heaven.
- 5 His eyes behold, ♦
his eyelids try every mortal being.
- 6 The Lord tries the righteous as well as the wicked, ♦
but those who delight in violence his soul abhors.
- 7 Upon the wicked he shall rain coals of fire
and burning sulphur; ♦
scorching wind shall be their portion to drink.
- 8 For the Lord is righteous;
he loves righteous deeds, ♦
and those who are upright shall behold his face.

Psalm 12

- 1 Help me, Lord, for no one godly is left; ♦
the faithful have vanished from the whole human race.
- 2 They all speak falsely with their neighbour; ♦
they flatter with their lips, but speak from a double heart.
- 3 O that the Lord would cut off all flattering lips ♦
and the tongue that speaks proud boasts!
- 4 Those who say, 'With our tongue will we prevail; ♦
our lips we will use; who is lord over us?'
- 5 'Because of the oppression of the needy,
and the groaning of the poor, ♦
I will rise up now,' says the Lord,
'and set them in the safety that they long for.'
- 6 The words of the Lord are pure words, ♦
like silver refined in the furnace
and purified seven times in the fire.
- 7 You, O Lord, will watch over us ♦
and guard us from this generation for ever.
- 8 The wicked strut on every side, ♦
when what is vile is exalted by the whole human race.

Psalm 13

- 1 How long will you forget me, O Lord; for ever? ♦
How long will you hide your face from me?
- 2 How long shall I have anguish in my soul
and grief in my heart, day after day? ♦
How long shall my enemy triumph over me?
- 3 Look upon me and answer, O Lord my God; ♦
lighten my eyes, lest I sleep in death;
- 4 Lest my enemy say, 'I have prevailed against him,' ♦
and my foes rejoice that I have fallen.

- 5 But I put my trust in your steadfast love; ♦
my heart will rejoice in your salvation.
- 6 I will sing to the Lord, ♦
for he has dealt so bountifully with me.

Psalm 14

- 1 The fool has said in his heart, 'There is no God.' ♦
Corrupt are they, and abominable in their wickedness;
there is no one that does good.
- 2 The Lord has looked down from heaven
upon the children of earth, ♦
to see if there is anyone who is wise
and seeks after God.
- 3 But every one has turned back;
all alike have become corrupt: ♦
there is none that does good; no, not one.
- 4 Have they no knowledge, those evildoers, ♦
who eat up my people as if they ate bread
and do not call upon the Lord?
- 5 There shall they be in great fear; ♦
for God is in the company of the righteous.

- 6 Though they would confound the counsel of the poor, ♦
yet the Lord shall be their refuge.
- 7 O that Israel's salvation would come out of Zion! ♦
When the Lord restores the fortunes of his people,
then will Jacob rejoice and Israel be glad.

Psalm 15

- 1 Lord, who may dwell in your tabernacle? ♦
Who may rest upon your holy hill?
- 2 Whoever leads an uncorrupt life ♦
and does the thing that is right;
- 3 Who speaks the truth from the heart ♦
and bears no deceit on the tongue;
- 4 Who does no evil to a friend ♦
and pours no scorn on a neighbour;
- 5 In whose sight the wicked are not esteemed, ♦
but who honours those who fear the Lord.
- 6 Whoever has sworn to a neighbour ♦
and never goes back on that word;
- 7 Who does not lend money in hope of gain, ♦
nor takes a bribe against the innocent;
- 8 Whoever does these things ♦
shall never fall.

Psalm 16

- 1 Preserve me, O God, for in you have I taken refuge; ♦
I have said to the Lord, 'You are my lord,
all my good depends on you.'
- 2 All my delight is upon the godly that are in the land, ♦
upon those who are noble in heart.
- 3 Though the idols are legion
that many run after, ♦
their drink offerings of blood I will not offer,
neither make mention of their names upon my lips.

- 4 The Lord himself is my portion and my cup; ♦
in your hands alone is my fortune.
- 5 My share has fallen in a fair land; ♦
indeed, I have a goodly heritage.
- 6 I will bless the Lord who has given me counsel, ♦
and in the night watches he instructs my heart.
- 7 I have set the Lord always before me; ♦
he is at my right hand; I shall not fall.
- 8 Wherefore my heart is glad and my spirit rejoices; ♦
my flesh also shall rest secure.
- 9 For you will not abandon my soul to Death, ♦
nor suffer your faithful one to see the Pit.
- 10 You will show me the path of life;
in your presence is the fullness of joy ♦
and in your right hand are pleasures for evermore.

Psalm 17

- 1 Hear my just cause, O Lord; consider my complaint; ♦
listen to my prayer, which comes not from lying lips.
- 2 Let my vindication come forth from your presence; ♦
let your eyes behold what is right.
- 3 Weigh my heart, examine me by night, ♦
refine me, and you will find no impurity in me.
- 4 My mouth does not trespass for earthly rewards; ♦
I have heeded the words of your lips.
- 5 My footsteps hold fast in the ways of your commandments; ♦
my feet have not stumbled in your paths.
- 6 I call upon you, O God, for you will answer me; ♦
incline your ear to me, and listen to my words.
- 7 Show me your marvellous loving-kindness, ♦
O Saviour of those who take refuge at your right hand
from those who rise up against them.
- 8 Keep me as the apple of your eye; ♦
hide me under the shadow of your wings,

- 9 From the wicked who assault me, ♦
from my enemies who surround me to take away my life.
- 10 They have closed their heart to pity ♦
and their mouth speaks proud things.
- 11 They press me hard, they surround me on every side, ♦
watching how they may cast me to the ground,
- 12 Like a lion that is greedy for its prey, ♦
like a young lion lurking in secret places.
- 13 Arise, Lord; confront them and cast them down; ♦
deliver me from the wicked by your sword.
- 14 Deliver me, O Lord, by your hand ♦
from those whose portion in life is unending,
- 15 Whose bellies you fill with your treasure, ♦
who are well supplied with children
and leave their wealth to their little ones.
- 16 As for me, I shall see your face in righteousness; ♦
when I awake and behold your likeness, I shall be satisfied.

Psalm 18

- 1 I love you, O Lord my strength. ♦
The Lord is my crag, my fortress and my deliverer,
- 2 My God, my rock in whom I take refuge, ♦
my shield, the horn of my salvation and my stronghold.
- 3 I cried to the Lord in my anguish ♦
and I was saved from my enemies.
- 4 The cords of death entwined me ♦
and the torrents of destruction overwhelmed me.
- 5 The cords of the Pit fastened about me ♦
and the snares of death entangled me.
- 6 In my distress I called upon the Lord ♦
and cried out to my God for help.
- 7 He heard my voice in his temple ♦
and my cry came to his ears.

- 8 The earth trembled and quaked; ♦
the foundations of the mountains shook;
they reeled because he was angry.
- 9 Smoke rose from his nostrils
and a consuming fire went out of his mouth; ♦
burning coals blazed forth from him.
- 10 He parted the heavens and came down ♦
and thick darkness was under his feet.
- 11 He rode upon the cherubim and flew; ♦
he came flying on the wings of the wind.
- 12 He made darkness his covering round about him, ♦
dark waters and thick clouds his pavilion.
- 13 From the brightness of his presence, through the clouds ♦
burst hailstones and coals of fire.
- 14 The Lord also thundered out of heaven; ♦
the Most High uttered his voice
with hailstones and coals of fire.
- 15 He sent out his arrows and scattered them; ♦
he hurled down lightnings and put them to flight.
- 16 The springs of the ocean were seen,
and the foundations of the world uncovered ♦
at your rebuke, O Lord,
at the blast of the breath of your displeasure.
- 17 He reached down from on high and took me; ♦
he drew me out of the mighty waters.
- 18 He delivered me from my strong enemy, ♦
from foes that were too mighty for me.
- 19 They came upon me in the day of my trouble; ♦
but the Lord was my upholder.
- 20 He brought me out into a place of liberty; ♦
he rescued me because he delighted in me.
- 21 The Lord rewarded me after my righteous dealing; ♦
according to the cleanness of my hands he recompensed me,
- 22 Because I had kept the ways of the Lord ♦
and had not gone wickedly away from my God,

- 23 For I had an eye to all his laws, ♦
and did not cast out his commandments from me.
- 24 I was also wholehearted before him ♦
and kept myself from iniquity;
- 25 Therefore the Lord rewarded me
after my righteous dealing, ♦
and according to the cleanness of my hands in his sight.
- 26 With the faithful you show yourself faithful; ♦
with the true you show yourself true;
- 27 With the pure you show yourself pure, ♦
but with the crooked you show yourself perverse.
- 28 For you will save a lowly people ♦
and bring down the high looks of the proud.
- 29 You also shall light my candle; ♦
the Lord my God shall make my darkness to be bright.
- 30 By your help I shall run at an enemy host; ♦
with the help of my God I can leap over a wall.
- 31 As for God, his way is perfect;
the word of the Lord is tried in the fire; ♦
he is a shield to all who trust in him.
- 32 For who is God but the Lord, ♦
and who is the rock except our God?
- 33 It is God who girds me about with strength ♦
and makes my way perfect.
- 34 He makes my feet like hinds' feet ♦
so that I tread surely on the heights.
- 35 He teaches my hands to fight ♦
and my arms to bend a bow of bronze.
- 36 You have given me the shield of your salvation; ♦
your right hand upholds me
and your grace has made me great.
- 37 You enlarge my strides beneath me, ♦
yet my feet do not slide.
- 38 I will pursue my enemies and overtake them, ♦
nor turn again until I have destroyed them.

- 39 I will smite them down so they cannot rise; ♦
they shall fall beneath my feet.
- 40 You have girded me with strength for the battle; ♦
you will cast down my enemies under me;
- 41 You will make my foes turn their backs upon me ♦
and I shall destroy them that hate me.
- 42 They will cry out, but there shall be none to help them; ♦
they will cry to the Lord, but he will not answer.
- 43 I shall beat them as small as the dust on the wind; ♦
I will cast them out as the mire in the streets.
- 44 You will deliver me from the strife of the peoples; ♦
you will make me the head of the nations.
- 45 A people I have not known shall serve me;
as soon as they hear me, they shall obey me; ♦
strangers will humble themselves before me.
- 46 The foreign peoples will lose heart ♦
and come trembling out of their strongholds.
- 47 The Lord lives, and blessed be my rock! ♦
Praised be the God of my salvation,
- 48 Even the God who vindicates me ♦
and subdues the peoples under me!
- 49 You that deliver me from my enemies,
you will set me up above my foes; ♦
from the violent you will deliver me;
- 50 Therefore will I give you thanks, O Lord, among the nations ♦
and sing praises to your name,
- 51 To the one who gives great victory to his king ♦
and shows faithful love to his anointed,
to David and his seed for ever.

- 1 The heavens are telling the glory of God ♦
and the firmament proclaims his handiwork.
- 2 One day pours out its song to another ♦
and one night unfolds knowledge to another.
- 3 They have neither speech nor language ♦
and their voices are not heard,
- 4 Yet their sound has gone out into all lands ♦
and their words to the ends of the world.
- 5 In them has he set a tabernacle for the sun, ♦
that comes forth as a bridegroom out of his chamber
and rejoices as a champion to run his course.
- 6 It goes forth from the end of the heavens
and runs to the very end again, ♦
and there is nothing hidden from its heat.
- 7 The law of the Lord is perfect, reviving the soul; ♦
the testimony of the Lord is sure
and gives wisdom to the simple.
- 8 The statutes of the Lord are right and rejoice the heart; ♦
the commandment of the Lord is pure
and gives light to the eyes.
- 9 The fear of the Lord is clean and endures for ever; ♦
the judgements of the Lord are true
and righteous altogether.
- 10 More to be desired are they than gold,
more than much fine gold, ♦
sweeter also than honey,
dripping from the honeycomb.
- 11 By them also is your servant taught ♦
and in keeping them there is great reward.
- 12 Who can tell how often they offend? ♦
O cleanse me from my secret faults!

- 13 Keep your servant also from presumptuous sins
lest they get dominion over me; ♦
so shall I be undefiled,
and innocent of great offence.
- 14 Let the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart
be acceptable in your sight, ♦
O Lord, my strength and my redeemer.

Psalm 20

- 1 May the Lord hear you in the day of trouble, ♦
the name of the God of Jacob defend you;
- 2 Send you help from his sanctuary ♦
and strengthen you out of Zion;
- 3 Remember all your offerings ♦
and accept your burnt sacrifice;
- 4 Grant you your heart's desire ♦
and fulfil all your mind.
- 5 May we rejoice in your salvation
and triumph in the name of our God; ♦
may the Lord perform all your petitions.
- 6 Now I know that the Lord will save his anointed; ♦
he will answer him from his holy heaven,
with the mighty strength of his right hand.
- 7 Some put their trust in chariots and some in horses, ♦
but we will call only on the name of the Lord our God.
- 8 They are brought down and fallen, ♦
but we are risen and stand upright.
- 9 O Lord, save the king ♦
and answer us when we call upon you.

- 1 The king shall rejoice in your strength, O Lord; ♦
how greatly shall he rejoice in your salvation!
- 2 You have given him his heart's desire ♦
and have not denied the request of his lips.
- 3 For you come to meet him with blessings of goodness ♦
and set a crown of pure gold upon his head.
- 4 He asked of you life and you gave it him, ♦
length of days, for ever and ever.
- 5 His honour is great because of your salvation; ♦
glory and majesty have you laid upon him.
- 6 You have granted him everlasting felicity ♦
and will make him glad with joy in your presence.
- 7 For the king puts his trust in the Lord; ♦
because of the loving-kindness of the Most High,
he shall not be overthrown.

- 8 Your hand shall mark down all your enemies; ♦
your right hand will find out those who hate you.
- 9 You will make them like a fiery oven
in the time of your wrath; ♦
the Lord will swallow them up in his anger
and the fire will consume them.
- 10 Their fruit you will root out of the land ♦
and their seed from among its inhabitants.
- 11 Because they intend evil against you ♦
and devise wicked schemes
which they cannot perform,
- 12 You will put them to flight ♦
when you aim your bow at their faces.
- 13 Be exalted, O Lord, in your own might; ♦
we will make music and sing of your power.

- 1 My God, my God, why have you forsaken me, ♦
and are so far from my salvation,
from the words of my distress?
- 2 O my God, I cry in the daytime,
but you do not answer; ♦
and by night also, but I find no rest.
- 3 Yet you are the Holy One, ♦
enthroned upon the praises of Israel.
- 4 Our forebears trusted in you; ♦
they trusted, and you delivered them.
- 5 They cried out to you and were delivered; ♦
they put their trust in you and were not confounded.
- 6 But as for me, I am a worm and no man, ♦
scorned by all and despised by the people.
- 7 All who see me laugh me to scorn; ♦
they curl their lips and wag their heads, saying,
- 8 'He trusted in the Lord; let him deliver him; ♦
let him deliver him, if he delights in him.'
- 9 But it is you that took me out of the womb ♦
and laid me safe upon my mother's breast.
- 10 On you was I cast ever since I was born; ♦
you are my God even from my mother's womb.
- 11 Be not far from me, for trouble is near at hand ♦
and there is none to help.
- 12 Mighty oxen come around me; ♦
fat bulls of Bashan close me in on every side.
- 13 They gape upon me with their mouths, ♦
as it were a ramping and a roaring lion.
- 14 I am poured out like water;
all my bones are out of joint; ♦
my heart has become like wax
melting in the depths of my body.
- 15 My mouth is dried up like a potsherd;
my tongue cleaves to my gums; ♦
you have laid me in the dust of death.

- 16 For the hounds are all about me,
the pack of evildoers close in on me; ♦
they pierce my hands and my feet.
- 17 I can count all my bones; ♦
they stand staring and looking upon me.
- 18 They divide my garments among them; ♦
they cast lots for my clothing.
- 19 Be not far from me, O Lord; ♦
you are my strength; hasten to help me.
- 20 Deliver my soul from the sword, ♦
my poor life from the power of the dog.
- 21 Save me from the lion's mouth,
from the horns of wild oxen. ♦
You have answered me!
- 22 I will tell of your name to my people; ♦
in the midst of the congregation will I praise you.
- 23 Praise the Lord, you that fear him; ♦
O seed of Jacob, glorify him;
stand in awe of him, O seed of Israel.
- 24 For he has not despised nor abhorred the suffering of the poor;
neither has he hidden his face from them; ♦
but when they cried to him he heard them.
- 25 From you comes my praise in the great congregation; ♦
I will perform my vows
in the presence of those that fear you.
- 26 The poor shall eat and be satisfied; ♦
those who seek the Lord shall praise him;
their hearts shall live for ever.
- 27 All the ends of the earth
shall remember and turn to the Lord, ♦
and all the families of the nations shall bow before him.
- 28 For the kingdom is the Lord's ♦
and he rules over the nations.

- 29 How can those who sleep in the earth
bow down in worship, ♦
or those who go down to the dust kneel before him?
- 30 He has saved my life for himself;
my descendants shall serve him; ♦
this shall be told of the Lord for generations to come.
- 31 They shall come and make known his salvation,
to a people yet unborn, ♦
declaring that he, the Lord, has done it.

Psalm 23

- 1 The Lord is my shepherd; ♦
therefore can I lack nothing.
- 2 He makes me lie down in green pastures ♦
and leads me beside still waters.
- 3 He shall refresh my soul ♦
and guide me in the paths of righteousness for his name's sake.
- 4 Though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death,
I will fear no evil; ♦
for you are with me;
your rod and your staff, they comfort me.
- 5 You spread a table before me
in the presence of those who trouble me; ♦
you have anointed my head with oil
and my cup shall be full.
- 6 Surely goodness and loving mercy shall follow me
all the days of my life, ♦
and I will dwell in the house of the Lord for ever.

- 1 The earth is the Lord's and all that fills it, ♦
the compass of the world and all who dwell therein.
- 2 For he has founded it upon the seas ♦
and set it firm upon the rivers of the deep.
- 3 'Who shall ascend the hill of the Lord, ♦
or who can rise up in his holy place?'
- 4 'Those who have clean hands and a pure heart, ♦
who have not lifted up their soul to an idol,
nor sworn an oath to a lie;
- 5 'They shall receive a blessing from the Lord, ♦
a just reward from the God of their salvation.'
- 6 Such is the company of those who seek him, ♦
of those who seek your face, O God of Jacob.

- 7 Lift up your heads, O gates;
be lifted up, you everlasting doors; ♦
and the King of glory shall come in.
- 8 'Who is the King of glory?' ♦
'The Lord, strong and mighty,
the Lord who is mighty in battle.'
- 9 Lift up your heads, O gates;
be lifted up, you everlasting doors; ♦
and the King of glory shall come in.
- 10 'Who is this King of glory?' ♦
'The Lord of hosts,
he is the King of glory.'

- 1 To you, O Lord, I lift up my soul;
 O my God, in you I trust; ♦
 let me not be put to shame;
 let not my enemies triumph over me.
- 2 Let none who look to you be put to shame, ♦
 but let the treacherous be shamed and frustrated.
- 3 Make me to know your ways, O Lord, ♦
 and teach me your paths.
- 4 Lead me in your truth and teach me, ♦
 for you are the God of my salvation;
 for you have I hoped all the day long.
- 5 Remember, Lord, your compassion and love, ♦
 for they are from everlasting.
- 6 Remember not the sins of my youth
 or my transgressions, ♦
 but think on me in your goodness, O Lord,
 according to your steadfast love.
- 7 Gracious and upright is the Lord; ♦
 therefore shall he teach sinners in the way.
- 8 He will guide the humble in doing right ♦
 and teach his way to the lowly.
- 9 All the paths of the Lord are mercy and truth ♦
 to those who keep his covenant and his testimonies.
- 10 For your name's sake, O Lord, ♦
 be merciful to my sin, for it is great.
- 11 Who are those who fear the Lord? ♦
 Them will he teach in the way that they should choose.
- 12 Their soul shall dwell at ease ♦
 and their offspring shall inherit the land.
- 13 The hidden purpose of the Lord is for those who fear him ♦
 and he will show them his covenant.
- 14 My eyes are ever looking to the Lord, ♦
 for he shall pluck my feet out of the net.
- 15 Turn to me and be gracious to me, ♦
 for I am alone and brought very low.

- 16 The sorrows of my heart have increased; ♦
O bring me out of my distress.
- 17 Look upon my adversity and misery ♦
and forgive me all my sin.
- 18 Look upon my enemies, for they are many ♦
and they bear a violent hatred against me.
- 19 O keep my soul and deliver me; ♦
let me not be put to shame, for I have put my trust in you.
- 20 Let integrity and uprightness preserve me, ♦
for my hope has been in you.
- 21 Deliver Israel, O God, ♦
out of all his troubles.

Psalm 26

- 1 Give judgement for me, O Lord,
for I have walked with integrity; ♦
I have trusted in the Lord and have not faltered.
- 2 Test me, O Lord, and try me; ♦
examine my heart and my mind.
- 3 For your love is before my eyes; ♦
I have walked in your truth.
- 4 I have not joined the company of the false, ♦
nor consorted with the deceitful.
- 5 I hate the gathering of evildoers ♦
and I will not sit down with the wicked.
- 6 I will wash my hands in innocence, O Lord, ♦
that I may go about your altar,
- 7 To make heard the voice of thanksgiving ♦
and tell of all your wonderful deeds.
- 8 Lord, I love the house of your habitation ♦
and the place where your glory abides.
- 9 Sweep me not away with sinners, ♦
nor my life with the bloodthirsty,

- 10 Whose hands are full of wicked schemes ♦
and their right hand full of bribes.
- 11 As for me, I will walk with integrity; ♦
redeem me, Lord, and be merciful to me.
- 12 My foot stands firm; ♦
in the great congregation I will bless the Lord.

Psalm 27

- 1 The Lord is my light and my salvation;
whom then shall I fear? ♦
The Lord is the strength of my life;
of whom then shall I be afraid?
- 2 When the wicked, even my enemies and my foes,
came upon me to eat up my flesh, ♦
they stumbled and fell.
- 3 Though a host encamp against me,
my heart shall not be afraid, ♦
and though there rise up war against me,
yet will I put my trust in him.
- 4 One thing have I asked of the Lord
and that alone I seek: ♦
that I may dwell in the house of the Lord
all the days of my life,
- 5 To behold the fair beauty of the Lord ♦
and to seek his will in his temple.
- 6 For in the day of trouble
he shall hide me in his shelter; ♦
in the secret place of his dwelling shall he hide me
and set me high upon a rock.
- 7 And now shall he lift up my head ♦
above my enemies round about me;
- 8 Therefore will I offer in his dwelling an oblation
with great gladness; ♦
I will sing and make music to the Lord.

- 9 Hear my voice, O Lord, when I call; ♦
have mercy upon me and answer me.
- 10 My heart tells of your word, 'Seek my face.' ♦
Your face, Lord, will I seek.
- 11 Hide not your face from me, ♦
nor cast your servant away in displeasure.
- 12 You have been my helper; ♦
leave me not, neither forsake me, O God of my salvation.
- 13 Though my father and my mother forsake me, ♦
the Lord will take me up.
- 14 Teach me your way, O Lord; ♦
lead me on a level path,
because of those who lie in wait for me.
- 15 Deliver me not into the will of my adversaries, ♦
for false witnesses have risen up against me,
and those who breathe out violence.
- 16 I believe that I shall see the goodness of the Lord ♦
in the land of the living.
- 17 Wait for the Lord;
be strong and he shall comfort your heart; ♦
wait patiently for the Lord.

Psalm 28

- 1 To you I call, O Lord my rock;
be not deaf to my cry, ♦
lest, if you do not hear me,
I become like those who go down to the Pit.
- 2 Hear the voice of my prayer when I cry out to you, ♦
when I lift up my hands to your holy of holies.
- 3 Do not snatch me away with the wicked,
with the evildoers, ♦
who speak peaceably with their neighbours,
while malice is in their hearts.
- 4 Repay them according to their deeds ♦
and according to the wickedness of their devices.

- 5 Reward them according to the work of their hands ♦
and pay them their just deserts.
- 6 They take no heed of the Lord's doings,
nor of the works of his hands; ♦
therefore shall he break them down
and not build them up.
- 7 Blessed be the Lord, ♦
for he has heard the voice of my prayer.
- 8 The Lord is my strength and my shield; ♦
my heart has trusted in him and I am helped;
- 9 Therefore my heart dances for joy ♦
and in my song will I praise him.
- 10 The Lord is the strength of his people, ♦
a safe refuge for his anointed.
- 11 Save your people and bless your inheritance; ♦
shepherd them and carry them for ever.

Psalm 29

- 1 Ascribe to the Lord, you powers of heaven, ♦
ascribe to the Lord glory and strength.
- 2 Ascribe to the Lord the honour due to his name; ♦
worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness.
- 3 The voice of the Lord is upon the waters;
the God of glory thunders; ♦
the Lord is upon the mighty waters.
- 4 The voice of the Lord is mighty in operation; ♦
the voice of the Lord is a glorious voice.
- 5 The voice of the Lord breaks the cedar trees; ♦
the Lord breaks the cedars of Lebanon;
- 6 He makes Lebanon skip like a calf ♦
and Sirion like a young wild ox.
- 7 The voice of the Lord splits the flash of lightning;
the voice of the Lord shakes the wilderness; ♦
the Lord shakes the wilderness of Kadesh.

- 8 The voice of the Lord makes the oak trees writhe
and strips the forests bare; ♦
in his temple all cry, 'Glory!'
- 9 The Lord sits enthroned above the water flood; ♦
the Lord sits enthroned as king for evermore.
- 10 The Lord shall give strength to his people; ♦
the Lord shall give his people the blessing of peace.

Psalm 30

- 1 I will exalt you, O Lord,
because you have raised me up ♦
and have not let my foes triumph over me.
- 2 O Lord my God, I cried out to you ♦
and you have healed me.
- 3 You brought me up, O Lord, from the dead; ♦
you restored me to life from among those that go down to the Pit.
- 4 Sing to the Lord, you servants of his; ♦
give thanks to his holy name.
- 5 For his wrath endures but the twinkling of an eye,
his favour for a lifetime. ♦
Heaviness may endure for a night,
but joy comes in the morning.
- 6 In my prosperity I said,
'I shall never be moved. ♦
You, Lord, of your goodness,
have made my hill so strong.'
- 7 Then you hid your face from me ♦
and I was utterly dismayed.
- 8 To you, O Lord, I cried; ♦
to the Lord I made my supplication:
- 9 'What profit is there in my blood,
if I go down to the Pit? ♦
Will the dust praise you or declare your faithfulness?
- 10 'Hear, O Lord, and have mercy upon me; ♦
O Lord, be my helper.'

- 11 You have turned my mourning into dancing; ♦
you have put off my sackcloth and girded me with gladness;
- 12 Therefore my heart sings to you without ceasing; ♦
O Lord my God, I will give you thanks for ever.

Psalm 31

- 1 In you, O Lord, have I taken refuge;
let me never be put to shame; ♦
deliver me in your righteousness.
- 2 Incline your ear to me; ♦
make haste to deliver me.
- 3 Be my strong rock, a fortress to save me,
for you are my rock and my stronghold; ♦
guide me, and lead me for your name's sake.
- 4 Take me out of the net
that they have laid secretly for me, ♦
for you are my strength.
- 5 Into your hands I commend my spirit, ♦
for you have redeemed me, O Lord God of truth.
- 6 I hate those who cling to worthless idols; ♦
I put my trust in the Lord.
- 7 I will be glad and rejoice in your mercy, ♦
for you have seen my affliction
and known my soul in adversity.
- 8 You have not shut me up in the hand of the enemy; ♦
you have set my feet in an open place.
- 9 Have mercy on me, Lord, for I am in trouble; ♦
my eye is consumed with sorrow,
my soul and my body also.
- 10 For my life is wasted with grief,
and my years with sighing; ♦
my strength fails me because of my affliction,
and my bones are consumed.

- 11 I have become a reproach to all my enemies
and even to my neighbours,
an object of dread to my acquaintances; ♦
when they see me in the street they flee from me.
- 12 I am forgotten like one that is dead, out of mind; ♦
I have become like a broken vessel.
- 13 For I have heard the whispering of the crowd;
fear is on every side; ♦
they scheme together against me,
and plot to take my life.
- 14 But my trust is in you, O Lord. ♦
I have said, 'You are my God.
- 15 'My times are in your hand; ♦
deliver me from the hand of my enemies,
and from those who persecute me.
- 16 'Make your face to shine upon your servant, ♦
and save me for your mercy's sake.'
- 17 Lord, let me not be confounded
for I have called upon you; ♦
but let the wicked be put to shame;
let them be silent in the grave.
- 18 Let the lying lips be put to silence ♦
that speak against the righteous
with arrogance, disdain and contempt.
- 19 How abundant is your goodness, O Lord,
which you have laid up for those who fear you; ♦
which you have prepared in the sight of all
for those who put their trust in you.
- 20 You hide them in the shelter of your presence
from those who slander them; ♦
you keep them safe in your refuge from the strife of tongues.
- 21 Blessed be the Lord! ♦
For he has shown me his steadfast love
when I was as a city besieged.

- 22 I had said in my alarm,
 'I have been cut off from the sight of your eyes.' ♦
Nevertheless, you heard the voice of my prayer
 when I cried out to you.
- 23 Love the Lord, all you his servants; ♦
for the Lord protects the faithful,
 but repays to the full the proud.
- 24 Be strong and let your heart take courage, ♦
all you who wait in hope for the Lord.

Psalm 32

- 1 Happy the one whose transgression is forgiven, ♦
and whose sin is covered.
- 2 Happy the one to whom the Lord imputes no guilt, ♦
and in whose spirit there is no guile.
- 3 For I held my tongue; ♦
my bones wasted away
 through my groaning all the day long.
- 4 Your hand was heavy upon me day and night; ♦
my moisture was dried up like the drought in summer.
- 5 Then I acknowledged my sin to you ♦
and my iniquity I did not hide.
- 6 I said, 'I will confess my transgressions to the Lord,' ♦
and you forgave the guilt of my sin.
- 7 Therefore let all the faithful make their prayers to you
 in time of trouble; ♦
in the great water flood, it shall not reach them.
- 8 You are a place for me to hide in;
 you preserve me from trouble; ♦
you surround me with songs of deliverance.
- 9 'I will instruct you and teach you
 in the way that you should go; ♦
I will guide you with my eye.

- 10 'Be not like horse and mule which have no understanding; ♦
whose mouths must be held with bit and bridle,
or else they will not stay near you.'
- 11 Great tribulations remain for the wicked, ♦
but mercy embraces those who trust in the Lord.
- 12 Be glad, you righteous, and rejoice in the Lord; ♦
shout for joy, all who are true of heart.

Psalm 33

- 1 Rejoice in the Lord, O you righteous, ♦
for it is good for the just to sing praises.
- 2 Praise the Lord with the lyre; ♦
on the ten-stringed harp sing his praise.
- 3 Sing for him a new song; ♦
play skilfully, with shouts of praise.
- 4 For the word of the Lord is true ♦
and all his works are sure.
- 5 He loves righteousness and justice; ♦
the earth is full of the loving-kindness of the Lord.
- 6 By the word of the Lord were the heavens made ♦
and all their host by the breath of his mouth.
- 7 He gathers up the waters of the sea as in a waterskin ♦
and lays up the deep in his treasury.
- 8 Let all the earth fear the Lord; ♦
stand in awe of him, all who dwell in the world.
- 9 For he spoke, and it was done; ♦
he commanded, and it stood fast.
- 10 The Lord brings the counsel of the nations to naught; ♦
he frustrates the designs of the peoples.
- 11 But the counsel of the Lord shall endure for ever ♦
and the designs of his heart from generation to generation.
- 12 Happy the nation whose God is the Lord ♦
and the people he has chosen for his own.

- 13 The Lord looks down from heaven ♦
and beholds all the children of earth.
- 14 From where he sits enthroned he turns his gaze ♦
on all who dwell on the earth.
- 15 He fashions all the hearts of them ♦
and understands all their works.
- 16 No king is saved by the might of his host; ♦
no warrior delivered by his great strength.
- 17 A horse is a vain hope for deliverance; ♦
for all its strength it cannot save.
- 18 Behold, the eye of the Lord
is upon those who fear him, ♦
on those who wait in hope for his steadfast love,
- 19 To deliver their soul from death ♦
and to feed them in time of famine.
- 20 Our soul waits longingly for the Lord; ♦
he is our help and our shield.
- 21 Indeed, our heart rejoices in him; ♦
in his holy name have we put our trust.
- 22 Let your loving-kindness, O Lord, be upon us, ♦
as we have set our hope on you.

Psalm 34

- 1 I will bless the Lord at all times; ♦
his praise shall ever be in my mouth.
- 2 My soul shall glory in the Lord; ♦
let the humble hear and be glad.
- 3 O magnify the Lord with me; ♦
let us exalt his name together.
- 4 I sought the Lord and he answered me ♦
and delivered me from all my fears.
- 5 Look upon him and be radiant ♦
and your faces shall not be ashamed.

- 6 This poor soul cried, and the Lord heard me ♦
and saved me from all my troubles.
- 7 The angel of the Lord encamps around those who fear him ♦
and delivers them.
- 8 O taste and see that the Lord is gracious; ♦
blessed is the one who trusts in him.
- 9 Fear the Lord, all you his holy ones, ♦
for those who fear him lack nothing.
- 10 Lions may lack and suffer hunger, ♦
but those who seek the Lord
lack nothing that is good.
- 11 Come, my children, and listen to me; ♦
I will teach you the fear of the Lord.
- 12 Who is there who delights in life ♦
and longs for days to enjoy good things?
- 13 Keep your tongue from evil ♦
and your lips from lying words.
- 14 Turn from evil and do good; ♦
seek peace and pursue it.
- 15 The eyes of the Lord are upon the righteous ♦
and his ears are open to their cry.
- 16 The face of the Lord is against those who do evil, ♦
to root out the remembrance of them from the earth.
- 17 The righteous cry and the Lord hears them ♦
and delivers them out of all their troubles.
- 18 The Lord is near to the brokenhearted ♦
and will save those who are crushed in spirit.
- 19 Many are the troubles of the righteous; ♦
from them all will the Lord deliver them.
- 20 He keeps all their bones, ♦
so that not one of them is broken.
- 21 But evil shall slay the wicked ♦
and those who hate the righteous will be condemned.
- 22 The Lord ransoms the life of his servants ♦
and will condemn none who seek refuge in him.

- 1 Contend, O Lord, with those that contend with me; ♦
fight against those that fight against me.
- 2 Take up shield and buckler ♦
and rise up to help me.
- 3 Draw the spear and bar the way
against those who pursue me; ♦
say to my soul, 'I am your salvation.'
- 4 Let those who seek after my life be shamed and disgraced; ♦
let those who plot my ruin fall back and be put to confusion.
- 5 Let them be as chaff before the wind, ♦
with the angel of the Lord thrusting them down.
- 6 Let their way be dark and slippery, ♦
with the angel of the Lord pursuing them.
- 7 For they have secretly spread a net for me without a cause; ♦
without any cause they have dug a pit for my soul.
- 8 Let ruin come upon them unawares; ♦
let them be caught in the net they laid;
let them fall in it to their destruction.
- 9 Then will my soul be joyful in the Lord ♦
and glory in his salvation.
- 10 My very bones will say, 'Lord, who is like you? ♦
You deliver the poor from those that are too strong for them,
the poor and needy from those who would despoil them.'
- 11 False witnesses rose up against me; ♦
they charged me with things I knew not.
- 12 They rewarded me evil for good, ♦
to the desolation of my soul.
- 13 But as for me, when they were sick I put on sackcloth ♦
and humbled myself with fasting;
- 14 When my prayer returned empty to my bosom, ♦
it was as though I grieved for my friend or brother;
- 15 I behaved as one who mourns for his mother, ♦
bowed down and brought very low.

- 16 But when I stumbled, they gathered in delight;
they gathered together against me; ♦
as if they were strangers I did not know
they tore at me without ceasing.
- 17 When I fell they mocked me; ♦
they gnashed at me with their teeth.
- 18 O Lord, how long will you look on? ♦
Rescue my soul from their ravages,
and my poor life from the young lions.
- 19 I will give you thanks in the great congregation; ♦
I will praise you in the mighty throng.
- 20 Do not let my treacherous foes rejoice over me, ♦
or those who hate me without a cause
mock me with their glances.
- 21 For they do not speak of peace, ♦
but invent deceitful schemes against those that are quiet in the land.
- 22 They opened wide their mouths and derided me, saying ♦
'We have seen it with our very eyes.'
- 23 This you have seen, O Lord; do not keep silent; ♦
go not far from me, O Lord.
- 24 Awake, arise, to my cause, ♦
to my defence, my God and my Lord!
- 25 Give me justice, O Lord my God,
according to your righteousness; ♦
let them not triumph over me.
- 26 Let them not say to themselves,
'Our heart's desire!' ♦
Let them not say, 'We have swallowed him up.'
- 27 Let all who rejoice at my trouble be put to shame and confusion; ♦
let those who boast against me
be clothed with shame and dishonour.
- 28 Let those who favour my cause rejoice and be glad; ♦
let them say always,
'Great is the Lord, who delights in his servant's well-being.'
- 29 So shall my tongue be talking of your righteousness ♦
and of your praise all the day long.

- 1 Sin whispers to the wicked, in the depths of their heart; ♦
there is no fear of God before their eyes.
- 2 They flatter themselves in their own eyes ♦
that their abominable sin will not be found out.
- 3 The words of their mouth are unrighteous and full of deceit; ♦
they have ceased to act wisely and to do good.
- 4 They think out mischief upon their beds
and have set themselves in no good way; ♦
nor do they abhor that which is evil.
- 5 Your love, O Lord, reaches to the heavens ♦
and your faithfulness to the clouds.
- 6 Your righteousness stands like the strong mountains,
your justice like the great deep; ♦
you, Lord, shall save both man and beast.
- 7 How precious is your loving mercy, O God! ♦
All mortal flesh shall take refuge
under the shadow of your wings.
- 8 They shall be satisfied with the abundance of your house; ♦
they shall drink from the river of your delights.
- 9 For with you is the well of life ♦
and in your light shall we see light.
- 10 O continue your loving-kindness to those who know you ♦
and your righteousness to those who are true of heart.
- 11 Let not the foot of pride come against me, ♦
nor the hand of the ungodly thrust me away.
- 12 There are they fallen, all who work wickedness. ♦
They are cast down and shall not be able to stand.

- 1 Fret not because of evildoers; ♦
be not jealous of those who do wrong.
- 2 For they shall soon wither like grass ♦
and like the green herb fade away.
- 3 Trust in the Lord and be doing good; ♦
dwell in the land and be nourished with truth.
- 4 Let your delight be in the Lord ♦
and he will give you your heart's desire.
- 5 Commit your way to the Lord and put your trust in him, ♦
and he will bring it to pass.
- 6 He will make your righteousness as clear as the light ♦
and your just dealing as the noonday.
- 7 Be still before the Lord and wait for him; ♦
do not fret over those that prosper
as they follow their evil schemes.
- 8 Refrain from anger and abandon wrath; ♦
do not fret, lest you be moved to do evil.
- 9 For evildoers shall be cut off, ♦
but those who wait upon the Lord shall possess the land.
- 10 Yet a little while and the wicked shall be no more; ♦
you will search for their place and find them gone.
- 11 But the lowly shall possess the land ♦
and shall delight in abundance of peace.
- 12 The wicked plot against the righteous ♦
and gnash at them with their teeth.
- 13 The Lord shall laugh at the wicked, ♦
for he sees that their day is coming.
- 14 The wicked draw their sword and bend their bow
to strike down the poor and needy, ♦
to slaughter those who walk in truth.
- 15 Their sword shall go through their own heart ♦
and their bows shall be broken.
- 16 The little that the righteous have ♦
is better than great riches of the wicked.

- 17 For the arms of the wicked shall be broken, ♦
but the Lord upholds the righteous.
- 18 The Lord knows the days of the godly, ♦
and their inheritance shall stand for ever.
- 19 They shall not be put to shame in the perilous time, ♦
and in days of famine they shall have enough.
- 20 But the wicked shall perish;
like the glory of the meadows
the enemies of the Lord shall vanish; ♦
they shall vanish like smoke.
- 21 The wicked borrow and do not repay, ♦
but the righteous are generous in giving.
- 22 For those who are blest by God shall possess the land, ♦
but those who are cursed by him shall be rooted out.
- 23 When your steps are guided by the Lord ♦
and you delight in his way,
- 24 Though you stumble, you shall not fall headlong, ♦
for the Lord holds you fast by the hand.
- 25 I have been young and now am old, ♦
yet never have I seen the righteous forsaken,
or their children begging their bread.
- 26 All the day long they are generous in lending, ♦
and their children also shall be blest.
- 27 Depart from evil and do good ♦
and you shall abide for ever.
- 28 For the Lord loves the thing that is right ♦
and will not forsake his faithful ones.
- 29 The unjust shall be destroyed for ever, ♦
and the offspring of the wicked shall be rooted out.
- 30 The righteous shall possess the land ♦
and dwell in it for ever.
- 31 The mouth of the righteous utters wisdom, ♦
and their tongue speaks the thing that is right.
- 32 The law of their God is in their heart ♦
and their footsteps shall not slide.

- 33 The wicked spy on the righteous ♦
and seek occasion to slay them.
- 34 The Lord will not leave them in their hand, ♦
nor let them be condemned when they are judged.
- 35 Wait upon the Lord and keep his way; ♦
he will raise you up to possess the land,
and when the wicked are uprooted, you shall see it.
- 36 I myself have seen the wicked in great power ♦
and flourishing like a tree in full leaf.
- 37 I went by and lo, they were gone; ♦
I sought them, but they could nowhere be found.
- 38 Keep innocence and heed the thing that is right, ♦
for that will bring you peace at the last.
- 39 But the sinners shall perish together, ♦
and the posterity of the wicked shall be rooted out.
- 40 The salvation of the righteous comes from the Lord; ♦
he is their stronghold in the time of trouble.
- 41 The Lord shall stand by them and deliver them; ♦
he shall deliver them from the wicked and shall save them,
because they have put their trust in him.

Psalm 38

- 1 Rebuke me not, O Lord, in your anger, ♦
neither chasten me in your heavy displeasure.
- 2 For your arrows have stuck fast in me ♦
and your hand presses hard upon me.
- 3 There is no health in my flesh
because of your indignation; ♦
there is no peace in my bones because of my sin.
- 4 For my iniquities have gone over my head; ♦
their weight is a burden too heavy to bear.
- 5 My wounds stink and fester ♦
because of my foolishness.
- 6 I am utterly bowed down and brought very low; ♦
I go about mourning all the day long.

- 7 My loins are filled with searing pain; ♦
there is no health in my flesh.
- 8 I am feeble and utterly crushed; ♦
I roar aloud because of the disquiet of my heart.
- 9 O Lord, you know all my desires ♦
and my sighing is not hidden from you.
- 10 My heart is pounding, my strength has failed me; ♦
the light of my eyes is gone from me.
- 11 My friends and companions stand apart from my affliction; ♦
my neighbours stand afar off.
- 12 Those who seek after my life lay snares for me; ♦
and those who would harm me whisper evil
and mutter slander all the day long.
- 13 But I am like one who is deaf and hears not, ♦
like one that is dumb, who does not open his mouth.
- 14 I have become like one who does not hear ♦
and from whose mouth comes no retort.
- 15 For in you, Lord, have I put my trust; ♦
you will answer me, O Lord my God.
- 16 For I said, 'Let them not triumph over me, ♦
those who exult over me when my foot slips.'
- 17 Truly, I am on the verge of falling ♦
and my pain is ever with me.
- 18 I will confess my iniquity ♦
and be sorry for my sin.
- 19 Those that are my enemies without any cause are mighty, ♦
and those who hate me wrongfully are many in number.
- 20 Those who repay evil for good are against me, ♦
because the good is what I seek.
- 21 Forsake me not, O Lord; ♦
be not far from me, O my God.
- 22 Make haste to help me, ♦
O Lord of my salvation.

- 1 I said, 'I will keep watch over my ways, ♦
so that I offend not with my tongue.
- 2 'I will guard my mouth with a muzzle, ♦
while the wicked are in my sight.'
- 3 So I held my tongue and said nothing; ♦
I kept silent but to no avail.
- 4 My distress increased, my heart grew hot within me; ♦
while I mused, the fire was kindled
and I spoke out with my tongue:
- 5 'Lord, let me know my end and the number of my days, ♦
that I may know how short my time is.
- 6 'You have made my days but a handsbreadth,
and my lifetime is as nothing in your sight; ♦
truly, even those who stand upright are but a breath.
- 7 'We walk about like a shadow
and in vain we are in turmoil; ♦
we heap up riches and cannot tell who will gather them.
- 8 'And now, what is my hope? ♦
Truly my hope is even in you.
- 9 'Deliver me from all my transgressions ♦
and do not make me the taunt of the fool.'
- 10 I fell silent and did not open my mouth, ♦
for surely it was your doing.
- 11 Take away your plague from me; ♦
I am consumed by the blows of your hand.
- 12 With rebukes for sin you punish us;
like a moth you consume our beauty; ♦
truly, everyone is but a breath.
- 13 Hear my prayer, O Lord, and give ear to my cry; ♦
hold not your peace at my tears.
- 14 For I am but a stranger with you, ♦
a wayfarer, as all my forebears were.
- 15 Turn your gaze from me, that I may be glad again, ♦
before I go my way and am no more.

- 1 I waited patiently for the Lord; ♦
he inclined to me and heard my cry.
- 2 He brought me out of the roaring pit,
out of the mire and clay; ♦
he set my feet upon a rock and made my footing sure.
- 3 He has put a new song in my mouth,
a song of praise to our God; ♦
many shall see and fear
and put their trust in the Lord.
- 4 Blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord, ♦
who does not turn to the proud that follow a lie.
- 5 Great are the wonders you have done, O Lord my God.
How great your designs for us! ♦
There is none that can be compared with you.
- 6 If I were to proclaim them and tell of them ♦
they would be more than I am able to express.
- 7 Sacrifice and offering you do not desire ♦
but my ears you have opened;
- 8 Burnt offering and sacrifice for sin you have not required; ♦
then said I: 'Lo, I come.
- 9 'In the scroll of the book it is written of me
that I should do your will, O my God; ♦
I delight to do it: your law is within my heart.'
- 10 I have declared your righteousness in the great congregation; ♦
behold, I did not restrain my lips,
and that, O Lord, you know.
- 11 Your righteousness I have not hidden in my heart;
I have spoken of your faithfulness and your salvation; ♦
I have not concealed your loving-kindness and truth
from the great congregation.
- 12 Do not withhold your compassion from me, O Lord; ♦
let your love and your faithfulness always preserve me,

- 13 For innumerable troubles have come about me;
my sins have overtaken me so that I cannot look up; ♦
they are more in number than the hairs of my head,
and my heart fails me.
- 14 Be pleased, O Lord, to deliver me; ♦
O Lord, make haste to help me.
- 15 Let them be ashamed and altogether dismayed
who seek after my life to destroy it; ♦
let them be driven back and put to shame
who wish me evil.
- 16 Let those who heap insults upon me ♦
be desolate because of their shame.
- 17 Let all who seek you rejoice in you and be glad; ♦
let those who love your salvation say always,
'The Lord is great.'
- 18 Though I am poor and needy, ♦
the Lord cares for me.
- 19 You are my helper and my deliverer; ♦
O my God, make no delay.

Psalm 41

- 1 Blessed are those who consider the poor and needy; ♦
the Lord will deliver them in the time of trouble.
- 2 The Lord preserves them and restores their life,
that they may be happy in the land; ♦
he will not hand them over to the will of their enemies.
- 3 The Lord sustains them on their sickbed; ♦
their sickness, Lord, you will remove.
- 4 And so I said, 'Lord, be merciful to me; ♦
heal me, for I have sinned against you.'
- 5 My enemies speak evil about me, ♦
asking when I shall die and my name perish.

- 6 If they come to see me, they utter empty words; ♦
their heart gathers mischief;
when they go out, they tell it abroad.
- 7 All my enemies whisper together against me, ♦
against me they devise evil,
- 8 Saying that a deadly thing has laid hold on me, ♦
and that I will not rise again from where I lie.
- 9 Even my bosom friend, whom I trusted,
who ate of my bread, ♦
has lifted up his heel against me.
- 10 But you, O Lord, be merciful to me ♦
and raise me up, that I may reward them.
- 11 By this I know that you favour me, ♦
that my enemy does not triumph over me.
- 12 Because of my integrity you uphold me ♦
and will set me before your face for ever.
- 13 Blessed be the Lord God of Israel, ♦
from everlasting to everlasting. Amen and Amen.

Psalm 42

- 1 As the deer longs for the water brooks, ♦
so longs my soul for you, O God.
- 2 My soul is athirst for God, even for the living God; ♦
when shall I come before the presence of God?
- 3 My tears have been my bread day and night, ♦
while all day long they say to me, 'Where is now your God?'
- 4 Now when I think on these things, I pour out my soul: ♦
how I went with the multitude
and led the procession to the house of God,
- 5 With the voice of praise and thanksgiving, ♦
among those who kept holy day.
- 6 Why are you so full of heaviness, O my soul, ♦
and why are you so disquieted within me?

- 7 O put your trust in God; ♦
for I will yet give him thanks,
who is the help of my countenance, and my God.
- 8 My soul is heavy within me; ♦
therefore I will remember you from the land of Jordan,
and from Hermon and the hill of Mizar.
- 9 Deep calls to deep in the thunder of your waterfalls; ♦
all your breakers and waves have gone over me.
- 10 The Lord will grant his loving-kindness in the daytime; ♦
through the night his song will be with me,
a prayer to the God of my life.
- 11 I say to God my rock,
'Why have you forgotten me, ♦
and why go I so heavily, while the enemy oppresses me?'
- 12 As they crush my bones, my enemies mock me; ♦
while all day long they say to me, 'Where is now your God?'
- 13 Why are you so full of heaviness, O my soul, ♦
and why are you so disquieted within me?
- 14 O put your trust in God; ♦
for I will yet give him thanks,
who is the help of my countenance, and my God.

Psalm 43

- 1 Give judgement for me, O God,
and defend my cause against an ungodly people; ♦
deliver me from the deceitful and the wicked.
- 2 For you are the God of my refuge;
why have you cast me from you, ♦
and why go I so heavily, while the enemy oppresses me?
- 3 O send out your light and your truth, that they may lead me, ♦
and bring me to your holy hill and to your dwelling,
- 4 That I may go to the altar of God,
to the God of my joy and gladness; ♦
and on the lyre I will give thanks to you, O God my God.

- 5 Why are you so full of heaviness, O my soul, ♦
and why are you so disquieted within me?
- 6 O put your trust in God; ♦
for I will yet give him thanks,
who is the help of my countenance, and my God.

Psalm 44

- 1 We have heard with our ears, O God, our forebears have told us, ♦
all that you did in their days, in time of old;
- 2 How with your hand you drove out nations and planted us in, ♦
and broke the power of peoples and set us free.
- 3 For not by their own sword did our ancestors take the land ♦
nor did their own arm save them,
- 4 But your right hand, your arm, and the light of your countenance, ♦
because you were gracious to them.
- 5 You are my King and my God, ♦
who commanded salvation for Jacob.
- 6 Through you we drove back our adversaries; ♦
through your name we trod down our foes.
- 7 For I did not trust in my bow; ♦
it was not my own sword that saved me;
- 8 It was you that saved us from our enemies ♦
and put our adversaries to shame.
- 9 We gloried in God all the day long, ♦
and were ever praising your name.
- 10 But now you have rejected us and brought us to shame, ♦
and go not out with our armies.
- 11 You have made us turn our backs on our enemies, ♦
and our enemies have despoiled us.
- 12 You have made us like sheep to be slaughtered, ♦
and have scattered us among the nations.
- 13 You have sold your people for a pittance ♦
and made no profit on their sale.

- 14 You have made us the taunt of our neighbours, ♦
the scorn and derision of those that are round about us.
- 15 You have made us a byword among the nations; ♦
among the peoples they wag their heads.
- 16 My confusion is daily before me, ♦
and shame has covered my face,
- 17 At the taunts of the slanderer and reviler, ♦
at the sight of the enemy and avenger.
- 18 All this has come upon us,
though we have not forgotten you ♦
and have not played false to your covenant.
- 19 Our hearts have not turned back, ♦
nor our steps gone out of your way,
- 20 Yet you have crushed us in the haunt of jackals, ♦
and covered us with the shadow of death.
- 21 If we have forgotten the name of our God, ♦
or stretched out our hands to any strange god,
- 22 Will not God search it out? ♦
For he knows the secrets of the heart.
- 23 But for your sake are we killed all the day long, ♦
and are counted as sheep for the slaughter.
- 24 Rise up! Why sleep, O Lord? ♦
Awake, and do not reject us for ever.
- 25 Why do you hide your face ♦
and forget our grief and oppression?
- 26 Our soul is bowed down to the dust; ♦
our belly cleaves to the earth.
- 27 Rise up, O Lord, to help us ♦
and redeem us for the sake of your steadfast love.

- 1 My heart is astir with gracious words; ♦
as I make my song for the king,
my tongue is the pen of a ready writer.
- 2 You are the fairest of men; ♦
full of grace are your lips,
for God has blest you for ever.
- 3 Gird your sword upon your thigh, O mighty one; ♦
gird on your majesty and glory.
- 4 Ride on and prosper in the cause of truth ♦
and for the sake of humility and righteousness.
- 5 Your right hand will teach you terrible things; ♦
your arrows will be sharp in the heart of the king's enemies,
so that peoples fall beneath you.
- 6 Your throne is God's throne, for ever; ♦
the sceptre of your kingdom is the sceptre of righteousness.
- 7 You love righteousness and hate iniquity; ♦
therefore God, your God, has anointed you
with the oil of gladness above your fellows.
- 8 All your garments are fragrant with myrrh, aloes and cassia; ♦
from ivory palaces the music of strings makes you glad.
- 9 Kings' daughters are among your honourable women; ♦
at your right hand stands the queen in gold of Ophir.
- 10 Hear, O daughter; consider and incline your ear; ♦
forget your own people and your father's house.
- 11 So shall the king have pleasure in your beauty; ♦
he is your lord, so do him honour.
- 12 The people of Tyre shall bring you gifts; ♦
the richest of the people shall seek your favour.
- 13 The king's daughter is all glorious within; ♦
her clothing is embroidered cloth of gold.
- 14 She shall be brought to the king in raiment of needlework; ♦
after her the virgins that are her companions.

- 15 With joy and gladness shall they be brought ♦
and enter into the palace of the king.
- 16 'Instead of your fathers you shall have sons, ♦
whom you shall make princes over all the land.
- 17 'I will make your name to be remembered through all generations; ♦
therefore shall the peoples praise you for ever and ever.'

Psalm 46

- 1 God is our refuge and strength, ♦
a very present help in trouble;
- 2 Therefore we will not fear, though the earth be moved, ♦
and though the mountains tremble in the heart of the sea;
- 3 Though the waters rage and swell, ♦
and though the mountains quake at the towering seas.
- 4 There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, ♦
the holy place of the dwelling of the Most High.
- 5 God is in the midst of her;
therefore shall she not be removed; ♦
God shall help her at the break of day.
- 6 The nations are in uproar and the kingdoms are shaken, ♦
but God utters his voice and the earth shall melt away.
- 7 *The Lord of hosts is with us; ♦
the God of Jacob is our stronghold.*
- 8 Come and behold the works of the Lord, ♦
what destruction he has wrought upon the earth.
- 9 He makes wars to cease in all the world; ♦
he shatters the bow and snaps the spear
and burns the chariots in the fire.
- 10 'Be still, and know that I am God; ♦
I will be exalted among the nations;
I will be exalted in the earth.'
- 11 *The Lord of hosts is with us; ♦
the God of Jacob is our stronghold.*

Psalm 47

- 1 Clap your hands together, all you peoples; ♦
O sing to God with shouts of joy.
- 2 For the Lord Most High is to be feared; ♦
he is the great King over all the earth.
- 3 He subdued the peoples under us ♦
and the nations under our feet.
- 4 He has chosen our heritage for us, ♦
the pride of Jacob, whom he loves.

- 5 God has gone up with a merry noise, ♦
the Lord with the sound of the trumpet.
- 6 O sing praises to God, sing praises; ♦
sing praises to our King, sing praises.
- 7 For God is the King of all the earth; ♦
sing praises with all your skill.
- 8 God reigns over the nations; ♦
God has taken his seat upon his holy throne.
- 9 The nobles of the peoples are gathered together ♦
with the people of the God of Abraham.
- 10 For the powers of the earth belong to God ♦
and he is very highly exalted.

Psalm 48

- 1 Great is the Lord and highly to be praised, ♦
in the city of our God.
- 2 His holy mountain is fair and lifted high, ♦
the joy of all the earth.
- 3 On Mount Zion, the divine dwelling place, ♦
stands the city of the great king.
- 4 In her palaces God has shown himself ♦
to be a sure refuge.

- 5 For behold, the kings of the earth assembled ♦
and swept forward together.

- 6 They saw, and were dumbfounded; ♦
dismayed, they fled in terror.
- 7 Trembling seized them there;
they writhed like a woman in labour, ♦
as when the east wind shatters the ships of Tarshish.
- 8 As we had heard, so have we seen
in the city of the Lord of hosts, the city of our God: ♦
God has established her for ever.
- 9 We have waited on your loving-kindness, O God, ♦
in the midst of your temple.
- 10 As with your name, O God,
so your praise reaches to the ends of the earth; ♦
your right hand is full of justice.
- 11 Let Mount Zion rejoice and the daughters of Judah be glad, ♦
because of your judgements, O Lord.
- 12 Walk about Zion and go round about her;
count all her towers; ♦
consider well her bulwarks; pass through her citadels,
- 13 That you may tell those who come after
that such is our God for ever and ever. ♦
It is he that shall be our guide for evermore.

Psalm 49

- 1 Hear this, all you peoples; ♦
listen, all you that dwell in the world,
- 2 You of low or high degree, ♦
both rich and poor together.
- 3 My mouth shall speak of wisdom ♦
and my heart shall meditate on understanding.
- 4 I will incline my ear to a parable; ♦
I will unfold my riddle with the lyre.
- 5 Why should I fear in evil days, ♦
when the malice of my foes surrounds me,

- 6 Such as trust in their goods ♦
and glory in the abundance of their riches?
- 7 For no one can indeed ransom another ♦
or pay to God the price of deliverance.
- 8 To ransom a soul is too costly; ♦
there is no price one could pay for it,
- 9 So that they might live for ever, ♦
and never see the grave.
- 10 For we see that the wise die also;
with the foolish and ignorant they perish ♦
and leave their riches to others.
- 11 Their tomb is their home for ever,
their dwelling through all generations, ♦
though they call their lands after their own names.
- 12 Those who have honour, but lack understanding, ♦
are like the beasts that perish.
- 13 Such is the way of those who boast in themselves, ♦
the end of those who delight in their own words.
- 14 Like a flock of sheep they are destined to die;
death is their shepherd; ♦
they go down straight to the Pit.
- 15 Their beauty shall waste away, ♦
and the land of the dead shall be their dwelling.
- 16 But God shall ransom my soul; ♦
from the grasp of death will he take me.
- 17 Be not afraid if some grow rich ♦
and the glory of their house increases,
- 18 For they will carry nothing away when they die, ♦
nor will their glory follow after them.
- 19 Though they count themselves happy while they live ♦
and praise you for your success,
- 20 They shall enter the company of their ancestors ♦
who will nevermore see the light.
- 21 Those who have honour, but lack understanding, ♦
are like the beasts that perish.

- 1 The Lord, the most mighty God, has spoken ♦
and called the world from the rising of the sun to its setting.
- 2 Out of Zion, perfect in beauty, God shines forth; ♦
our God comes and will not keep silence.
- 3 Consuming fire goes out before him ♦
and a mighty tempest stirs about him.
- 4 He calls the heaven above, ♦
and the earth, that he may judge his people:
- 5 'Gather to me my faithful, ♦
who have sealed my covenant with sacrifice.'
- 6 Let the heavens declare his righteousness, ♦
for God himself is judge.

- 7 Hear, O my people, and I will speak: ♦
'I will testify against you, O Israel;
for I am God, your God.
- 8 'I will not reprove you for your sacrifices, ♦
for your burnt offerings are always before me.
- 9 'I will take no bull out of your house, ♦
nor he-goat out of your folds,
- 10 'For all the beasts of the forest are mine, ♦
the cattle upon a thousand hills.
- 11 'I know every bird of the mountains ♦
and the insect of the field is mine.
- 12 'If I were hungry, I would not tell you, ♦
for the whole world is mine and all that fills it.
- 13 'Do you think I eat the flesh of bulls, ♦
or drink the blood of goats?
- 14 'Offer to God a sacrifice of thanksgiving ♦
and fulfil your vows to God Most High.
- 15 'Call upon me in the day of trouble; ♦
I will deliver you and you shall honour me.'

- 16 But to the wicked, says God: ♦
‘Why do you recite my statutes
and take my covenant upon your lips,
- 17 ‘Since you refuse to be disciplined ♦
and have cast my words behind you?
- 18 ‘When you saw a thief, you made friends with him ♦
and you threw in your lot with adulterers.
- 19 ‘You have loosed your lips for evil ♦
and harnessed your tongue to deceit.
- 20 ‘You sit and speak evil of your brother; ♦
you slander your own mother’s son.
- 21 ‘These things have you done, and should I keep silence? ♦
Did you think that I am even such a one as yourself?
- 22 ‘But no, I must reprove you, ♦
and set before your eyes the things that you have done.
- 23 ‘You that forget God, consider this well, ♦
lest I tear you apart and there is none to deliver you.
- 24 ‘Whoever offers me the sacrifice of thanksgiving honours me ♦
and to those who keep my way
will I show the salvation of God.’

Psalm 51

- 1 Have mercy on me, O God, in your great goodness; ♦
according to the abundance of your compassion
blot out my offences.
- 2 Wash me thoroughly from my wickedness ♦
and cleanse me from my sin.
- 3 For I acknowledge my faults ♦
and my sin is ever before me.
- 4 Against you only have I sinned ♦
and done what is evil in your sight,
- 5 So that you are justified in your sentence ♦
and righteous in your judgement.
- 6 I have been wicked even from my birth, ♦
a sinner when my mother conceived me.

- 7 Behold, you desire truth deep within me ♦
and shall make me understand wisdom
in the depths of my heart.
- 8 Purge me with hyssop and I shall be clean; ♦
wash me and I shall be whiter than snow.
- 9 Make me hear of joy and gladness, ♦
that the bones you have broken may rejoice.
- 10 Turn your face from my sins ♦
and blot out all my misdeeds.
- 11 Make me a clean heart, O God, ♦
and renew a right spirit within me.
- 12 Cast me not away from your presence ♦
and take not your holy spirit from me.
- 13 Give me again the joy of your salvation ♦
and sustain me with your gracious spirit;
- 14 Then shall I teach your ways to the wicked ♦
and sinners shall return to you.
- 15 Deliver me from my guilt, O God,
the God of my salvation, ♦
and my tongue shall sing of your righteousness.
- 16 O Lord, open my lips ♦
and my mouth shall proclaim your praise.
- 17 For you desire no sacrifice, else I would give it; ♦
you take no delight in burnt offerings.
- 18 The sacrifice of God is a broken spirit; ♦
a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise.
- 19 O be favourable and gracious to Zion; ♦
build up the walls of Jerusalem.
- 20 Then you will accept sacrifices offered in righteousness,
the burnt offerings and oblations; ♦
then shall they offer up bulls on your altar.

Psalm 52

- 1 Why do you glory in evil, you tyrant, ♦
while the goodness of God endures continually?
- 2 You plot destruction, you deceiver; ♦
your tongue is like a sharpened razor.
- 3 You love evil rather than good, ♦
falsehood rather than the word of truth.
- 4 You love all words that hurt, ♦
O you deceitful tongue.
- 5 Therefore God shall utterly bring you down; ♦
he shall take you and pluck you out of your tent
and root you out of the land of the living.
- 6 The righteous shall see this and tremble; ♦
they shall laugh you to scorn, and say:
- 7 'This is the one who did not take God for a refuge, ♦
but trusted in great riches and relied upon wickedness.'

- 8 But I am like a spreading olive tree in the house of God; ♦
I trust in the goodness of God for ever and ever.
- 9 I will always give thanks to you for what you have done; ♦
I will hope in your name,
for your faithful ones delight in it.

Psalm 53

- 1 The fool has said in his heart, 'There is no God.' ♦
Corrupt are they, and abominable in their wickedness;
there is no one that does good.
- 2 God has looked down from heaven upon the children of earth, ♦
to see if there is anyone who is wise and seeks after God.
- 3 They are all gone out of the way;
all alike have become corrupt; ♦
there is no one that does good, no not one.

- 4 Have they no knowledge, those evildoers, ♦
who eat up my people as if they ate bread,
and do not call upon God?
- 5 There shall they be in great fear,
such fear as never was; ♦
for God will scatter the bones of the ungodly.
- 6 They will be put to shame, ♦
because God has rejected them.
- 7 O that Israel's salvation would come out of Zion! ♦
When God restores the fortunes of his people
then will Jacob rejoice and Israel be glad.

Psalm 54

- 1 Save me, O God, by your name ♦
and vindicate me by your power.
- 2 Hear my prayer, O God; ♦
give heed to the words of my mouth.
- 3 For strangers have risen up against me,
and the ruthless seek after my life; ♦
they have not set God before them.
- 4 Behold, God is my helper; ♦
it is the Lord who upholds my life.
- 5 May evil rebound on those who lie in wait for me; ♦
destroy them in your faithfulness.
- 6 An offering of a free heart will I give you ♦
and praise your name, O Lord, for it is gracious.
- 7 For he has delivered me out of all my trouble, ♦
and my eye has seen the downfall of my enemies.

- 1 Hear my prayer, O God; ♦
hide not yourself from my petition.
- 2 Give heed to me and answer me; ♦
I am restless in my complaining.
- 3 I am alarmed at the voice of the enemy ♦
and at the clamour of the wicked;
- 4 For they would bring down evil upon me ♦
and are set against me in fury.
- 5 My heart is disquieted within me, ♦
and the terrors of death have fallen upon me.
- 6 Fearfulness and trembling are come upon me, ♦
and a horrible dread has overwhelmed me.
- 7 And I said: 'O that I had wings like a dove, ♦
for then would I fly away and be at rest.
- 8 'Then would I flee far away ♦
and make my lodging in the wilderness.
- 9 'I would make haste to escape ♦
from the stormy wind and tempest.'
- 10 Confuse their tongues, O Lord, and divide them, ♦
for I have seen violence and strife in the city.
- 11 Day and night they go about on her walls; ♦
mischief and trouble are in her midst.
- 12 Wickedness walks in her streets; ♦
oppression and guile never leave her squares.
- 13 For it was not an open enemy that reviled me, ♦
for then I could have borne it;
- 14 Nor was it my adversary that puffed himself up against me, ♦
for then I would have hid myself from him.
- 15 But it was even you, one like myself, ♦
my companion and my own familiar friend.
- 16 We took sweet counsel together ♦
and walked with the multitude in the house of God.

- 17 Let death come suddenly upon them;
let them go down alive to the Pit; ♦
for wickedness inhabits their dwellings, their very hearts.
- 18 As for me, I will call upon God ♦
and the Lord will deliver me.
- 19 In the evening and morning and at noonday
I will pray and make my supplication, ♦
and he shall hear my voice.
- 20 He shall redeem my soul in peace
from the battle waged against me, ♦
for many have come upon me.
- 21 God, who is enthroned of old,
will hear and bring them down; ♦
they will not repent, for they have no fear of God.
- 22 My companion stretched out his hands against his friend ♦
and has broken his covenant;
- 23 His speech was softer than butter, though war was in his heart; ♦
his words were smoother than oil, yet are they naked swords.
- 24 Cast your burden upon the Lord and he will sustain you, ♦
and will not let the righteous fall for ever.
- 25 But those that are bloodthirsty and deceitful, O God, ♦
you will bring down to the pit of destruction.
- 26 They shall not live out half their days, ♦
but my trust shall be in you, O Lord.

- 1 Have mercy on me, O God, for they trample over me; ♦
all day long they assault and oppress me.
- 2 My adversaries trample over me all the day long; ♦
many are they that make proud war against me.
- 3 In the day of my fear I put my trust in you, ♦
in God whose word I praise.
- 4 In God I trust, and will not fear, ♦
for what can flesh do to me?
- 5 All day long they wound me with words; ♦
their every thought is to do me evil.
- 6 They stir up trouble; they lie in wait; ♦
marking my steps, they seek my life.
- 7 Shall they escape for all their wickedness? ♦
In anger, O God, cast the peoples down.
- 8 You have counted up my groaning;
put my tears into your bottle; ♦
are they not written in your book?
- 9 Then shall my enemies turn back
on the day when I call upon you; ♦
this I know, for God is on my side.
- 10 In God whose word I praise,
in the Lord whose word I praise, ♦
in God I trust and will not fear:
what can flesh do to me?
- 11 To you, O God, will I fulfil my vows; ♦
to you will I present my offerings of thanks,
- 12 For you will deliver my soul from death
and my feet from falling, ♦
that I may walk before God in the light of the living.

- 1 Be merciful to me, O God, be merciful to me, ♦
for my soul takes refuge in you;
- 2 In the shadow of your wings will I take refuge ♦
until the storm of destruction has passed by.
- 3 I will call upon the Most High God, ♦
the God who fulfils his purpose for me.
- 4 He will send from heaven and save me
and rebuke those that would trample upon me; ♦
God will send forth his love and his faithfulness.
- 5 I lie in the midst of lions, ♦
people whose teeth are spears and arrows,
and their tongue a sharp sword.
- 6 *Be exalted, O God, above the heavens, ♦
and your glory over all the earth.*
- 7 They have laid a net for my feet;
my soul is pressed down; ♦
they have dug a pit before me
and will fall into it themselves.
- 8 My heart is ready, O God, my heart is ready; ♦
I will sing and give you praise.
- 9 Awake, my soul; awake, harp and lyre, ♦
that I may awaken the dawn.
- 10 I will give you thanks, O Lord, among the peoples; ♦
I will sing praise to you among the nations.
- 11 For your loving-kindness is as high as the heavens, ♦
and your faithfulness reaches to the clouds.
- 12 *Be exalted, O God, above the heavens, ♦
and your glory over all the earth.*

Psalm 58

- 1 Do you indeed speak justly, you mighty? ♦
Do you rule the peoples with equity?
- 2 With unjust heart you act throughout the land; ♦
your hands mete out violence.
- 3 The wicked are estranged, even from the womb; ♦
those who speak falsehood go astray from their birth.
- 4 They are as venomous as a serpent; ♦
they are like the deaf adder which stops its ears,
- 5 Which does not heed the voice of the charmers, ♦
and is deaf to the skilful weaver of spells.
- 6 Break, O God, their teeth in their mouths; ♦
smash the fangs of these lions, O Lord.
- 7 Let them vanish like water that runs away; ♦
let them wither like trodden grass.
- 8 Let them be as the slimy track of the snail, ♦
like the untimely birth that never sees the sun.
- 9 Before ever their pots feel the heat of the thorns, ♦
green or blazing, let them be swept away.
- 10 The righteous will be glad when they see God's vengeance; ♦
they will bathe their feet in the blood of the wicked.
- 11 So that people will say,
 'Truly, there is a harvest for the righteous; ♦
truly, there is a God who judges in the earth.'

Psalm 59

- 1 Rescue me from my enemies, O my God; ♦
set me high above those that rise up against me.
- 2 Save me from the evildoers ♦
and from murderous foes deliver me.
- 3 For see how they lie in wait for my soul ♦
and the mighty stir up trouble against me.
- 4 Not for any fault or sin of mine, O Lord; ♦
for no offence, they run and prepare themselves for war.

- 5 Rouse yourself, come to my aid and see; ♦
for you are the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel.
- 6 Awake, and judge all the nations; ♦
show no mercy to the evil traitors.
- 7 They return at nightfall and snarl like dogs ♦
and prowl about the city.
- 8 They pour out evil words with their mouths;
swords are on their lips; ♦
'For who', they say, 'can hear us?'
- 9 But you laugh at them, O Lord; ♦
you hold all the nations in derision.
- 10 For you, O my strength, will I watch; ♦
you, O God, are my strong tower.
- 11 My God in his steadfast love will come to me; ♦
he will let me behold the downfall of my enemies.
- 12 Slay them not, lest my people forget; ♦
send them reeling by your might
and bring them down, O Lord our shield.
- 13 For the sins of their mouth, for the words of their lips, ♦
let them be taken in their pride.
- 14 For the cursing and falsehood they have uttered, ♦
consume them in wrath, consume them till they are no more.
- 15 And they shall know that God rules in Jacob, ♦
and to the ends of the earth.
- 16 And still they return at nightfall and snarl like dogs ♦
and prowl about the city.
- 17 Though they forage for something to devour, ♦
and howl if they are not filled,
- 18 Yet will I sing of your strength ♦
and every morning praise your steadfast love;
- 19 For you have been my stronghold, ♦
my refuge in the day of my trouble.
- 20 To you, O my strength, will I sing; ♦
for you, O God, are my refuge,
my God of steadfast love.

- 1 O God, you have cast us off and broken us; ♦
you have been angry; restore us to yourself again.
- 2 You have shaken the earth and torn it apart; ♦
heal its wounds, for it trembles.
- 3 You have made your people drink bitter things; ♦
we reel from the deadly wine you have given us.
- 4 You have made those who fear you to flee, ♦
to escape from the range of the bow.
- 5 That your beloved may be delivered, ♦
save us by your right hand and answer us.

- 6 God has spoken in his holiness: ♦
'I will triumph and divide Shechem,
and share out the valley of Succoth.
- 7 'Gilead is mine and Manasseh is mine; ♦
Ephraim is my helmet and Judah my sceptre.
- 8 'Moab shall be my washpot;
over Edom will I cast my sandal; ♦
across Philistia will I shout in triumph.'
- 9 Who will lead me into the strong city? ♦
Who will bring me into Edom?
- 10 Have you not cast us off, O God? ♦
Will you no longer go forth with our troops?
- 11 Grant us your help against the enemy, ♦
for earthly help is in vain.
- 12 Through God will we do great acts, ♦
for it is he that shall tread down our enemies.

Psalm 61

- 1 Hear my crying, O God, ♦
and listen to my prayer.
- 2 From the end of the earth I call to you with fainting heart; ♦
O set me on the rock that is higher than I.
- 3 For you are my refuge, ♦
a strong tower against the enemy.
- 4 Let me dwell in your tent for ever ♦
and take refuge under the cover of your wings.
- 5 For you, O God, will hear my vows; ♦
you will grant the request of those who fear your name.
- 6 You will add length of days to the life of the king, ♦
that his years may endure throughout all generations.
- 7 May he sit enthroned before God for ever; ♦
may steadfast love and truth watch over him.
- 8 So will I always sing praise to your name, ♦
and day by day fulfil my vows.

Psalm 62

- 1 On God alone my soul in stillness waits; ♦
from him comes my salvation.
- 2 He alone is my rock and my salvation, ♦
my stronghold, so that I shall never be shaken.
- 3 How long will all of you assail me to destroy me, ♦
as you would a tottering wall or a leaning fence?
- 4 They plot only to thrust me down from my place of honour;
lies are their chief delight; ♦
they bless with their mouth, but in their heart they curse.
- 5 Wait on God alone in stillness, O my soul; ♦
for in him is my hope.
- 6 He alone is my rock and my salvation, ♦
my stronghold, so that I shall not be shaken.
- 7 In God is my strength and my glory; ♦
God is my strong rock; in him is my refuge.
- 8 Put your trust in him always, my people; ♦
pour out your hearts before him, for God is our refuge.

- 9 The peoples are but a breath,
the whole human race a deceit; ♦
on the scales they are altogether lighter than air.
- 10 Put no trust in oppression; in robbery take no empty pride; ♦
though wealth increase, set not your heart upon it.
- 11 God spoke once, and twice have I heard the same, ♦
that power belongs to God.
- 12 Steadfast love belongs to you, O Lord, ♦
for you repay everyone according to their deeds.

Psalm 63

- 1 O God, you are my God; eagerly I seek you; ♦
my soul is athirst for you.
- 2 My flesh also faints for you, ♦
as in a dry and thirsty land where there is no water.
- 3 So would I gaze upon you in your holy place, ♦
that I might behold your power and your glory.
- 4 Your loving-kindness is better than life itself ♦
and so my lips shall praise you.
- 5 I will bless you as long as I live ♦
and lift up my hands in your name.
- 6 My soul shall be satisfied, as with marrow and fatness, ♦
and my mouth shall praise you with joyful lips,
- 7 When I remember you upon my bed ♦
and meditate on you in the watches of the night.
- 8 For you have been my helper ♦
and under the shadow of your wings will I rejoice.
- 9 My soul clings to you; ♦
your right hand shall hold me fast.
- 10 But those who seek my soul to destroy it ♦
shall go down to the depths of the earth;
- 11 Let them fall by the edge of the sword ♦
and become a portion for jackals.
- 12 But the king shall rejoice in God;
all those who swear by him shall be glad, ♦
for the mouth of those who speak lies shall be stopped.

Psalm 64

- 1 Hear my voice, O God, in my complaint; ♦
preserve my life from fear of the enemy.
- 2 Hide me from the conspiracy of the wicked, ♦
from the gathering of evildoers.
- 3 They sharpen their tongue like a sword ♦
and aim their bitter words like arrows,
- 4 That they may shoot at the blameless from hiding places; ♦
suddenly they shoot, and are not seen.
- 5 They hold fast to their evil course; ♦
they talk of laying snares, saying, 'Who will see us?'
- 6 They search out wickedness and lay a cunning trap, ♦
for deep are the inward thoughts of the heart.

- 7 But God will shoot at them with his swift arrow, ♦
and suddenly they shall be wounded.
- 8 Their own tongues shall make them fall, ♦
and all who see them shall wag their heads in scorn.
- 9 All peoples shall fear and tell what God has done, ♦
and they will ponder all his works.
- 10 The righteous shall rejoice in the Lord
and put their trust in him, ♦
and all that are true of heart shall exult.

Psalm 65

- 1 Praise is due to you, O God, in Zion; ♦
to you that answer prayer shall vows be paid.
- 2 To you shall all flesh come to confess their sins; ♦
when our misdeeds prevail against us,
you will purge them away.
- 3 Happy are they whom you choose
and draw to your courts to dwell there. ♦
We shall be satisfied with the blessings of your house,
even of your holy temple.

- 4 With wonders you will answer us in your righteousness,
O God of our salvation, ♦
O hope of all the ends of the earth
and of the farthest seas.
- 5 In your strength you set fast the mountains ♦
and are girded about with might.
- 6 You still the raging of the seas, ♦
the roaring of their waves
and the clamour of the peoples.
- 7 Those who dwell at the ends of the earth
tremble at your marvels; ♦
the gates of the morning and evening sing your praise.
- 8 You visit the earth and water it; ♦
you make it very plenteous.
- 9 The river of God is full of water; ♦
you prepare grain for your people,
for so you provide for the earth.
- 10 You drench the furrows and smooth out the ridges; ♦
you soften the ground with showers and bless its increase.
- 11 You crown the year with your goodness, ♦
and your paths overflow with plenty.
- 12 May the pastures of the wilderness flow with goodness ♦
and the hills be girded with joy.
- 13 May the meadows be clothed with flocks of sheep ♦
and the valleys stand so thick with corn
that they shall laugh and sing.

Psalm 66

- 1 Be joyful in God, all the earth; ♦
sing the glory of his name;
sing the glory of his praise.
- 2 Say to God, 'How awesome are your deeds! ♦
Because of your great strength
your enemies shall bow before you.'

- 3 'All the earth shall worship you, ♦
sing to you, sing praise to your name.'
- 4 Come now and behold the works of God, ♦
how wonderful he is in his dealings with humankind.
- 5 He turned the sea into dry land;
the river they passed through on foot; ♦
there we rejoiced in him.
- 6 In his might he rules for ever;
his eyes keep watch over the nations; ♦
let no rebel rise up against him.
- 7 Bless our God, O you peoples; ♦
make the voice of his praise to be heard,
- 8 Who holds our souls in life ♦
and suffers not our feet to slip.
- 9 For you, O God, have proved us; ♦
you have tried us as silver is tried.
- 10 You brought us into the snare; ♦
you laid heavy burdens upon our backs.
- 11 You let enemies ride over our heads;
we went through fire and water; ♦
but you brought us out into a place of liberty.
- 12 I will come into your house with burnt offerings
and will pay you my vows, ♦
which my lips uttered
and my mouth promised when I was in trouble.
- 13 I will offer you fat burnt sacrifices
with the smoke of rams; ♦
I will sacrifice oxen and goats.
- 14 Come and listen, all you who fear God, ♦
and I will tell you what he has done for my soul.
- 15 I called out to him with my mouth ♦
and his praise was on my tongue.

- 16 If I had nursed evil in my heart, ♦
the Lord would not have heard me,
- 17 But in truth God has heard me; ♦
he has heeded the voice of my prayer.
- 18 Blessed be God, who has not rejected my prayer, ♦
nor withheld his loving mercy from me.

Psalm 67

- 1 God be gracious to us and bless us ♦
and make his face to shine upon us,
- 2 That your way may be known upon earth, ♦
your saving power among all nations.
- 3 *Let the peoples praise you, O God; ♦
let all the peoples praise you.*
- 4 O let the nations rejoice and be glad, ♦
for you will judge the peoples righteously
and govern the nations upon earth.
- 5 *Let the peoples praise you, O God; ♦
let all the peoples praise you.*
- 6 Then shall the earth bring forth her increase, ♦
and God, our own God, will bless us.
- 7 God will bless us, ♦
and all the ends of the earth shall fear him.

Psalm 68

- 1 Let God arise and let his enemies be scattered; ♦
let those that hate him flee before him.
- 2 As the smoke vanishes, so may they vanish away; ♦
as wax melts at the fire,
so let the wicked perish at the presence of God.
- 3 But let the righteous be glad and rejoice before God; ♦
let them make merry with gladness.

- 4 Sing to God, sing praises to his name;
exalt him who rides on the clouds. ♦
The Lord is his name; rejoice before him.
- 5 Father of the fatherless, defender of widows, ♦
God in his holy habitation!
- 6 God gives the solitary a home
and brings forth prisoners to songs of welcome, ♦
but the rebellious inhabit a burning desert.
- 7 O God, when you went forth before your people, ♦
when you marched through the wilderness,
- 8 The earth shook and the heavens dropped down rain,
at the presence of God, the Lord of Sinai, ♦
at the presence of God, the God of Israel.
- 9 You sent down a gracious rain, O God; ♦
you refreshed your inheritance when it was weary.
- 10 Your people came to dwell there; ♦
in your goodness, O God, you provide for the poor.
- 11 The Lord gave the word;
great was the company of women who bore the tidings: ♦
'Kings and their armies they flee, they flee!'
and women at home are dividing the spoil.
- 12 Though you stayed among the sheepfolds, ♦
see now a dove's wings covered with silver
and its feathers with green gold.
- 13 When the Almighty scattered the kings, ♦
it was like snowflakes falling on Zalmon.
- 14 You mighty mountain, great mountain of Bashan! ♦
You towering mountain, great mountain of Bashan!
- 15 Why look with envy, you towering mountains,
at the mount which God has desired for his dwelling, ♦
the place where the Lord will dwell for ever?
- 16 The chariots of God are twice ten thousand,
even thousands upon thousands; ♦
the Lord is among them, the Lord of Sinai in holy power.

- 17 You have gone up on high and led captivity captive; ♦
you have received tribute,
even from those who rebelled,
that you may reign as Lord and God.
- 18 Blessed be the Lord who bears our burdens day by day, ♦
for God is our salvation.
- 19 God is for us the God of our salvation; ♦
God is the Lord who can deliver from death.
- 20 God will smite the head of his enemies, ♦
the hairy scalp of those who walk in wickedness.
- 21 The Lord has said, 'From the heights of Bashan, ♦
from the depths of the sea will I bring them back,
- 22 'Till you dip your foot in blood ♦
and the tongue of your dogs has a taste of your enemies.'
- 23 We see your solemn processions, O God, ♦
your processions into the sanctuary, my God and my King.
- 24 The singers go before, the musicians follow after, ♦
in the midst of maidens playing on timbrels.
- 25 In your companies, bless your God; ♦
bless the Lord, you that are of the fount of Israel.
- 26 At the head there is Benjamin, least of the tribes,
the princes of Judah in joyful company, ♦
the princes of Zebulun and Naphtali.
- 27 Send forth your strength, O God; ♦
establish, O God, what you have wrought in us.
- 28 For your temple's sake in Jerusalem ♦
kings shall bring their gifts to you.
- 29 Drive back with your word the wild beast of the reeds, ♦
the herd of the bull-like, the brutish hordes.
- 30 Trample down those who lust after silver; ♦
scatter the peoples that delight in war.
- 31 Vessels of bronze shall be brought from Egypt; ♦
Ethiopia will stretch out her hands to God.

- 32 Sing to God, you kingdoms of the earth; ♦
make music in praise of the Lord;
- 33 He rides on the ancient heaven of heavens ♦
and sends forth his voice, a mighty voice.
- 34 Ascribe power to God, whose splendour is over Israel, ♦
whose power is above the clouds.
- 35 How terrible is God in his holy sanctuary, ♦
the God of Israel, who gives power and strength to his people!
Blessed be God.

Psalm 69

- 1 Save me, O God, ♦
for the waters have come up, even to my neck.
- 2 I sink in deep mire where there is no foothold; ♦
I have come into deep waters and the flood sweeps over me.
- 3 I have grown weary with crying; my throat is raw; ♦
my eyes have failed from looking so long for my God.
- 4 Those who hate me without any cause ♦
are more than the hairs of my head;
- 5 Those who would destroy me are mighty; ♦
my enemies accuse me falsely:
must I now give back what I never stole?
- 6 O God, you know my foolishness, ♦
and my faults are not hidden from you.
- 7 Let not those who hope in you
be put to shame through me, Lord God of hosts; ♦
let not those who seek you be disgraced because of me,
O God of Israel.
- 8 For your sake have I suffered reproach; ♦
shame has covered my face.
- 9 I have become a stranger to my kindred, ♦
an alien to my mother's children.
- 10 Zeal for your house has eaten me up; ♦
the scorn of those who scorn you has fallen upon me.

- 11 I humbled myself with fasting, ♦
but that was turned to my reproach.
- 12 I put on sackcloth also ♦
and became a byword among them.
- 13 Those who sit at the gate murmur against me, ♦
and the drunkards make songs about me.
- 14 But as for me, I make my prayer to you, O Lord; ♦
at an acceptable time, O God.
- 15 Answer me, O God, in the abundance of your mercy ♦
and with your sure salvation.
- 16 Draw me out of the mire, that I sink not; ♦
let me be rescued from those who hate me
and out of the deep waters.
- 17 Let not the water flood drown me,
neither the deep swallow me up; ♦
let not the Pit shut its mouth upon me.
- 18 Answer me, Lord, for your loving-kindness is good; ♦
turn to me in the multitude of your mercies.
- 19 Hide not your face from your servant; ♦
be swift to answer me, for I am in trouble.
- 20 Draw near to my soul and redeem me; ♦
deliver me because of my enemies.
- 21 You know my reproach, my shame and my dishonour; ♦
my adversaries are all in your sight.
- 22 Reproach has broken my heart; I am full of heaviness. ♦
I looked for some to have pity, but there was no one,
neither found I any to comfort me.
- 23 They gave me gall to eat, ♦
and when I was thirsty, they gave me vinegar to drink.
- 24 Let the table before them be a trap ♦
and their sacred feasts a snare.
- 25 Let their eyes be darkened, that they cannot see, ♦
and give them continual trembling in their loins.

- 26 Pour out your indignation upon them, ♦
and let the heat of your anger overtake them.
- 27 Let their camp be desolate, ♦
and let there be no one to dwell in their tents.
- 28 For they persecute the one whom you have stricken, ♦
and increase the sorrows of him whom you have pierced.
- 29 Lay to their charge guilt upon guilt, ♦
and let them not receive your vindication.
- 30 Let them be wiped out of the book of the living ♦
and not be written among the righteous.
- 31 As for me, I am poor and in misery; ♦
your saving help, O God, will lift me up.
- 32 I will praise the name of God with a song; ♦
I will proclaim his greatness with thanksgiving.
- 33 This will please the Lord more than an offering of oxen, ♦
more than bulls with horns and hooves.
- 34 The humble shall see and be glad; ♦
you who seek God, your heart shall live.
- 35 For the Lord listens to the needy, ♦
and his own who are imprisoned he does not despise.
- 36 Let the heavens and the earth praise him, ♦
the seas and all that moves in them;
- 37 For God will save Zion and rebuild the cities of Judah; ♦
they shall live there and have it in possession.
- 38 The children of his servants shall inherit it, ♦
and they that love his name shall dwell therein.

Psalm 70

- 1 O God, make speed to save me; ♦
O Lord, make haste to help me.
- 2 Let those who seek my life
be put to shame and confusion; ♦
let them be turned back and disgraced
who wish me evil.

- 3 Let those who mock and deride me ♦
turn back because of their shame.
- 4 But let all who seek you rejoice and be glad in you; ♦
let those who love your salvation say always, 'Great is the Lord!'
- 5 As for me, I am poor and needy; ♦
come to me quickly, O God.
- 6 You are my help and my deliverer; ♦
O Lord, do not delay.

Psalm 71

- 1 In you, O Lord, do I seek refuge; ♦
let me never be put to shame.
- 2 In your righteousness, deliver me and set me free; ♦
incline your ear to me and save me.
- 3 Be for me a stronghold to which I may ever resort; ♦
send out to save me, for you are my rock and my fortress.
- 4 Deliver me, my God, from the hand of the wicked, ♦
from the grasp of the evildoer and the oppressor.
- 5 For you are my hope, O Lord God, ♦
my confidence, even from my youth.
- 6 Upon you have I leaned from my birth,
when you drew me from my mother's womb; ♦
my praise shall be always of you.
- 7 I have become a portent to many, ♦
but you are my refuge and my strength.
- 8 Let my mouth be full of your praise ♦
and your glory all the day long.
- 9 Do not cast me away in the time of old age; ♦
forsake me not when my strength fails.
- 10 For my enemies are talking against me, ♦
and those who lie in wait for my life take counsel together.
- 11 They say, 'God has forsaken him;
pursue him and take him, ♦
because there is none to deliver him.'

- 12 O God, be not far from me; ♦
come quickly to help me, O my God.
- 13 Let those who are against me
be put to shame and disgrace; ♦
let those who seek to do me evil
be covered with scorn and reproach.
- 14 But as for me I will hope continually ♦
and will praise you more and more.
- 15 My mouth shall tell of your righteousness
and salvation all the day long, ♦
for I know no end of the telling.
- 16 I will begin with the mighty works of the Lord God; ♦
I will recall your righteousness, yours alone.
- 17 O God, you have taught me since I was young, ♦
and to this day I tell of your wonderful works.
- 18 Forsake me not, O God,
when I am old and grey-headed, ♦
till I make known your deeds to the next generation
and your power to all that are to come.
- 19 Your righteousness, O God, reaches to the heavens; ♦
in the great things you have done, who is like you, O God?
- 20 What troubles and adversities you have shown me, ♦
and yet you will turn and refresh me
and bring me from the deep of the earth again.
- 21 Increase my honour; ♦
turn again and comfort me.
- 22 Therefore will I praise you upon the harp
for your faithfulness, O my God; ♦
I will sing to you with the lyre, O Holy One of Israel.
- 23 My lips will sing out as I play to you, ♦
and so will my soul, which you have redeemed.
- 24 My tongue also will tell of your righteousness all the day long, ♦
for they shall be shamed and disgraced
who sought to do me evil.

- 1 Give the king your judgements, O God, ♦
and your righteousness to the son of a king.
- 2 Then shall he judge your people righteously ♦
and your poor with justice.
- 3 May the mountains bring forth peace, ♦
and the little hills righteousness for the people.
- 4 May he defend the poor among the people, ♦
deliver the children of the needy and crush the oppressor.
- 5 May he live as long as the sun and moon endure, ♦
from one generation to another.
- 6 May he come down like rain upon the mown grass, ♦
like the showers that water the earth.
- 7 In his time shall righteousness flourish, ♦
and abundance of peace
till the moon shall be no more.
- 8 May his dominion extend from sea to sea ♦
and from the River to the ends of the earth.
- 9 May his foes kneel before him ♦
and his enemies lick the dust.
- 10 The kings of Tarshish and of the isles shall pay tribute; ♦
the kings of Sheba and Seba shall bring gifts.
- 11 All kings shall fall down before him; ♦
all nations shall do him service.
- 12 For he shall deliver the poor that cry out, ♦
the needy and those who have no helper.
- 13 He shall have pity on the weak and poor; ♦
he shall preserve the lives of the needy.
- 14 He shall redeem their lives from oppression and violence, ♦
and dear shall their blood be in his sight.
- 15 Long may he live;
unto him may be given gold from Sheba; ♦
may prayer be made for him continually
and may they bless him all the day long.

- 16 May there be abundance of grain on the earth,
standing thick upon the hilltops; ♦
may its fruit flourish like Lebanon
and its grain grow like the grass of the field.
- 17 May his name remain for ever
and be established as long as the sun endures; ♦
may all nations be blest in him
and call him blessed.
- 18 Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel, ♦
who alone does wonderful things.
- 19 And blessed be his glorious name for ever. ♦
May all the earth be filled with his glory.
Amen. Amen.

Psalm 73

- 1 Truly, God is loving to Israel, ♦
to those who are pure in heart.
- 2 Nevertheless, my feet were almost gone; ♦
my steps had well-nigh slipped.
- 3 For I was envious of the proud; ♦
I saw the wicked in such prosperity;
- 4 For they suffer no pains ♦
and their bodies are sleek and sound;
- 5 They come to no misfortune like other folk; ♦
nor are they plagued as others are;
- 6 Therefore pride is their necklace ♦
and violence wraps them like a cloak.
- 7 Their iniquity comes from within; ♦
the conceits of their hearts overflow.
- 8 They scoff, and speak only of evil; ♦
they talk of oppression from on high.
- 9 They set their mouth against the heavens, ♦
and their tongue ranges round the earth;

- 10 And so the people turn to them ♦
and find in them no fault.
- 11 They say, 'How should God know? ♦
Is there knowledge in the Most High?'
- 12 Behold, these are the wicked; ♦
ever at ease, they increase their wealth.
- 13 Is it in vain that I cleansed my heart ♦
and washed my hands in innocence?
- 14 All day long have I been stricken ♦
and chastened every morning.
- 15 If I had said, 'I will speak as they do,' ♦
I should have betrayed the generation of your children.
- 16 Then thought I to understand this, ♦
but it was too hard for me,
- 17 Until I entered the sanctuary of God ♦
and understood the end of the wicked:
- 18 How you set them in slippery places; ♦
you cast them down to destruction.
- 19 How suddenly do they come to destruction, ♦
perish and come to a fearful end!
- 20 As with a dream when one awakes, ♦
so, Lord, when you arise you will despise their image.
- 21 When my heart became embittered ♦
and I was pierced to the quick,
- 22 I was but foolish and ignorant; ♦
I was like a brute beast in your presence.
- 23 Yet I am always with you; ♦
you hold me by my right hand.
- 24 You will guide me with your counsel ♦
and afterwards receive me with glory.
- 25 Whom have I in heaven but you? ♦
And there is nothing upon earth that I desire
in comparison with you.
- 26 Though my flesh and my heart fail me, ♦
God is the strength of my heart and my portion for ever.

- 27 Truly, those who forsake you will perish; ♦
you will put to silence the faithless who betray you.
- 28 But it is good for me to draw near to God; ♦
in the Lord God have I made my refuge,
that I may tell of all your works.

Psalm 74

- 1 O God, why have you utterly disowned us? ♦
Why does your anger burn
against the sheep of your pasture?
- 2 Remember your congregation that you purchased of old, ♦
the tribe you redeemed for your own possession,
and Mount Zion where you dwell.
- 3 Hasten your steps towards the endless ruins, ♦
where the enemy has laid waste all your sanctuary.
- 4 Your adversaries roared in the place of your worship; ♦
they set up their banners as tokens of victory.
- 5 Like men brandishing axes on high in a thicket of trees, ♦
all her carved work they smashed down with hatchet and hammer.
- 6 They set fire to your holy place; ♦
they defiled the dwelling place of your name
and razed it to the ground.
- 7 They said in their heart, 'Let us make havoc of them altogether,' ♦
and they burned down all the sanctuaries of God in the land.
- 8 There are no signs to see, not one prophet left, ♦
not one among us who knows how long.
- 9 How long, O God, will the adversary scoff? ♦
Shall the enemy blaspheme your name for ever?
- 10 Why have you withheld your hand ♦
and hidden your right hand in your bosom?
- 11 Yet God is my king from of old, ♦
who did deeds of salvation in the midst of the earth.
- 12 It was you that divided the sea by your might ♦
and shattered the heads of the dragons on the waters;

- 13 You alone crushed the heads of Leviathan ♦
and gave him to the beasts of the desert for food.
- 14 You cleft the rock for fountain and flood; ♦
you dried up ever-flowing rivers.
- 15 Yours is the day, yours also the night; ♦
you established the moon and the sun.
- 16 You set all the bounds of the earth; ♦
you fashioned both summer and winter.
- 17 Remember now, Lord, how the enemy scoffed, ♦
how a foolish people despised your name.
- 18 Do not give to wild beasts the soul of your turtle dove; ♦
forget not the lives of your poor for ever.
- 19 Look upon your creation,
for the earth is full of darkness, ♦
full of the haunts of violence.
- 20 Let not the oppressed turn away ashamed, ♦
but let the poor and needy praise your name.
- 21 Arise, O God, maintain your own cause; ♦
remember how fools revile you all the day long.
- 22 Forget not the clamour of your adversaries, ♦
the tumult of your enemies that ascends continually.

Psalm 75

- 1 We give you thanks, O God, we give you thanks, ♦
for your name is near, as your wonderful deeds declare.
- 2 'I will seize the appointed time; ♦
I, the Lord, will judge with equity.
- 3 'Though the earth reels and all that dwell in her, ♦
it is I that hold her pillars steady.
- 4 'To the boasters I say, "Boast no longer," ♦
and to the wicked, "Do not lift up your horn.
- 5 "'Do not lift up your horn on high; ♦
do not speak with a stiff neck.' '

- 6 For neither from the east nor from the west, ♦
nor yet from the wilderness comes exaltation.
- 7 But God alone is judge; ♦
he puts down one and raises up another.
- 8 For in the hand of the Lord there is a cup, ♦
well mixed and full of foaming wine.
- 9 He pours it out for all the wicked of the earth; ♦
they shall drink it, and drain the dregs.
- 10 But I will rejoice for ever ♦
and make music to the God of Jacob.
- 11 All the horns of the wicked will I break, ♦
but the horns of the righteous shall be exalted.

Psalm 76

- 1 In Judah God is known; ♦
his name is great in Israel.
- 2 At Salem is his tabernacle, ♦
and his dwelling place in Zion.
- 3 There broke he the flashing arrows of the bow, ♦
the shield, the sword and the weapons of war.
- 4 In the light of splendour you appeared, ♦
glorious from the eternal mountains.
- 5 The boastful were plundered; they have slept their sleep; ♦
none of the warriors can lift their hand.
- 6 At your rebuke, O God of Jacob, ♦
both horse and chariot fell stunned.
- 7 Terrible are you in majesty: ♦
who can stand before your face when you are angry?
- 8 You caused your judgement to be heard from heaven; ♦
the earth trembled and was still,
- 9 When God arose to judgement, ♦
to save all the meek upon earth.
- 10 You crushed the wrath of the peoples ♦
and bridled the wrathful remnant.

- 11 Make a vow to the Lord your God and keep it; ♦
let all who are round about him bring gifts
to him that is worthy to be feared.
- 12 He breaks down the spirit of princes ♦
and strikes terror in the kings of the earth.

Psalm 77

- 1 I cry aloud to God; ♦
I cry aloud to God and he will hear me.
- 2 In the day of my trouble I have sought the Lord; ♦
by night my hand is stretched out and does not tire;
my soul refuses comfort.
- 3 I think upon God and I groan; ♦
I ponder, and my spirit faints.
- 4 You will not let my eyelids close; ♦
I am so troubled that I cannot speak.
- 5 I consider the days of old; ♦
I remember the years long past;
- 6 I commune with my heart in the night; ♦
my spirit searches for understanding.
- 7 Will the Lord cast us off for ever? ♦
Will he no more show us his favour?
- 8 Has his loving mercy clean gone for ever? ♦
Has his promise come to an end for evermore?
- 9 Has God forgotten to be gracious? ♦
Has he shut up his compassion in displeasure?
- 10 And I said, 'My grief is this: ♦
that the right hand of the Most High has lost its strength.'
- 11 I will remember the works of the Lord ♦
and call to mind your wonders of old time.
- 12 I will meditate on all your works ♦
and ponder your mighty deeds.
- 13 Your way, O God, is holy; ♦
who is so great a god as our God?

- 14 You are the God who worked wonders ♦
and declared your power among the peoples.
- 15 With a mighty arm you redeemed your people, ♦
the children of Jacob and Joseph.
- 16 The waters saw you, O God;
the waters saw you and were afraid; ♦
the depths also were troubled.
- 17 The clouds poured out water; the skies thundered; ♦
your arrows flashed on every side;
- 18 The voice of your thunder was in the whirlwind;
your lightnings lit up the ground; ♦
the earth trembled and shook.
- 19 Your way was in the sea, and your paths in the great waters, ♦
but your footsteps were not known.
- 20 You led your people like sheep ♦
by the hand of Moses and Aaron.

Psalm 78

- 1 Hear my teaching, O my people; ♦
incline your ears to the words of my mouth.
- 2 I will open my mouth in a parable; ♦
I will pour forth mysteries from of old,
- 3 Such as we have heard and known, ♦
which our forebears have told us.
- 4 We will not hide from their children,
but will recount to generations to come, ♦
the praises of the Lord and his power
and the wonderful works he has done.
- 5 He laid a solemn charge on Jacob
and made it a law in Israel, ♦
which he commanded them to teach their children,
- 6 That the generations to come might know,
and the children yet unborn, ♦
that they in turn might tell it to their children;

- 7 So that they might put their trust in God ♦
and not forget the deeds of God,
but keep his commandments,
- 8 And not be like their forebears,
a stubborn and rebellious generation, ♦
a generation whose heart was not steadfast,
and whose spirit was not faithful to God.
- 9 The people of Ephraim, armed with the bow, ♦
turned back in the day of battle;
- 10 They did not keep the covenant of God ♦
and refused to walk in his law;
- 11 They forgot what he had done ♦
and the wonders he had shown them.
- 12 For he did marvellous things in the sight of their forebears, ♦
in the land of Egypt, in the field of Zoan.
- 13 He divided the sea and let them pass through; ♦
he made the waters stand still in a heap.
- 14 He led them with a cloud by day ♦
and all the night through with a blaze of fire.
- 15 He split the hard rocks in the wilderness ♦
and gave them drink as from the great deep.
- 16 He brought streams out of the rock ♦
and made water gush out like rivers.
- 17 Yet for all this they sinned more against him ♦
and defied the Most High in the wilderness.
- 18 They tested God in their hearts ♦
and demanded food for their craving.
- 19 They spoke against God and said, ♦
'Can God prepare a table in the wilderness?
- 20 'He struck the rock indeed, so that the waters gushed out
and the streams overflowed, ♦
but can he give bread or provide meat for his people?'
- 21 When the Lord heard this, he was full of wrath; ♦
a fire was kindled against Jacob
and his anger went out against Israel,

- 22 For they had no faith in God ♦
and put no trust in his saving help.
- 23 So he commanded the clouds above ♦
and opened the doors of heaven.
- 24 He rained down upon them manna to eat ♦
and gave them the grain of heaven.
- 25 So mortals ate the bread of angels; ♦
he sent them food in plenty.
- 26 He caused the east wind to blow in the heavens ♦
and led out the south wind by his might.
- 27 He rained flesh upon them as thick as dust ♦
and winged fowl like the sand of the sea.
- 28 He let it fall in the midst of their camp ♦
and round about their tents.
- 29 So they ate and were well filled, ♦
for he gave them what they desired.
- 30 But they did not stop their craving; ♦
their food was still in their mouths,
- 31 When the anger of God rose against them, ♦
and slew their strongest men
and felled the flower of Israel.
- 32 But for all this, they sinned yet more ♦
and put no faith in his wonderful works.
- 33 So he brought their days to an end like a breath ♦
and their years in sudden terror.
- 34 Whenever he slew them, they would seek him; ♦
they would repent and earnestly search for God.
- 35 They remembered that God was their rock ♦
and the Most High God their redeemer.
- 36 Yet they did but flatter him with their mouth ♦
and dissembled with their tongue.
- 37 Their heart was not steadfast towards him, ♦
neither were they faithful to his covenant.

- 38 But he was so merciful that he forgave their misdeeds
and did not destroy them; ♦
many a time he turned back his wrath
and did not suffer his whole displeasure to be roused.
- 39 For he remembered that they were but flesh, ♦
a wind that passes by and does not return.
- 40 How often they rebelled against him in the wilderness ♦
and grieved him in the desert!
- 41 Again and again they tempted God ♦
and provoked the Holy One of Israel.
- 42 They did not remember his power ♦
in the day when he redeemed them from the enemy;
- 43 How he had wrought his signs in Egypt ♦
and his wonders in the field of Zoan.
- 44 He turned their rivers into blood, ♦
so that they could not drink of their streams.
- 45 He sent swarms of flies among them, which devoured them, ♦
and frogs which brought them ruin.
- 46 He gave their produce to the caterpillar, ♦
the fruit of their toil to the locust.
- 47 He destroyed their vines with hailstones ♦
and their sycamore trees with the frost.
- 48 He delivered their cattle to hailstones ♦
and their flocks to thunderbolts.
- 49 He set loose on them his blazing anger: ♦
fury, displeasure and trouble,
a troop of destroying angels.
- 50 He made a way for his anger
and spared not their souls from death, ♦
but gave their life over to the pestilence.
- 51 He smote the firstborn of Egypt, ♦
the first fruits of their strength in the tents of Ham.
- 52 But he led out his people like sheep ♦
and guided them in the wilderness like a flock.

- 53 He led them to safety and they were not afraid, ♦
but the sea overwhelmed their enemies.
- 54 He brought them to his holy place, ♦
the mountain which his right hand took in possession.
- 55 He drove out the nations before them
and shared out to them their inheritance; ♦
he settled the tribes of Israel in their tents.
- 56 Yet still they tested God Most High
and rebelled against him, ♦
and would not keep his commandments.
- 57 They turned back and fell away like their forebears, ♦
starting aside like an unstrung bow.
- 58 They grieved him with their hill altars ♦
and provoked him to displeasure with their idols.
- 59 God heard and was greatly angered, ♦
and utterly rejected Israel.
- 60 He forsook the tabernacle at Shiloh, ♦
the tent of his presence on earth.
- 61 He gave the ark of his strength into captivity, ♦
his splendour into the adversary's hand.
- 62 He delivered his people to the sword ♦
and raged against his inheritance.
- 63 The fire consumed their young men; ♦
there was no one to lament their maidens.
- 64 Their priests fell by the sword, ♦
and their widows made no lamentation.
- 65 Then the Lord woke as out of sleep, ♦
like a warrior who had been overcome with wine.
- 66 He struck his enemies from behind ♦
and put them to perpetual shame.
- 67 He rejected the tent of Joseph ♦
and chose not the tribe of Ephraim,
- 68 But he chose the tribe of Judah ♦
and the hill of Zion, which he loved.

- 69 And there he built his sanctuary like the heights of heaven, ♦
like the earth which he founded for ever.
- 70 He chose David also, his servant, ♦
and took him away from the sheepfolds.
- 71 From following the ewes with their lambs he took him, ♦
that he might shepherd Jacob his people
and Israel his inheritance.
- 72 So he shepherded them with a devoted heart ♦
and with skilful hands he guided them.

Psalm 79

- 1 O God, the heathen have come into your heritage; ♦
your holy temple have they defiled
and made Jerusalem a heap of stones.
- 2 The dead bodies of your servants they have given
to be food for the birds of the air, ♦
and the flesh of your faithful to the beasts of the field.
- 3 Their blood have they shed like water
on every side of Jerusalem, ♦
and there was no one to bury them.
- 4 We have become the taunt of our neighbours, ♦
the scorn and derision of those that are round about us.
- 5 Lord, how long will you be angry, for ever? ♦
How long will your jealous fury blaze like fire?
- 6 Pour out your wrath upon the nations that have not known you, ♦
and upon the kingdoms that have not called upon your name.
- 7 For they have devoured Jacob ♦
and laid waste his dwelling place.
- 8 Remember not against us our former sins; ♦
let your compassion make haste to meet us,
for we are brought very low.
- 9 Help us, O God of our salvation, for the glory of your name; ♦
deliver us, and wipe away our sins for your name's sake.
- 10 Why should the heathen say, ♦
'Where is now their God?'

- 11 Let vengeance for your servants' blood that is shed ♦
be known among the nations in our sight.
- 12 Let the sorrowful sighing of the prisoners come before you, ♦
and by your mighty arm
preserve those who are condemned to die.
- 13 May the taunts with which our neighbours taunted you, Lord, ♦
return sevenfold into their bosom.
- 14 But we that are your people and the sheep of your pasture
will give you thanks for ever, ♦
and tell of your praise from generation to generation.

Psalm 80

- 1 Hear, O Shepherd of Israel, ♦
you that led Joseph like a flock;
- 2 Shine forth, you that are enthroned upon the cherubim, ♦
before Ephraim, Benjamin and Manasseh.
- 3 Stir up your mighty strength ♦
and come to our salvation.
- 4 *Turn us again, O God; ♦
show the light of your countenance, and we shall be saved.*
- 5 O Lord God of hosts, ♦
how long will you be angry at your people's prayer?
- 6 You feed them with the bread of tears; ♦
you give them abundance of tears to drink.
- 7 You have made us the derision of our neighbours, ♦
and our enemies laugh us to scorn.
- 8 *Turn us again, O God of hosts; ♦
show the light of your countenance, and we shall be saved.*
- 9 You brought a vine out of Egypt; ♦
you drove out the nations and planted it.
- 10 You made room around it, ♦
and when it had taken root, it filled the land.

- 11 The hills were covered with its shadow ♦
and the cedars of God by its boughs.
- 12 It stretched out its branches to the Sea ♦
and its tendrils to the River.
- 13 Why then have you broken down its wall, ♦
so that all who pass by pluck off its grapes?
- 14 The wild boar out of the wood tears it off, ♦
and all the insects of the field devour it.
- 15 Turn again, O God of hosts, ♦
look down from heaven and behold;
- 16 Cherish this vine which your right hand has planted, ♦
and the branch that you made so strong for yourself.
- 17 Let those who burnt it with fire, who cut it down, ♦
perish at the rebuke of your countenance.
- 18 Let your hand be upon the man at your right hand, ♦
the son of man you made so strong for yourself.
- 19 And so will we not go back from you; ♦
give us life, and we shall call upon your name.
- 20 *Turn us again, O Lord God of hosts; ♦
show the light of your countenance, and we shall be saved.*

Psalm 81

- 1 Sing merrily to God our strength, ♦
shout for joy to the God of Jacob.
- 2 Take up the song and sound the timbrel, ♦
the tuneful lyre with the harp.
- 3 Blow the trumpet at the new moon, ♦
as at the full moon, upon our solemn feast day.
- 4 For this is a statute for Israel, ♦
a law of the God of Jacob,
- 5 The charge he laid on the people of Joseph, ♦
when they came out of the land of Egypt.

- 6 I heard a voice I did not know, that said: ♦
‘I eased their shoulder from the burden;
their hands were set free from bearing the load.
- 7 ‘You called upon me in trouble and I delivered you; ♦
I answered you from the secret place of thunder
and proved you at the waters of Meribah.
- 8 ‘Hear, O my people, and I will admonish you: ♦
O Israel, if you would but listen to me!
- 9 ‘There shall be no strange god among you; ♦
you shall not worship a foreign god.
- 10 ‘I am the Lord your God,
who brought you up from the land of Egypt; ♦
open your mouth wide and I shall fill it.’
- 11 But my people would not hear my voice ♦
and Israel would not obey me.
- 12 So I sent them away in the stubbornness of their hearts, ♦
and let them walk after their own counsels.
- 13 O that my people would listen to me, ♦
that Israel would walk in my ways!
- 14 Then I should soon put down their enemies ♦
and turn my hand against their adversaries.
- 15 Those who hate the Lord would be humbled before him, ♦
and their punishment would last for ever.
- 16 But Israel would I feed with the finest wheat ♦
and with honey from the rock would I satisfy them.

Psalm 82

- 1 God has taken his stand in the council of heaven; ♦
in the midst of the gods he gives judgement:
- 2 ‘How long will you judge unjustly ♦
and show such favour to the wicked?
- 3 ‘You were to judge the weak and the orphan; ♦
defend the right of the humble and needy;

- 4 'Rescue the weak and the poor; ♦
deliver them from the hand of the wicked.
- 5 'They have no knowledge or wisdom;
they walk on still in darkness: ♦
all the foundations of the earth are shaken.
- 6 'Therefore I say that though you are gods ♦
and all of you children of the Most High,
- 7 'Nevertheless, you shall die like mortals ♦
and fall like one of their princes.'
- 8 Arise, O God and judge the earth, ♦
for it is you that shall take all nations for your possession.

Psalm 83

- 1 Hold not your peace, O God, do not keep silent; ♦
be not unmoved, O God;
- 2 For your enemies are in tumult ♦
and those who hate you lift up their heads.
- 3 They take secret counsel against your people ♦
and plot against those whom you treasure.
- 4 They say, 'Come, let us destroy them as a nation, ♦
that the name of Israel be remembered no more.'
- 5 They have conspired together with one mind; ♦
they are in league against you:
- 6 The tents of Edom and the Ishmaelites, ♦
Moab and the Hagarenes,
- 7 Gebal and Ammon and Amalek, ♦
the Philistines and those who dwell in Tyre.
- 8 Ashur also has joined them ♦
and has lent a strong arm to the children of Lot.
- 9 Do to them as you did to Midian, ♦
to Sisera and to Jabin at the river of Kishon,
- 10 Who perished at Endor ♦
and became as dung for the earth.
- 11 Make their commanders like Oreb and Zeëb, ♦
and all their princes like Zebah and Zalmunna,

- 12 Who said, 'Let us take for ourselves ♦
the pastures of God as our possession.'
- 13 O my God, make them like thistledown, ♦
like chaff before the wind.
- 14 Like fire that consumes a forest, ♦
like the flame that sets mountains ablaze,
- 15 So drive them with your tempest ♦
and dismay them with your storm.
- 16 Cover their faces with shame, O Lord, ♦
that they may seek your name.
- 17 Let them be disgraced and dismayed for ever; ♦
let them be put to confusion and perish;
- 18 And they shall know that you, whose name is the Lord, ♦
are alone the Most High over all the earth.

Psalm 84

- 1 How lovely is your dwelling place, O Lord of hosts! ♦
My soul has a desire and longing to enter the courts of the Lord;
my heart and my flesh rejoice in the living God.
- 2 The sparrow has found her a house
and the swallow a nest where she may lay her young: ♦
at your altars, O Lord of hosts, my King and my God.
- 3 Blessed are they who dwell in your house: ♦
they will always be praising you.
- 4 Blessed are those whose strength is in you, ♦
in whose heart are the highways to Zion,
- 5 Who going through the barren valley find there a spring, ♦
and the early rains will clothe it with blessing.
- 6 They will go from strength to strength ♦
and appear before God in Zion.
- 7 O Lord God of hosts, hear my prayer; ♦
listen, O God of Jacob.
- 8 Behold our defender, O God, ♦
and look upon the face of your anointed.

- 9 For one day in your courts ♦
is better than a thousand.
- 10 I would rather be a doorkeeper in the house of my God ♦
than dwell in the tents of ungodliness.
- 11 For the Lord God is both sun and shield;
he will give grace and glory; ♦
no good thing shall the Lord withhold
from those who walk with integrity.
- 12 O Lord God of hosts, ♦
blessed are those who put their trust in you.

Psalm 85

- 1 Lord, you were gracious to your land; ♦
you restored the fortunes of Jacob.
- 2 You forgave the offence of your people ♦
and covered all their sins.
- 3 You laid aside all your fury ♦
and turned from your wrathful indignation.
- 4 Restore us again, O God our Saviour, ♦
and let your anger cease from us.
- 5 Will you be displeasēd with us for ever? ♦
Will you stretch out your wrath from one generation to another?
- 6 Will you not give us life again, ♦
that your people may rejoice in you?
- 7 Show us your mercy, O Lord, ♦
and grant us your salvation.
- 8 I will listen to what the Lord God will say, ♦
for he shall speak peace to his people and to the faithful,
that they turn not again to folly.
- 9 Truly, his salvation is near to those who fear him, ♦
that his glory may dwell in our land.
- 10 Mercy and truth are met together, ♦
righteousness and peace have kissed each other;

- 11 Truth shall spring up from the earth ♦
and righteousness look down from heaven.
- 12 The Lord will indeed give all that is good, ♦
and our land will yield its increase.
- 13 Righteousness shall go before him ♦
and direct his steps in the way.

Psalm 86

- 1 Incline your ear, O Lord, and answer me, ♦
for I am poor and in misery.
- 2 Preserve my soul, for I am faithful; ♦
save your servant, for I put my trust in you.
- 3 Be merciful to me, O Lord, for you are my God; ♦
I call upon you all the day long.
- 4 Gladden the soul of your servant, ♦
for to you, O Lord, I lift up my soul.
- 5 For you, Lord, are good and forgiving, ♦
abounding in steadfast love to all who call upon you.
- 6 Give ear, O Lord, to my prayer ♦
and listen to the voice of my supplication.
- 7 In the day of my distress I will call upon you, ♦
for you will answer me.
- 8 Among the gods there is none like you, O Lord, ♦
nor any works like yours.
- 9 All nations you have made shall come and worship you, O Lord, ♦
and shall glorify your name.
- 10 For you are great and do wonderful things; ♦
you alone are God.
- 11 Teach me your way, O Lord, and I will walk in your truth; ♦
knit my heart to you, that I may fear your name.
- 12 I will thank you, O Lord my God, with all my heart, ♦
and glorify your name for evermore;
- 13 For great is your steadfast love towards me, ♦
for you have delivered my soul from the depths of the grave.

- 14 O God, the proud rise up against me
and a ruthless horde seek after my life; ♦
they have not set you before their eyes.
- 15 But you, Lord, are gracious and full of compassion, ♦
slow to anger and full of kindness and truth.
- 16 Turn to me and have mercy upon me; ♦
give your strength to your servant
and save the child of your handmaid.
- 17 Show me a token of your favour,
that those who hate me may see it and be ashamed; ♦
because you, O Lord, have helped and comforted me.

Psalm 87

- 1 His foundation is on the holy mountains. ♦
The Lord loves the gates of Zion
more than all the dwellings of Jacob.
- 2 Glorious things are spoken of you, ♦
Zion, city of our God.
- 3 I record Egypt and Babylon as those who know me; ♦
behold Philistia, Tyre and Ethiopia:
in Zion were they born.
- 4 And of Zion it shall be said, 'Each one was born in her, ♦
and the Most High himself has established her.'
- 5 The Lord will record as he writes up the peoples, ♦
'This one also was born there.'
- 6 And as they dance they shall sing, ♦
'All my fresh springs are in you.'

- 1 O Lord, God of my salvation, ♦
I have cried day and night before you.
- 2 Let my prayer come into your presence; ♦
incline your ear to my cry.
- 3 For my soul is full of troubles; ♦
my life draws near to the land of death.
- 4 I am counted as one gone down to the Pit; ♦
I am like one that has no strength,
- 5 Lost among the dead, ♦
like the slain who lie in the grave,
- 6 Whom you remember no more, ♦
for they are cut off from your hand.
- 7 You have laid me in the lowest pit, ♦
in a place of darkness in the abyss.
- 8 Your anger lies heavy upon me, ♦
and you have afflicted me with all your waves.
- 9 You have put my friends far from me ♦
and made me to be abhorred by them.
- 10 I am so fast in prison that I cannot get free; ♦
my eyes fail from all my trouble.
- 11 Lord, I have called daily upon you; ♦
I have stretched out my hands to you.
- 12 Do you work wonders for the dead? ♦
Will the shades stand up and praise you?
- 13 Shall your loving-kindness be declared in the grave, ♦
your faithfulness in the land of destruction?
- 14 Shall your wonders be known in the dark ♦
or your righteous deeds in the land where all is forgotten?
- 15 But as for me, O Lord, I will cry to you; ♦
early in the morning my prayer shall come before you.
- 16 Lord, why have you rejected my soul? ♦
Why have you hidden your face from me?

- 17 I have been wretched and at the point of death from my youth; ♦
I suffer your terrors and am no more seen.
- 18 Your wrath sweeps over me; ♦
your horrors are come to destroy me;
- 19 All day long they come about me like water; ♦
they close me in on every side.
- 20 Lover and friend have you put far from me ♦
and hid my companions out of my sight.

Psalm 89

- 1 My song shall be always of the loving-kindness of the Lord: ♦
with my mouth will I proclaim your faithfulness
throughout all generations.
- 2 I will declare that your love is established for ever; ♦
you have set your faithfulness as firm as the heavens.
- 3 For you said: 'I have made a covenant with my chosen one; ♦
I have sworn an oath to David my servant:
- 4 "Your seed will I establish for ever ♦
and build up your throne for all generations."'
- 5 The heavens praise your wonders, O Lord, ♦
and your faithfulness in the assembly of the holy ones;
- 6 For who among the clouds can be compared to the Lord? ♦
Who is like the Lord among the host of heaven?
- 7 A God feared in the council of the holy ones, ♦
great and terrible above all those round about him.
- 8 Who is like you, Lord God of hosts? ♦
Mighty Lord, your faithfulness is all around you.
- 9 You rule the raging of the sea; ♦
you still its waves when they arise.
- 10 You crushed Rahab with a deadly wound ♦
and scattered your enemies with your mighty arm.
- 11 Yours are the heavens; the earth also is yours; ♦
you established the world and all that fills it.

- 12 You created the north and the south; ♦
Tabor and Hermon rejoice in your name.
- 13 You have a mighty arm; ♦
strong is your hand and high is your right hand.
- 14 Righteousness and justice are the foundation of your throne; ♦
steadfast love and faithfulness go before your face.
- 15 Happy are the people who know the shout of triumph: ♦
they walk, O Lord, in the light of your countenance.
- 16 In your name they rejoice all the day long ♦
and are exalted in your righteousness.
- 17 For you are the glory of their strength, ♦
and in your favour you lift up our heads.
- 18 Truly the Lord is our shield; ♦
the Holy One of Israel is our king.
- 19 You spoke once in a vision and said to your faithful people: ♦
'I have set a youth above the mighty;
I have raised a young man over the people.
- 20 'I have found David my servant; ♦
with my holy oil have I anointed him.
- 21 'My hand shall hold him fast ♦
and my arm shall strengthen him.
- 22 'No enemy shall deceive him, ♦
nor any wicked person afflict him.
- 23 'I will strike down his foes before his face ♦
and beat down those that hate him.
- 24 'My truth also and my steadfast love shall be with him, ♦
and in my name shall his head be exalted.
- 25 'I will set his dominion upon the sea ♦
and his right hand upon the rivers.
- 26 'He shall call to me, "You are my Father, ♦
my God, and the rock of my salvation;"
- 27 'And I will make him my firstborn, ♦
the most high above the kings of the earth.
- 28 'The love I have pledged to him will I keep for ever, ♦
and my covenant will stand fast with him.

- 29 'His seed also will I make to endure for ever ♦
and his throne as the days of heaven.
- 30 'But if his children forsake my law ♦
and cease to walk in my judgements,
- 31 'If they break my statutes ♦
and do not keep my commandments,
- 32 'I will punish their offences with a rod ♦
and their sin with scourges.
- 33 'But I will not take from him my steadfast love ♦
nor suffer my truth to fail.
- 34 'My covenant will I not break ♦
nor alter what has gone out of my lips.
- 35 'Once for all have I sworn by my holiness ♦
that I will not prove false to David.
- 36 'His seed shall endure for ever ♦
and his throne as the sun before me;
- 37 'It shall stand fast for ever as the moon, ♦
the enduring witness in the heavens.'
- 38 But you have cast off and rejected your anointed; ♦
you have shown fierce anger against him.
- 39 You have broken the covenant with your servant, ♦
and have cast his crown to the dust.
- 40 You have broken down all his walls ♦
and laid his strongholds in ruins.
- 41 All who pass by despoil him, ♦
and he has become the scorn of his neighbours.
- 42 You have exalted the right hand of his foes ♦
and made all his enemies rejoice.
- 43 You have turned back the edge of his sword ♦
and have not upheld him in battle.
- 44 You have made an end of his radiance ♦
and cast his throne to the ground.
- 45 You have cut short the days of his youth ♦
and have covered him with shame.

- 46 How long will you hide yourself so utterly, O Lord? ♦
How long shall your anger burn like fire?
- 47 Remember how short my time is, ♦
how frail you have made all mortal flesh.
- 48 Which of the living shall not see death, ♦
and shall deliver their soul from the power of darkness?
- 49 Where, O Lord, is your steadfast love of old, ♦
which you swore to David in your faithfulness?
- 50 Remember, O Lord, how your servant is scorned, ♦
how I bear in my bosom the taunts of many peoples,
- 51 While your enemies mock, O Lord, ♦
while they mock the footsteps of your anointed.
- 52 Blessed be the Lord for evermore. ♦
Amen and Amen.

Psalm 90

- 1 Lord, you have been our refuge ♦
from one generation to another.
- 2 Before the mountains were brought forth,
or the earth and the world were formed, ♦
from everlasting to everlasting you are God.
- 3 You turn us back to dust and say: ♦
'Turn back, O children of earth.'
- 4 For a thousand years in your sight are but as yesterday, ♦
which passes like a watch in the night.
- 5 You sweep them away like a dream; ♦
they fade away suddenly like the grass.
- 6 In the morning it is green and flourishes; ♦
in the evening it is dried up and withered.
- 7 For we consume away in your displeasure; ♦
we are afraid at your wrathful indignation.
- 8 You have set our misdeeds before you ♦
and our secret sins in the light of your countenance.

- 9 When you are angry, all our days are gone; ♦
our years come to an end like a sigh.
- 10 The days of our life are three score years and ten,
or if our strength endures, even four score; ♦
yet the sum of them is but labour and sorrow,
for they soon pass away and we are gone.
- 11 Who regards the power of your wrath ♦
and your indignation like those who fear you?
- 12 So teach us to number our days ♦
that we may apply our hearts to wisdom.
- 13 Turn again, O Lord; how long will you delay? ♦
Have compassion on your servants.
- 14 Satisfy us with your loving-kindness in the morning, ♦
that we may rejoice and be glad all our days.
- 15 Give us gladness for the days you have afflicted us, ♦
and for the years in which we have seen adversity.
- 16 Show your servants your works, ♦
and let your glory be over their children.
- 17 May the gracious favour of the Lord our God be upon us; ♦
prosper our handiwork; O prosper the work of our hands.

Psalm 91

- 1 Whoever dwells in the shelter of the Most High ♦
and abides under the shadow of the Almighty,
- 2 Shall say to the Lord, 'My refuge and my stronghold, ♦
my God, in whom I put my trust.'
- 3 For he shall deliver you from the snare of the fowler ♦
and from the deadly pestilence.
- 4 He shall cover you with his wings
and you shall be safe under his feathers; ♦
his faithfulness shall be your shield and buckler.
- 5 You shall not be afraid of any terror by night, ♦
nor of the arrow that flies by day;
- 6 Of the pestilence that stalks in darkness, ♦
nor of the sickness that destroys at noonday.

- 7 Though a thousand fall at your side
and ten thousand at your right hand, ♦
yet it shall not come near you.
- 8 Your eyes have only to behold ♦
to see the reward of the wicked.
- 9 Because you have made the Lord your refuge ♦
and the Most High your stronghold,
- 10 There shall no evil happen to you, ♦
neither shall any plague come near your tent.
- 11 For he shall give his angels charge over you, ♦
to keep you in all your ways.
- 12 They shall bear you in their hands, ♦
lest you dash your foot against a stone.
- 13 You shall tread upon the lion and adder; ♦
the young lion and the serpent you shall trample underfoot.
- 14 Because they have set their love upon me,
therefore will I deliver them; ♦
I will lift them up, because they know my name.
- 15 They will call upon me and I will answer them; ♦
I am with them in trouble,
I will deliver them and bring them to honour.
- 16 With long life will I satisfy them ♦
and show them my salvation.

Psalm 92

- 1 It is a good thing to give thanks to the Lord ♦
and to sing praises to your name, O Most High;
- 2 To tell of your love early in the morning ♦
and of your faithfulness in the night-time,
- 3 Upon the ten-stringed instrument, upon the harp, ♦
and to the melody of the lyre.
- 4 For you, Lord, have made me glad by your acts, ♦
and I sing aloud at the works of your hands.
- 5 O Lord, how glorious are your works! ♦
Your thoughts are very deep.

- 6 The senseless do not know, ♦
nor do fools understand,
- 7 That though the wicked sprout like grass ♦
and all the workers of iniquity flourish,
- 8 It is only to be destroyed for ever; ♦
but you, O Lord, shall be exalted for evermore.
- 9 For lo, your enemies, O Lord,
lo, your enemies shall perish, ♦
and all the workers of iniquity shall be scattered.
- 10 But my horn you have exalted
like the horns of wild oxen; ♦
I am anointed with fresh oil.
- 11 My eyes will look down on my foes; ♦
my ears shall hear the ruin of the evildoers
who rise up against me.
- 12 The righteous shall flourish like a palm tree, ♦
and shall spread abroad like a cedar of Lebanon.
- 13 Such as are planted in the house of the Lord ♦
shall flourish in the courts of our God.
- 14 They shall still bear fruit in old age; ♦
they shall be vigorous and in full leaf;
- 15 That they may show that the Lord is true; ♦
he is my rock, ♦
and there is no unrighteousness in him.

- 1 The Lord is king and has put on glorious apparel; ♦
the Lord has put on his glory
and girded himself with strength.
- 2 He has made the whole world so sure ♦
that it cannot be moved.
- 3 Your throne has been established from of old; ♦
you are from everlasting.
- 4 The floods have lifted up, O Lord,
the floods have lifted up their voice; ♦
the floods lift up their pounding waves.
- 5 Mightier than the thunder of many waters,
mightier than the breakers of the sea, ♦
the Lord on high is mightier.
- 6 Your testimonies are very sure; ♦
holiness adorns your house, O Lord, for ever.

Psalm 94

- 1 Lord God to whom vengeance belongs, ♦
O God to whom vengeance belongs, shine out in majesty.
- 2 Rise up, O Judge of the earth; ♦
give the arrogant their just deserts.
- 3 Lord, how long shall the wicked, ♦
how long shall the wicked triumph?
- 4 How long shall the evildoers boast ♦
and pour out such impudent words?
- 5 They crush your people, O Lord, ♦
and afflict your heritage.
- 6 They murder the widow and the stranger; ♦
the orphans they put to death.
- 7 And yet they say, 'The Lord will not see, ♦
neither shall the God of Jacob regard it.'
- 8 Consider, most stupid of people; ♦
you fools, when will you understand?

- 9 He that planted the ear, shall he not hear? ♦
He that formed the eye, shall he not see?
- 10 He who corrects the nations, shall he not punish? ♦
He who teaches the peoples, does he lack knowledge?
- 11 The Lord knows every human thought, ♦
that they are but a breath.
- 12 Blessed are those whom you chasten, O Lord, ♦
whom you instruct from your law;
- 13 That you may give them rest in days of adversity, ♦
until a pit is dug for the wicked.
- 14 For the Lord will not fail his people, ♦
neither will he forsake his inheritance.
- 15 For justice shall return to the righteous, ♦
and all that are true of heart shall follow it.
- 16 Who will rise up for me against the wicked? ♦
Who will take my part against the evildoers?
- 17 If the Lord had not helped me, ♦
my soul would soon have been put to silence.
- 18 And when I said, 'My foot has slipped', ♦
your loving mercy, O Lord, upheld me.
- 19 In the multitude of cares that troubled my heart, ♦
your comforts have refreshed my soul.
- 20 Will you have anything to do with the throne of wickedness, ♦
which fashions evil through its law?
- 21 They gather together against the life of the righteous ♦
and condemn the innocent to death.
- 22 But the Lord has become my stronghold ♦
and my God the rock of my trust.
- 23 He will turn against them their own wickedness
and silence them through their own malice; ♦
the Lord our God will put them to silence.

- 1 O come, let us sing to the Lord; ♦
let us heartily rejoice in the rock of our salvation.
- 2 Let us come into his presence with thanksgiving ♦
and be glad in him with psalms.
- 3 For the Lord is a great God ♦
and a great king above all gods.
- 4 In his hand are the depths of the earth ♦
and the heights of the mountains are his also.
- 5 The sea is his, for he made it, ♦
and his hands have moulded the dry land.
- 6 Come, let us worship and bow down ♦
and kneel before the Lord our Maker.
- 7 For he is our God; ♦
we are the people of his pasture and the sheep of his hand.

- 8 O that today you would listen to his voice: ♦
'Harden not your hearts as at Meribah,
on that day at Massah in the wilderness,
- 9 'When your forebears tested me, and put me to the proof, ♦
though they had seen my works.
- 10 'Forty years long I detested that generation and said, ♦
'This people are wayward in their hearts;
they do not know my ways.'
- 11 'So I swore in my wrath, ♦
'They shall not enter into my rest.' '

- 1 Sing to the Lord a new song; ♦
sing to the Lord, all the earth.
- 2 Sing to the Lord and bless his name; ♦
tell out his salvation from day to day.
- 3 Declare his glory among the nations ♦
and his wonders among all peoples.
- 4 For great is the Lord and greatly to be praised; ♦
he is more to be feared than all gods.
- 5 For all the gods of the nations are but idols; ♦
it is the Lord who made the heavens.
- 6 Honour and majesty are before him; ♦
power and splendour are in his sanctuary.
- 7 Ascribe to the Lord, you families of the peoples; ♦
ascribe to the Lord honour and strength.
- 8 Ascribe to the Lord the honour due to his name; ♦
bring offerings and come into his courts.
- 9 O worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness; ♦
let the whole earth tremble before him.
- 10 Tell it out among the nations that the Lord is king. ♦
He has made the world so firm that it cannot be moved;
he will judge the peoples with equity.
- 11 Let the heavens rejoice and let the earth be glad; ♦
let the sea thunder and all that is in it;
- 12 Let the fields be joyful and all that is in them; ♦
let all the trees of the wood shout for joy before the Lord.
- 13 For he comes, he comes to judge the earth; ♦
with righteousness he will judge the world
and the peoples with his truth.

- 1 The Lord is king; let the earth rejoice; ♦
let the multitude of the isles be glad.
- 2 Clouds and darkness are round about him; ♦
righteousness and justice are the foundation of his throne.
- 3 Fire goes before him ♦
and burns up his enemies on every side.
- 4 His lightnings lit up the world; ♦
the earth saw it and trembled.
- 5 The mountains melted like wax at the presence of the Lord, ♦
at the presence of the Lord of the whole earth.
- 6 The heavens declared his righteousness, ♦
and all the peoples have seen his glory.
- 7 Confounded be all who worship carved images
and delight in mere idols. ♦
Bow down before him, all you gods.
- 8 Zion heard and was glad, and the daughters of Judah rejoiced, ♦
because of your judgements, O Lord.
- 9 For you, Lord, are most high over all the earth; ♦
you are exalted far above all gods.
- 10 The Lord loves those who hate evil; ♦
he preserves the lives of his faithful
and delivers them from the hand of the wicked.
- 11 Light has sprung up for the righteous ♦
and joy for the true of heart.
- 12 Rejoice in the Lord, you righteous, ♦
and give thanks to his holy name.

- 1 Sing to the Lord a new song, ♦
for he has done marvellous things.
- 2 His own right hand and his holy arm ♦
have won for him the victory.
- 3 The Lord has made known his salvation; ♦
his deliverance has he openly shown in the sight of the nations.
- 4 He has remembered his mercy and faithfulness
towards the house of Israel, ♦
and all the ends of the earth have seen the salvation of our God.

- 5 Sound praises to the Lord, all the earth; ♦
break into singing and make music.
- 6 Make music to the Lord with the lyre, ♦
with the lyre and the voice of melody.
- 7 With trumpets and the sound of the horn ♦
sound praises before the Lord, the King.

- 8 Let the sea thunder and all that fills it, ♦
the world and all that dwell upon it.
- 9 Let the rivers clap their hands ♦
and let the hills ring out together before the Lord,
for he comes to judge the earth.
- 10 In righteousness shall he judge the world ♦
and the peoples with equity.

Psalm 99

- 1 The Lord is king: let the peoples tremble; ♦
he is enthroned above the cherubim: let the earth shake.
- 2 The Lord is great in Zion ♦
and high above all peoples.
- 3 Let them praise your name, which is great and awesome; ♦
the Lord our God is holy.
- 4 Mighty king, who loves justice,
you have established equity; ♦
you have executed justice and righteousness in Jacob.
- 5 *Exalt the Lord our God; ♦
bow down before his footstool, for he is holy.*
- 6 Moses and Aaron among his priests
and Samuel among those who call upon his name; ♦
they called upon the Lord and he answered them.
- 7 He spoke to them out of the pillar of cloud; ♦
they kept his testimonies and the law that he gave them.
- 8 You answered them, O Lord our God; ♦
you were a God who forgave them
and pardoned them for their offences.
- 9 *Exalt the Lord our God
and worship him upon his holy hill, ♦
for the Lord our God is holy.*

Psalm 100

- 1 O be joyful in the Lord, all the earth; ♦
serve the Lord with gladness
and come before his presence with a song.
- 2 Know that the Lord is God; ♦
it is he that has made us and we are his;
we are his people and the sheep of his pasture.
- 3 Enter his gates with thanksgiving
and his courts with praise; ♦
give thanks to him and bless his name.
- 4 For the Lord is gracious; his steadfast love is everlasting, ♦
and his faithfulness endures from generation to generation.

- 1 I will sing of faithfulness and justice; ♦
to you, O Lord, will I sing.
- 2 Let me be wise in the way that is perfect: ♦
when will you come to me?
- 3 I will walk with purity of heart ♦
within the walls of my house.
- 4 I will not set before my eyes ♦
a counsel that is evil.
- 5 I abhor the deeds of unfaithfulness; ♦
they shall not cling to me.
- 6 A crooked heart shall depart from me; ♦
I will not know a wicked person.
- 7 One who slanders a neighbour in secret ♦
I will quickly put to silence.
- 8 Haughty eyes and an arrogant heart ♦
I will not endure.
- 9 My eyes are upon the faithful in the land, ♦
that they may dwell with me.
- 10 One who walks in the way that is pure ♦
shall be my servant.
- 11 There shall not dwell in my house ♦
one that practises deceit.
- 12 One who utters falsehood ♦
shall not continue in my sight.
- 13 Morning by morning will I put to silence ♦
all the wicked in the land,
- 14 To cut off from the city of the Lord ♦
all those who practise evil.

- 1 O Lord, hear my prayer ♦
and let my crying come before you.
- 2 Hide not your face from me ♦
in the day of my distress.
- 3 Incline your ear to me; ♦
when I call, make haste to answer me,
- 4 For my days are consumed in smoke ♦
and my bones burn away as in a furnace.
- 5 My heart is smitten down and withered like grass, ♦
so that I forget to eat my bread.
- 6 From the sound of my groaning ♦
my bones cleave fast to my skin.
- 7 I am become like a vulture in the wilderness, ♦
like an owl that haunts the ruins.
- 8 I keep watch and am become like a sparrow ♦
solitary upon the housetop.
- 9 My enemies revile me all the day long, ♦
and those who rage at me have sworn together against me.
- 10 I have eaten ashes for bread ♦
and mingled my drink with weeping,
- 11 Because of your indignation and wrath, ♦
for you have taken me up and cast me down.
- 12 My days fade away like a shadow, ♦
and I am withered like grass.
- 13 But you, O Lord, shall endure for ever ♦
and your name through all generations.
- 14 You will arise and have pity on Zion; ♦
it is time to have mercy upon her;
surely the time has come.
- 15 For your servants love her very stones ♦
and feel compassion for her dust.

- 16 Then shall the nations fear your name, O Lord, ♦
and all the kings of the earth your glory,
- 17 When the Lord has built up Zion ♦
and shown himself in glory;
- 18 When he has turned to the prayer of the destitute ♦
and has not despised their plea.
- 19 This shall be written for those that come after, ♦
and a people yet unborn shall praise the Lord.
- 20 For he has looked down from his holy height; ♦
from the heavens he beheld the earth,
- 21 That he might hear the sighings of the prisoner ♦
and set free those condemned to die;
- 22 That the name of the Lord may be proclaimed in Zion ♦
and his praises in Jerusalem,
- 23 When peoples are gathered together ♦
and kingdoms also, to serve the Lord.
- 24 He has brought down my strength in my journey ♦
and has shortened my days.
- 25 I pray, 'O my God, do not take me in the midst of my days; ♦
your years endure throughout all generations.
- 26 'In the beginning you laid the foundations of the earth, ♦
and the heavens are the work of your hands;
- 27 'They shall perish, but you will endure; ♦
they all shall wear out like a garment.
- 28 'You change them like clothing, and they shall be changed; ♦
but you are the same, and your years will not fail.
- 29 'The children of your servants shall continue, ♦
and their descendants shall be established in your sight.'

- 1 Bless the Lord, O my soul, ♦
and all that is within me bless his holy name.
- 2 Bless the Lord, O my soul, ♦
and forget not all his benefits;
- 3 Who forgives all your sins ♦
and heals all your infirmities;
- 4 Who redeems your life from the Pit ♦
and crowns you with faithful love and compassion;
- 5 Who satisfies you with good things, ♦
so that your youth is renewed like an eagle's.

- 6 The Lord executes righteousness ♦
and judgement for all who are oppressed.
- 7 He made his ways known to Moses ♦
and his works to the children of Israel.
- 8 The Lord is full of compassion and mercy, ♦
slow to anger and of great kindness.
- 9 He will not always accuse us, ♦
neither will he keep his anger for ever.
- 10 He has not dealt with us according to our sins, ♦
nor rewarded us according to our wickedness.
- 11 For as the heavens are high above the earth, ♦
so great is his mercy upon those who fear him.
- 12 As far as the east is from the west, ♦
so far has he set our sins from us.
- 13 As a father has compassion on his children, ♦
so is the Lord merciful towards those who fear him.
- 14 For he knows of what we are made; ♦
he remembers that we are but dust.
- 15 Our days are but as grass; ♦
we flourish as a flower of the field;
- 16 For as soon as the wind goes over it, it is gone, ♦
and its place shall know it no more.

- 17 But the merciful goodness of the Lord is from of old
and endures for ever on those who fear him, ♦
and his righteousness on children's children;
- 18 On those who keep his covenant ♦
and remember his commandments to do them.
- 19 The Lord has established his throne in heaven, ♦
and his kingdom has dominion over all.
- 20 Bless the Lord, you angels of his, ♦
you mighty ones who do his bidding
and hearken to the voice of his word.
- 21 Bless the Lord, all you his hosts, ♦
you ministers of his who do his will.
- 22 Bless the Lord, all you works of his,
in all places of his dominion; ♦
bless the Lord, O my soul.

Psalm 104

- 1 Bless the Lord, O my soul. ♦
O Lord my God, how excellent is your greatness!
- 2 You are clothed with majesty and honour, ♦
wrapped in light as in a garment.
- 3 You spread out the heavens like a curtain ♦
and lay the beams of your dwelling place in the waters above.
- 4 You make the clouds your chariot ♦
and ride on the wings of the wind.
- 5 You make the winds your messengers ♦
and flames of fire your servants.
- 6 You laid the foundations of the earth, ♦
that it never should move at any time.
- 7 You covered it with the deep like a garment; ♦
the waters stood high above the hills.
- 8 At your rebuke they fled; ♦
at the voice of your thunder they hastened away.

- 9 They rose up to the hills and flowed down to the valleys beneath, ♦
to the place which you had appointed for them.
- 10 You have set them their bounds that they should not pass, ♦
nor turn again to cover the earth.
- 11 You send the springs into the brooks, ♦
which run among the hills.
- 12 They give drink to every beast of the field, ♦
and the wild asses quench their thirst.
- 13 Beside them the birds of the air make their nests ♦
and sing among the branches.
- 14 You water the hills from your dwelling on high; ♦
the earth is filled with the fruit of your works.
- 15 You make grass to grow for the cattle ♦
and plants to meet our needs,
- 16 Bringing forth food from the earth ♦
and wine to gladden our hearts,
- 17 Oil to give us a cheerful countenance ♦
and bread to strengthen our hearts.
- 18 The trees of the Lord are full of sap, ♦
the cedars of Lebanon which he planted,
- 19 In which the birds build their nests, ♦
while the fir trees are a dwelling for the stork.
- 20 The mountains are a refuge for the wild goats ♦
and the stony cliffs for the conies.
- 21 You appointed the moon to mark the seasons, ♦
and the sun knows the time for its setting.
- 22 You make darkness that it may be night, ♦
in which all the beasts of the forest creep forth.
- 23 The lions roar for their prey ♦
and seek their food from God.
- 24 The sun rises and they are gone ♦
to lay themselves down in their dens.
- 25 People go forth to their work ♦
and to their labour until the evening.

- 26 O Lord, how manifold are your works! ♦
In wisdom you have made them all;
the earth is full of your creatures.
- 27 There is the sea, spread far and wide, ♦
and there move creatures beyond number, both small and great.
- 28 There go the ships, and there is that Leviathan ♦
which you have made to play in the deep.
- 29 All of these look to you ♦
to give them their food in due season.
- 30 When you give it them, they gather it; ♦
you open your hand and they are filled with good.
- 31 When you hide your face they are troubled; ♦
when you take away their breath,
they die and return again to the dust.
- 32 When you send forth your spirit, they are created, ♦
and you renew the face of the earth.
- 33 May the glory of the Lord endure for ever; ♦
may the Lord rejoice in his works;
- 34 He looks on the earth and it trembles; ♦
he touches the mountains and they smoke.
- 35 I will sing to the Lord as long as I live; ♦
I will make music to my God while I have my being.
- 36 So shall my song please him ♦
while I rejoice in the Lord.
- 37 Let sinners be consumed out of the earth
and the wicked be no more. ♦
Bless the Lord, O my soul.
Alleluia.

- 1 O give thanks to the Lord and call upon his name; ♦
make known his deeds among the peoples.
- 2 Sing to him, sing praises, ♦
and tell of all his marvellous works.
- 3 Rejoice in the praise of his holy name; ♦
let the hearts of them rejoice who seek the Lord.
- 4 Seek the Lord and his strength; ♦
seek his face continually.
- 5 Remember the marvels he has done, ♦
his wonders and the judgements of his mouth,
- 6 O seed of Abraham his servant, ♦
O children of Jacob his chosen.
- 7 He is the Lord our God; ♦
his judgements are in all the earth.
- 8 He has always been mindful of his covenant, ♦
the promise that he made for a thousand generations:
- 9 The covenant he made with Abraham, ♦
the oath that he swore to Isaac,
- 10 Which he established as a statute for Jacob, ♦
an everlasting covenant for Israel,
- 11 Saying, 'To you will I give the land of Canaan ♦
to be the portion of your inheritance.'
- 12 When they were but few in number, ♦
of little account, and sojourners in the land,
- 13 Wandering from nation to nation, ♦
from one kingdom to another people,
- 14 He suffered no one to do them wrong ♦
and rebuked even kings for their sake,
- 15 Saying, 'Touch not my anointed ♦
and do my prophets no harm.'
- 16 Then he called down famine over the land ♦
and broke every staff of bread.

- 17 But he had sent a man before them, ♦
Joseph, who was sold as a slave.
- 18 They shackled his feet with fetters; ♦
his neck was ringed with iron.
- 19 Until all he foretold came to pass, ♦
the word of the Lord tested him.
- 20 The king sent and released him; ♦
the ruler of peoples set him free.
- 21 He appointed him lord of his household ♦
and ruler of all he possessed,
- 22 To instruct his princes as he willed ♦
and to teach his counsellors wisdom.
- 23 Then Israel came into Egypt; ♦
Jacob sojourned in the land of Ham.
- 24 And the Lord made his people exceedingly fruitful; ♦
he made them too many for their adversaries,
- 25 Whose heart he turned, so that they hated his people ♦
and dealt craftily with his servants.
- 26 Then sent he Moses his servant ♦
and Aaron whom he had chosen.
- 27 He showed his signs through their word ♦
and his wonders in the land of Ham.
- 28 He sent darkness and it grew dark; ♦
yet they did not heed his words.
- 29 He turned their waters into blood ♦
and slew all their fish.
- 30 Their land swarmed with frogs, ♦
even in their kings' chambers.
- 31 He spoke the word, and there came clouds of flies, ♦
swarms of gnats within all their borders.
- 32 He gave them hailstones for rain ♦
and flames of lightning in their land.
- 33 He blasted their vines and their fig trees ♦
and shattered trees across their country.

- 34 He spoke the word, and the grasshoppers came ♦
and young locusts without number;
- 35 They ate every plant in their land ♦
and devoured the fruit of their soil.
- 36 He smote all the firstborn in their land, ♦
the first fruits of all their strength.
- 37 Then he brought them out with silver and gold; ♦
there was not one among their tribes that stumbled.
- 38 Egypt was glad at their departing, ♦
for a dread of them had fallen upon them.
- 39 He spread out a cloud for a covering ♦
and a fire to light up the night.
- 40 They asked and he brought them quails; ♦
he satisfied them with the bread of heaven.
- 41 He opened the rock, and the waters gushed out ♦
and ran in the dry places like a river.
- 42 For he remembered his holy word ♦
and Abraham, his servant.
- 43 So he brought forth his people with joy, ♦
his chosen ones with singing.
- 44 He gave them the lands of the nations ♦
and they took possession of the fruit of their toil,
- 45 That they might keep his statutes ♦
and faithfully observe his laws.
- Alleluia.

Psalm 106

- 1 Alleluia.
Give thanks to the Lord, for he is gracious, ♦
for his faithfulness endures for ever.
- 2 Who can express the mighty acts of the Lord ♦
or show forth all his praise?
- 3 Blessed are those who observe what is right ♦
and always do what is just.

- 4 Remember me, O Lord, in the favour you bear for your people; ♦
visit me in the day of your salvation;
- 5 That I may see the prosperity of your chosen
and rejoice in the gladness of your people, ♦
and exult with your inheritance.
- 6 We have sinned like our forebears; ♦
we have done wrong and dealt wickedly.
- 7 In Egypt they did not consider your wonders,
nor remember the abundance of your faithful love; ♦
they rebelled against the Most High at the Red Sea.
- 8 But he saved them for his name's sake, ♦
that he might make his power to be known.
- 9 He rebuked the Red Sea and it was dried up; ♦
so he led them through the deep as through the wilderness.
- 10 He saved them from the adversary's hand ♦
and redeemed them from the hand of the enemy.
- 11 As for those that troubled them, the waters overwhelmed them; ♦
there was not one of them left.
- 12 Then they believed his words ♦
and sang aloud his praise.
- 13 But soon they forgot his deeds ♦
and would not wait for his counsel.
- 14 A craving seized them in the wilderness, ♦
and they put God to the test in the desert.
- 15 He gave them their desire, ♦
but sent a wasting sickness among them.
- 16 They grew jealous of Moses in the camp ♦
and of Aaron, the holy one of the Lord.
- 17 So the earth opened and swallowed up Dathan ♦
and covered the company of Abiram.
- 18 A fire was kindled in their company; ♦
the flame burnt up the wicked.
- 19 They made a calf at Horeb ♦
and worshipped the molten image;

- 20 Thus they exchanged their glory ♦
for the image of an ox that feeds on hay.
- 21 They forgot God their saviour, ♦
who had done such great things in Egypt,
- 22 Wonderful deeds in the land of Ham ♦
and fearful things at the Red Sea.
- 23 So he would have destroyed them,
had not Moses his chosen stood before him in the breach, ♦
to turn away his wrath from consuming them.
- 24 Then they scorned the Promised Land ♦
and would not believe his word,
- 25 But murmured in their tents ♦
and would not heed the voice of the Lord.
- 26 So he lifted his hand against them ♦
and swore to overthrow them in the wilderness,
- 27 To disperse their descendants among the nations, ♦
and to scatter them throughout the lands.
- 28 They joined themselves to the Baal of Peor ♦
and ate sacrifices offered to the dead.
- 29 They provoked him to anger with their evil deeds ♦
and a plague broke out among them.
- 30 Then Phinehas stood up and interceded ♦
and so the plague was stayed.
- 31 This was counted to him for righteousness ♦
throughout all generations for ever.
- 32 They angered him also at the waters of Meribah, ♦
so that Moses suffered for their sake;
- 33 For they so embittered his spirit ♦
that he spoke rash words with his lips.
- 34 They did not destroy the peoples ♦
as the Lord had commanded them.
- 35 They mingled with the nations ♦
and learned to follow their ways,
- 36 So that they worshipped their idols, ♦
which became to them a snare.

- 37 Their own sons and daughters ♦
they sacrificed to evil spirits.
- 38 They shed innocent blood, ♦
the blood of their sons and daughters,
- 39 Which they offered to the idols of Canaan, ♦
and the land was defiled with blood.
- 40 Thus were they polluted by their actions, ♦
and in their wanton deeds went whoring after other gods.
- 41 Therefore was the wrath of the Lord
kindled against his people, ♦
and he abhorred his inheritance.
- 42 He gave them over to the hand of the nations, ♦
and those who hated them ruled over them.
- 43 So their enemies oppressed them ♦
and put them in subjection under their hand.
- 44 Many a time did he deliver them,
but they rebelled through their own devices ♦
and were brought down through their wickedness.
- 45 Nevertheless, he saw their adversity, ♦
when he heard their lamentation.
- 46 He remembered his covenant with them ♦
and relented according to the greatness of his faithful love.
- 47 He made them also to be pitied ♦
by all who had taken them captive.
- 48 Save us, O Lord our God,
and gather us from among the nations, ♦
that we may give thanks to your holy name
and glory in your praise.
- 49 Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel,
from everlasting and to everlasting; ♦
and let all the people say, Amen.
Alleluia.

- 1 O give thanks to the Lord, for he is gracious, ♦
for his steadfast love endures for ever.
- 2 Let the redeemed of the Lord say this, ♦
those he redeemed from the hand of the enemy,
- 3 And gathered out of the lands
from the east and from the west, ♦
from the north and from the south.
- 4 Some went astray in desert wastes ♦
and found no path to a city to dwell in.
- 5 Hungry and thirsty, ♦
their soul was fainting within them.
- 6 So they cried to the Lord in their trouble ♦
and he delivered them from their distress.
- 7 He set their feet on the right way ♦
till they came to a city to dwell in.
- 8 *Let them give thanks to the Lord for his goodness ♦
and the wonders he does for his children.*
- 9 *For he satisfies the longing soul ♦
and fills the hungry soul with good.*
- 10 Some sat in darkness and in the shadow of death, ♦
bound fast in misery and iron,
- 11 For they had rebelled against the words of God ♦
and despised the counsel of the Most High.
- 12 So he bowed down their heart with heaviness; ♦
they stumbled and there was none to help them.
- 13 Then they cried to the Lord in their trouble, ♦
and he delivered them from their distress.
- 14 He brought them out of darkness and out of the shadow of death, ♦
and broke their bonds asunder.
- 15 *Let them give thanks to the Lord for his goodness ♦
and the wonders he does for his children.*
- 16 *For he has broken the doors of bronze ♦
and breaks the bars of iron in pieces.*

- 17 Some were foolish and took a rebellious way, ♦
and were plagued because of their wrongdoing.
- 18 Their soul abhorred all manner of food ♦
and drew near to the gates of death.
- 19 Then they cried to the Lord in their trouble, ♦
and he delivered them from their distress.
- 20 He sent forth his word and healed them, ♦
and saved them from destruction.
- 21 *Let them give thanks to the Lord for his goodness ♦
and the wonders he does for his children.*
- 22 *Let them offer him sacrifices of thanksgiving ♦
and tell of his acts with shouts of joy.*
- 23 Those who go down to the sea in ships ♦
and ply their trade in great waters,
- 24 These have seen the works of the Lord ♦
and his wonders in the deep.
- 25 For at his word the stormy wind arose ♦
and lifted up the waves of the sea.
- 26 They were carried up to the heavens
and down again to the deep; ♦
their soul melted away in their peril.
- 27 They reeled and staggered like a drunkard ♦
and were at their wits' end.
- 28 Then they cried to the Lord in their trouble, ♦
and he brought them out of their distress.
- 29 He made the storm be still ♦
and the waves of the sea were calmed.
- 30 Then were they glad because they were at rest, ♦
and he brought them to the haven they desired.
- 31 *Let them give thanks to the Lord for his goodness ♦
and the wonders he does for his children.*
- 32 *Let them exalt him in the congregation of the people ♦
and praise him in the council of the elders.*

- 33 The Lord turns rivers into wilderness ♦
and water springs into thirsty ground;
- 34 A fruitful land he makes a salty waste, ♦
because of the wickedness of those who dwell there.
- 35 He makes the wilderness a pool of water ♦
and water springs out of a thirsty land.
- 36 There he settles the hungry ♦
and they build a city to dwell in.
- 37 They sow fields and plant vineyards ♦
and bring in a fruitful harvest.
- 38 He blesses them, so that they multiply greatly; ♦
he does not let their herds of cattle decrease.
- 39 He pours contempt on princes ♦
and makes them wander in trackless wastes.
- 40 They are diminished and brought low, ♦
through stress of misfortune and sorrow,
- 41 But he raises the poor from their misery ♦
and multiplies their families like flocks of sheep.
- 42 The upright will see this and rejoice, ♦
but all wickedness will shut its mouth.
- 43 Whoever is wise will ponder these things ♦
and consider the loving-kindness of the Lord.

Psalm 108

- 1 My heart is ready, O God, my heart is ready; ♦
I will sing and give you praise.
- 2 Awake, my soul; awake, harp and lyre, ♦
that I may awaken the dawn.
- 3 I will give you thanks, O Lord, among the peoples; ♦
I will sing praise to you among the nations.
- 4 For your loving-kindness is as high as the heavens ♦
and your faithfulness reaches to the clouds.
- 5 Be exalted, O God, above the heavens ♦
and your glory over all the earth.

- 6 That your beloved may be delivered, ♦
save us by your right hand and answer me.
- 7 God has spoken in his holiness: ♦
'I will triumph and divide Shechem
and share out the valley of Succoth.

- 147 Early in the morning I cry to you, ♦
for in your word is my trust.
- 148 My eyes are open before the night watches, ♦
that I may meditate on your word.
- 149 Hear my voice, O Lord, according to your faithful love; ♦
according to your judgement, give me life.
- 150 They draw near that in malice persecute me, ♦
who are far from your law.
- 151 You, O Lord, are near at hand, ♦
and all your commandments are true.
- 152 Long have I known of your testimonies, ♦
that you have founded them for ever.

- 4 The sharp arrows of a warrior, ♦
tempered in burning coals!
- 5 Woe is me, that I must lodge in Meshech ♦
and dwell among the tents of Kedar.
- 6 My soul has dwelt too long ♦

- 7 I am for making peace, ♦
but when I speak of it, they make ready for war.

Psalm 121

- 1 I lift up my eyes to the hills; ♦
from where is my help to come?
- 2 My help comes from the Lord, ♦
the maker of heaven and earth.
- 3 He will not suffer your foot to stumble; ♦

shall neither slumber nor sleep.
- 5 The Lord himself watches over you; ♦
the Lord is your shade at your right hand,
- 6 So that the sun shall not strike you by day, ♦

- 7 The Lord shall keep you from all evil; ♦
it is he who shall keep your soul.
- 8 The Lord shall keep watch over your going out
and your coming in, ♦
from this time forth for evermore.

Psalm 122

- 1 I was glad when they said to me, ♦
'Let us go to the house of the Lord.'
- 2 And now our feet are standing ♦
within your gates, O Jerusalem;
- 3 Jerusalem, built as a city ♦
that is at unity in itself.
- 4 Thither the tribes go up, the tribes of the Lord, ♦
as is decreed for Israel,
to give thanks to the name of the Lord.
- 5 For there are set the thrones of judgement, ♦
the thrones of the house of David.

- 6 O pray for the peace of Jerusalem: ♦
'May they prosper who love you.
- 7 'Peace be within your walls ♦
and tranquillity within your palaces.'
- 8 For my kindred and companions' sake, ♦
I will pray that peace be with you.
- 9 For the sake of the house of the Lord our God, ♦
I will seek to do you good.

Psalm 123

- 1 To you I lift up my eyes, ♦
to you that are enthroned in the heavens.
- 2 As the eyes of servants look to the hand of their master, ♦
or the eyes of a maid to the hand of her mistress,
- 3 So our eyes wait upon the Lord our God, ♦
until he have mercy upon us.
- 4 Have mercy upon us, O Lord, have mercy upon us, ♦
for we have had more than enough of contempt.
- 5 Our soul has had more than enough of the scorn of the arrogant, ♦
and of the contempt of the proud.

Psalm 124

- 1 If the Lord himself had not been on our side, ♦
now may Israel say;
- 2 If the Lord had not been on our side, ♦
when enemies rose up against us;

will come back with shouts of joy,
bearing their sheaves with them.

Psalm 127

- 1 Unless the Lord builds the house, ♦
those who build it labour in vain.
- 2 Unless the Lord keeps the city, ♦
the guard keeps watch in vain.
- 3 It is in vain that you hasten to rise up early
and go so late to rest, eating the bread of toil, ♦
for he gives his beloved sleep.
- 4 Children are a heritage from the Lord ♦
and the fruit of the womb is his gift.
- 5 Like arrows in the hand of a warrior, ♦
so are the children of one's youth.
- 6 Happy are those who have their quiver full of them: ♦
they shall not be put to shame
when they dispute with their enemies in the gate.

Psalm 128

- 1 Blessed are all those who fear the Lord, ♦
and walk in his ways.
- 2 You shall eat the fruit of the toil of your hands; ♦
it shall go well with you, and happy shall you be.
- 3 Your wife within your house
shall be like a fruitful vine; ♦
your children round your table,
like fresh olive branches.

- 4 Thus shall the one be blest ♦
who fears the Lord.
- 5 The Lord from out of Zion bless you, ♦
that you may see Jerusalem in prosperity
all the days of your life.
- 6 May you see your children's children, ♦
and may there be peace upon Israel.

Psalm 129

- 1 'Many a time have they fought against me from my youth,' ♦
may Israel now say;
- 2 'Many a time have they fought against me from my youth, ♦
but they have not prevailed against me.'
- 3 The ploughers ploughed upon my back ♦
and made their furrows long.
- 4 But the righteous Lord ♦
has cut the cords of the wicked in pieces.
- 5 Let them be put to shame and turned backwards, ♦
as many as are enemies of Zion.
- 6 Let them be like grass upon the housetops, ♦
which withers before it can grow,
- 7 So that no reaper can fill his hand, ♦
nor a binder of sheaves his bosom;
- 8 And none who go by may say,
'The blessing of the Lord be upon you. ♦
We bless you in the name of the Lord.'

Psalm 130

- 1 Out of the depths have I cried to you, O Lord;
Lord, hear my voice; ♦
let your ears consider well the voice of my supplication.
- 2 If you, Lord, were to mark what is done amiss, ♦
O Lord, who could stand?
- 3 But there is forgiveness with you, ♦
so that you shall be feared.
- 4 I wait for the Lord; my soul waits for him; ♦
in his word is my hope.
- 5 My soul waits for the Lord,
more than the night watch for the morning, ♦
more than the night watch for the morning.
- 6 O Israel, wait for the Lord, ♦
for with the Lord there is mercy;
- 7 With him is plenteous redemption ♦
and he shall redeem Israel from all their sins.

Psalm 131

- 1 Lord, remember for David ♦
all the hardships he endured;
- 2 How he swore an oath to the Lord ♦
and vowed a vow to the Mighty One of Jacob:
- 3 'I will not come within the shelter of my house, ♦
nor climb up into my bed;
- 4 'I will not allow my eyes to sleep, ♦
nor let my eyelids slumber,
- 5 'Until I find a place for the Lord, ♦
a dwelling for the Mighty One of Jacob.'

- 6 Now, we heard of the ark in Ephrathah ♦
and found it in the fields of Ja-ar.
- 7 Let us enter his dwelling place ♦
and fall low before his footstool.
- 8 Arise, O Lord, into your resting place, ♦
you and the ark of your strength.
- 9 Let your priests be clothed with righteousness ♦
and your faithful ones sing with joy.
- 10 For your servant David's sake, ♦
turn not away the face of your anointed.

- 11 The Lord has sworn an oath to David, ♦
a promise from which he will not shrink:
- 12 'Of the fruit of your body ♦
shall I set upon your throne.
- 13 'If your children keep my covenant
and my testimonies that I shall teach them, ♦
their children also shall sit upon your throne for evermore.'
- 14 For the Lord has chosen Zion for himself; ♦
he has desired her for his habitation:
- 15 'This shall be my resting place for ever; ♦
here will I dwell, for I have longed for her.

- 16 'I will abundantly bless her provision; ♦
her poor will I satisfy with bread.
- 17 'I will clothe her priests with salvation, ♦
and her faithful ones shall rejoice and sing.
- 18 'There will I make a horn to spring up for David; ♦
I will keep a lantern burning for my anointed.
- 19 'As for his enemies, I will clothe them with shame; ♦
but on him shall his crown be bright.'

Psalm 133

- 1 Behold how good and pleasant it is ♦
to dwell together in unity.
- 2 It is like the precious oil upon the head, ♦
running down upon the beard,
- 3 Even on Aaron's beard, ♦
running down upon the collar of his clothing.
- 4 It is like the dew of Hermon ♦
running down upon the hills of Zion.
- 5 For there the Lord has promised his blessing: ♦
even life for evermore.

Psalm 134

- 1 Come, bless the Lord, all you servants of the Lord, ♦
you that by night stand in the house of the Lord.
- 2 Lift up your hands towards the sanctuary ♦
and bless the Lord.
- 3 The Lord who made heaven and earth ♦

eyes have they, but cannot see;
- 17 They have ears, but cannot hear; ♦
neither is there any breath in their mouths.
- 18 Those who make them shall become like them, ♦
and so will all who put their trust in them.
- 19 Bless the Lord, O house of Israel; ♦
O house of Aaron, bless the Lord.
- 20 Bless the Lord, O house of Levi; ♦
you who fear the Lord, bless the Lord.
- 21 Blessed be the Lord from Zion, ♦
who dwells in Jerusalem.
Alleluia.

Psalm 137

- 1 By the waters of Babylon we sat down and wept, ♦
when we remembered Zion.
- 2 As for our lyres, we hung them up ♦
on the willows that grow in that land.
- 3 For there our captors asked for a song,
our tormentors called for mirth: ♦
'Sing us one of the songs of Zion.'
- 4 How shall we sing the Lord's song ♦
in a strange land?
- 5 If I forget you, O Jerusalem, ♦
let my right hand forget its skill.
- 6 Let my tongue cleave to the roof of my mouth
if I do not remember you, ♦
if I set not Jerusalem above my highest joy.
- 7 Remember, O Lord, against the people of Edom
the day of Jerusalem, ♦
how they said, 'Down with it, down with it,
even to the ground.'
- 8 O daughter of Babylon, doomed to destruction, ♦
happy the one who repays you
for all you have done to us;
- 9 Who takes your little ones, ♦
and dashes them against the rock.

Psalm 138

- 1 I will give thanks to you, O Lord, with my whole heart; ♦
before the gods will I sing praise to you.
- 2 I will bow down towards your holy temple and praise your name,
because of your love and faithfulness; ♦
for you have glorified your name
and your word above all things.
- 3 In the day that I called to you, you answered me; ♦
you put new strength in my soul.
- 4 All the kings of the earth shall praise you, O Lord, ♦
for they have heard the words of your mouth.
- 5 They shall sing of the ways of the Lord, ♦
that great is the glory of the Lord.
- 6 Though the Lord be high, he watches over the lowly; ♦
as for the proud, he regards them from afar.
- 7 Though I walk in the midst of trouble,
you will preserve me; ♦
you will stretch forth your hand against the fury of my enemies;
your right hand will save me.
- 8 The Lord shall make good his purpose for me; ♦
your loving-kindness, O Lord, endures for ever;
forsake not the work of your hands.

Psalm 139

- 1 O Lord, you have searched me out and known me; ♦
you know my sitting down and my rising up;
you discern my thoughts from afar.
- 2 You mark out my journeys and my resting place ♦
and are acquainted with all my ways.
- 3 For there is not a word on my tongue, ♦
but you, O Lord, know it altogether.
- 4 You encompass me behind and before ♦
and lay your hand upon me.

- 5 Such knowledge is too wonderful for me, ♦
so high that I cannot attain it.
- 6 Where can I go then from your spirit? ♦
Or where can I flee from your presence?
- 7 If I climb up to heaven, you are there; ♦
if I make the grave my bed, you are there also.
- 8 If I take the wings of the morning ♦
and dwell in the uttermost parts of the sea,
- 9 Even there your hand shall lead me, ♦
your right hand hold me fast.
- 10 If I say, 'Surely the darkness will cover me ♦
and the light around me turn to night,'
- 11 Even darkness is no darkness with you;
the night is as clear as the day; ♦
darkness and light to you are both alike.
- 12 For you yourself created my inmost parts; ♦
you knit me together in my mother's womb.
- 13 I thank you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made; ♦
marvellous are your works, my soul knows well.
- 14 My frame was not hidden from you, ♦
when I was made in secret
and woven in the depths of the earth.
- 15 Your eyes beheld my form, as yet unfinished; ♦
already in your book were all my members written,
- 16 As day by day they were fashioned ♦
when as yet there was none of them.
- 17 How deep are your counsels to me, O God! ♦
How great is the sum of them!
- 18 If I count them, they are more in number than the sand, ♦
and at the end, I am still in your presence.
- 19 O that you would slay the wicked, O God, ♦
that the bloodthirsty might depart from me!
- 20 They speak against you with wicked intent; ♦
your enemies take up your name for evil.

- 21 Do I not oppose those, O Lord, who oppose you? ♦
Do I not abhor those who rise up against you?
- 22 I hate them with a perfect hatred; ♦
they have become my own enemies also.
- 23 Search me out, O God, and know my heart; ♦
try me and examine my thoughts.
- 24 See if there is any way of wickedness in me ♦
and lead me in the way everlasting.

Psalm 140

- 1 Deliver me, O Lord, from evildoers ♦
and protect me from the violent,
- 2 Who devise evil in their hearts ♦
and stir up strife all the day long.
- 3 They have sharpened their tongues like a serpent; ♦
adder's poison is under their lips.
- 4 Keep me, O Lord, from the hands of the wicked; ♦
protect me from the violent
who seek to make me stumble.
- 5 The proud have laid a snare for me
and spread out a net of cords; ♦
they have set traps along my path.
- 6 I have said to the Lord, 'You are my God; ♦
listen, O Lord, to the voice of my supplication.
- 7 'O Lord God, the strength of my salvation, ♦
you have covered my head in the day of battle.
- 8 'Do not grant the desires of the wicked, O Lord, ♦
do not prosper their wicked plans.
- 9 'Let not those who surround me lift up their heads; ♦
let the evil of their own lips fall upon them.
- 10 'Let hot burning coals rain upon them; ♦
let them be cast into the depths, that they rise not again.'

- 11 No slanderer shall prosper on the earth, ♦
and evil shall hunt down the violent to overthrow them.
- 12 I know that the Lord will bring justice for the oppressed ♦
and maintain the cause of the needy.
- 13 Surely, the righteous will give thanks to your name, ♦
and the upright shall dwell in your presence.

Psalm 141

- 1 O Lord, I call to you; come to me quickly; ♦
hear my voice when I cry to you.
- 2 Let my prayer rise before you as incense, ♦
the lifting up of my hands as the evening sacrifice.
- 3 Set a watch before my mouth, O Lord, ♦
and guard the door of my lips;
- 4 Let not my heart incline to any evil thing; ♦
let me not be occupied in wickedness with evildoers,
nor taste the pleasures of their table.
- 5 Let the righteous smite me in friendly rebuke;
but let not the oil of the unrighteous anoint my head; ♦
for my prayer is continually against their wicked deeds.
- 6 Let their rulers be overthrown in stony places; ♦
then they may know that my words are sweet.
- 7 As when a plough turns over the earth in furrows, ♦
let their bones be scattered at the mouth of the Pit.
- 8 But my eyes are turned to you, Lord God; ♦
in you I take refuge; do not leave me defenceless.
- 9 Protect me from the snare which they have laid for me ♦
and from the traps of the evildoers.
- 10 Let the wicked fall into their own nets, ♦
while I pass by in safety.

Psalm 142

- 1 I cry aloud to the Lord; ♦
to the Lord I make my supplication.
- 2 I pour out my complaint before him ♦
and tell him of my trouble.
- 3 When my spirit faints within me, you know my path; ♦
in the way wherein I walk have they laid a snare for me.
- 4 I look to my right hand, and find no one who knows me; ♦
I have no place to flee to, and no one cares for my soul.
- 5 I cry out to you, O Lord, and say: ♦
'You are my refuge, my portion in the land of the living.
- 6 'Listen to my cry, for I am brought very low; ♦
save me from my persecutors, for they are too strong for me.
- 7 'Bring my soul out of prison,
that I may give thanks to your name; ♦
when you have dealt bountifully with me,
then shall the righteous gather around me.'

Psalm 143

- 1 Hear my prayer, O Lord,
and in your faithfulness give ear to my supplications; ♦
answer me in your righteousness.
- 2 Enter not into judgement with your servant, ♦
for in your sight shall no one living be justified.
- 3 For the enemy has pursued me,
crushing my life to the ground, ♦
making me sit in darkness like those long dead.
- 4 My spirit faints within me; ♦
my heart within me is desolate.
- 5 I remember the time past; I muse upon all your deeds; ♦
I consider the works of your hands.
- 6 I stretch out my hands to you; ♦
my soul gasps for you like a thirsty land.
- 7 O Lord, make haste to answer me; my spirit fails me; ♦
hide not your face from me
lest I be like those who go down to the Pit.

- 8 Let me hear of your loving-kindness in the morning,
for in you I put my trust; ♦
show me the way I should walk in,
for I lift up my soul to you.
- 9 Deliver me, O Lord, from my enemies, ♦
for I flee to you for refuge.
- 10 Teach me to do what pleases you, for you are my God; ♦
let your kindly spirit lead me on a level path.
- 11 Revive me, O Lord, for your name's sake; ♦
for your righteousness' sake, bring me out of trouble.
- 12 In your faithfulness, slay my enemies,
and destroy all the adversaries of my soul, ♦
for truly I am your servant.

Psalm 144

- 1 Blessed be the Lord my rock, ♦
who teaches my hands for war and my fingers for battle;
- 2 My steadfast help and my fortress,
my stronghold and my deliverer,
my shield in whom I trust, ♦
who subdues the peoples under me.
